AN ACT TO AMEND §1109 AND ADD §§1110, 1111, 1112, 1113 AND 1114 TO CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AS AMENDED BY P.L. NO. 23-79, RELATIVE TO THE "GOVERNMENT OF GUAM INCENTIVE AWARDS PROGRAM ACT."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. The "Government of Guam Incentive 1 Awards Program Act" was designed to reward ingenuity and economy of 2 government service to those government employees who promote cost-3 effectiveness and efficiency within the government of Guam through 4 suggestions, ideas, inventions or designs. The funding source, protection 5 laws, liability concerns, appeal procedures and the establishment of an 6 7 Incentive Awards Board need to be identified and included in this 8 Amendment.

9 Section 2. Section 1109 of Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the Guam Code 10 Annotated, as amended by Public Law Number 23-79, is hereby amended to 11 read as follows:

12 "Section 1109. Funding Source. (a) Each department shall
13 develop a methodology to monitor the savings realized throughout the
14 year as a result of the implementation of the employee's suggestion,
15 idea, invention or design.

(b) The department shall report to the Director of
Administration, on a quarterly basis, the status of the implementation of
the suggestion and the actual amount saved during the quarter.

(c) A cash award of up to ten percent (10%) of the total savings
generated by the suggestion, idea, invention or design, shall be granted
to the suggestor within one (1) year of the implementation date.

(d) If the suggestion, idea, invention or design is implemented
by two (2) or more departments, then the cooperative efforts of all
affected departments shall monitor the savings and report their
individual results, on a quarterly basis, to the Director of

1 Administration."

Section 3. A new §1110 is hereby added to Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the
Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

Protection of Employee's Suggestion, Idea, 4 "Section 1110. **Invention or Design.** (a) All suggestions, ideas, inventions or designs 5 will be certified upon receipt, reviewed for originality and assigned an 6 identification number. Suggestions, ideas, inventions or designs which 7 have been previously implemented or suggested at other localities, 8 9 agencies, private or public sectors, are not considered original ideas and shall not be eligible for cash awards, even though the suggestion, idea, 10 invention or design has never been submitted or implemented in the 11 government of Guam. 12

(b) Suggestions, ideas, inventions or designs previously
implemented or suggested at other localities, agencies, private or public,
but, with major modification by the suggestor to suit a government of
Guam operation resulting in savings to the government of Guam, may
warrant a cash award of not more than three percent (3%) of the total
savings to the government.

(c) An audit shall be conducted by the Chief Public Auditor for
 regulatory compliance, fairness in awards, and for any other
 appropriate reason, at least once every two (2) years or upon request by
 the Director of Administration."

23 Section 4. A new §1111 is hereby added to Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the
24 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

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"Section 1111. Liability. Suggestions, ideas, inventions or

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designs submitted by an employee or employees and determined by the
appointing authority or other experts, to be, or possibly be, a safety
hazard, shall not be implemented. The appointing authority, or the
expert's appointing authority, will be held liable for any injury to the
employee or others, or any damage to government property, if authority
is granted for implementation of the suggestion, idea, invention or
design, even if only on a trial basis."

8 Section 5. A new §1112 is hereby added to Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the
9 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

10 "Section 1112. Incentive Awards Board. (a) An Incentive Awards Board ('Board') shall be established to serve as the approving 11 12 authority for all suggestions, ideas, inventions or designs submitted by 13 employees. The Board shall consist of five (5) members appointed by 14 the Governor of Guam, whose terms will be staggered to ensure 15 continuity of members. Each member shall serve a term of two (2) 16 years, except for the first appointed members, in which three (3) shall be 17 appointed to serve a three (3) year term, and two (2) shall serve a two (2) 18 year term.

(b) The majority of the Board shall be three (3) members. The
vote of three (3) members shall be required for any action by the Board.
The Board may adopt administrative policies to govern its procedures."

22 Section 6. A new §1113 is hereby added to Chapter 1 Title 4 of the 23 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows :

24 "Section 1113. Appeal for Rejected or Stolen Suggestions, Ideas,
 25 Inventions or Designs. An employee who feels cheated on his/her

original suggestion, idea, invention or design, or whose suggestion, 1 idea, invention or design was rejected, may appeal to the Director of 2 Administration who will appoint an ad hoc Board of Review, approved 3 by the Incentive Awards Board. This Board of Review shall be 4 constituted by two (2) members outside the government of Guam, 5 designated by the Director of Administration, and two (2) members 6 from the present Incentive Awards Board, and an expert in the area 7 8 relating to the suggestion, idea, invention or design."

