Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 396 (LS), "AN ACT TO AMEND §§5104, 6108 AND 9203 ALL OF TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO ADD A NEW §7119.1 TO TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT §5502(b) OF TITLE 19 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATING TO THE APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES PRO TEMPORE AND ASSIGNMENT OF REFERREES", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-135.

This legislation eliminates a difficulty now existing in the current law of the Superior Court. Guam needs to obtain the services of outside judges or justices in serving as judges pro tempore in our Superior Court.

Currently, there are times when it is difficult to get the required number of judges to sit and hear cases when there are conflicts of interest requiring Guam judges to disqualify themselves. This legislation allows judges and justices of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands to serve as judges pro tempore in these instances, as they have done in the past.

AN ACT TO AMEND §§5104, 6108 AND 9203 ALL OF TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO ADD A NEW §7119.1 TO TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO REPEAL AND REENACT §5502(b) OF TITLE 19 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATING TO THE

### APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES PRO TEMPORE AND ASSIGNMENT OF REFEREES.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

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- Section 1. A new Subparagraph (d) is hereby added to §5104, 3 Chapter 5, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as 4 follows:
- "(d) If a member of the subcommittee is recused, then the Chairperson shall appoint a member of the Guam Bar Association or, in consultation with the Chief Justice of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), a Justice or Judge of the CNMI to serve as a member of the subcommittee pro tempore."
- Section 2. Section 6108(a) of Chapter 6, Division 1 of the Guam Code
  Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 6108(a). When there is no Judge qualified or available to hear a cause or action or hearing in the Superior Court, the Presiding Judge shall request the Chief Justice to appoint a Judge pro tempore to hear the action. Such Judge pro tempore shall meet the same qualifications as a regularly appointed Judge of the Superior Court, or be a Justice or Judge of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) who is appointed in consultation with the Chief Justice of the CNMI. When there is no Justice qualified or available to hear a cause or action or hearing in the Supreme Court, the Chief Justice shall appoint a Justice pro tempore to participate in the action or hearing. Such Justice pro tempore shall meet the same qualifications as regularly appointed Justice of the Supreme Court."

**Section 3.** Section 9203(e) of Article 2, Chapter 9, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9203(e). Upon receipt of a recommendation for discipline, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court shall promptly set the matter for a hearing. The hearing shall be conducted by a panel composed of three judges of the Superior Court and any decision shall require the concurrence of at least two of such judges. If any of the judges of the Superior Court shall disqualify themselves in the matter so that there are not three judges remaining to sit on the panel, the Presiding Judge shall appoint as judges pro tempore: (1) from attorneys as are admitted to the Bar of Guam and who are in good standing before it and who have not previously been subject of an order imposing discipline in Guam, or (2) in consultation with the Chief Justice of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), a Justice or Judge from the CNMI so as to make up a total of three judges to hear the discipline matter."

**Section 4**. A new §7119.1 is hereby added to Chapter 7, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 7119.1. The Presiding Judge may assign referees to hear cases in more than one division or court of the Superior Court."

- **Section 5**. Subsection (b) of §5502, Chapter 5A, Division 1 of Title 19 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- 24 "(b) The presiding Judge of the Superior Court may assign such 25 other matters as he considers proper to the Division, including Family

- Division matters as provided in §5113 of Title 19, Guam Code
- 2 Annotated, provided such assignments do not impair the principal
- 3 purpose of the Division as set out in Subsection (a) of this section."

#### Committee Report

on

Bill No. 396: AN ACT TO AMEND 7 GCA §§5104, 6108

AND 9203, ADD A NEW 7 GCA §7119.1, AND REPEALING AND RE- ENACTING 19 GCA §5502(b), RELATING TO THE APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES PRO-TEMPORE AND ASSIGNMENT OF

REFEREES.

#### I. SUMMARY

The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety and Consumer Protection held a public hearing on Bill 396 on Wednesday, November 12, 1997 at 9:00 AM at the Legislative Public Hearing Room. Public Notice was published in the November 5 and November 12, 1997 editions of the Pacific Daily News.

#### Providing Public Testimony on the Bill:

Charles H. Troutman, Compiler of Laws, **oral**Anthony P. Sanchez, Administrative Director, Superior Court of Guam, **oral** 