9 Section 7. A new §1114 is hereby added to Chapter 1 Title 4 of the
10 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

Rules and Regulations. "Section 1114. Administration. (a) 11 Within one hundred eighty (180) days after enactment of this bill into 12 law, the Department of Administration, in consultation with the Civil 13 Service Commission, shall file with the Legislative Secretary, rules and 14 15 regulations for the administration of the program in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. In order to provide for the fair and 16 efficient administration of the Program, such rules and regulations shall 17 18 provide specific controls to safeguard against the possibility of collusion or manipulation. The rules and regulations for the Incentive Awards 19 Program must also include methods for protecting the rights and 20 21 benefits of the person generating and submitting an idea.

(b) Awareness Program. Within one hundred eighty (180) days
 of the enactment of this bill into law, the agency heads of the
 Department of Administration, the autonomous agencies, and the
 Supreme Court of Guam shall implement a "Government of Guam

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Incentives Awards Program" providing information about the
 objectives and procedures of the Program and to encourage
 participation from all government of Guam employees."

PUBLIC HEARING

Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman of the Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services (CPFA&GGS) called to order at 9:00 a.m. Wednesday, October 22, 1997, a public hearing to gather testimony on Bill No. 378, "An act to amend Public Law No. 23-79, known as the "Government of Guam Incentive Awards Program Act" to change §1109 and add §1110, §1111, §1112, §1113 and §1114."

BACKGROUND

Public Law No. 23-79, created the "Government of Guam Incentives Award Program". Based on the findings of the Department of Administration and the Civil Service Commission, the law required further changes to effectuate the program. This bill incorporates language to address funding, protection laws, liability concerns and appeal procedures and establishment of the regulating Board.

TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Mr. Michael Reidy, Director of the Department of Administration, provided written testimony recommending passage of the bill. Mr. Reidy states that his office and the task force have been working closely with the bill's sponsor to effectuate the program. The bill incorporates the required language to do just that. Mr. Reidy suggests the program will require a coordinator to staff and process employees applying for the incentive awards.

Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman, acknowledge that the Department of Administration is in full support of this measure, and that no one was present to testify.

BBMR states in its fiscal note Bill No. 378 will encourage employees to suggest ways to reduce the costs of government and earn monetary rewards in return.

FINDINGS

The Committee finds that Bill No. 378 can be reported out without changes.

RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services hereby reports out Bill No. 378 with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

Buenas! Thank you for the opportunity to comment on Bill No. 378 to amend the Government of Guam Incentive Awards Program Act, P.L. 23-79.

This office and the task force, established to implement P.L. 23-79, have been working closely with Senator Carlotta Leon Guerrero, the bill's sponsor, to provide a comprehensive coverage of all areas of concerns which need to be addressed for the administration of the Incentive Awards Program. Those concerns are now included in Bill 378 and we recommend its passage.

It is anticipated that when this program is in place, the Department of Administration will require a coordinator to ensure that all suggestions, ideas, inventions or designs, are processed and addressed in a timely manner by experts and the Incentive Awards Board. This staff, who will serve as the liaison between the Board and the Department of Administration, will also follow-up on reports to determine appropriate savings to the department and the amount of award that is due to the employee.

Again, we strongly recommend the passage of Bill 378, and we look forward to a successful program which will benefit not only the suggestor but more importantly create savings to the government.

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FOOTNOTES:

1/ Bill Number 378(COR) is an act to amend Public Law 23-79 as the "Government of Guam Incentive Awards Program Act" to change §1109 and add §1110, §1111, §1112, §1113 and §1114. This Bill appears to be administrative in nature, however, its implementation may pose a fiscal impact on the agencies involved. Such an impact cannot be determined by the Bureau at this time.

It should be noted that any monetary awards paid out are outweighed by the savings realized by the individual departments. Any incentives given to employees that qualify may have to be paid out of that particular employee's departmental budget. The Bill does not appropriate any funds for the implementation of the proposed changes.
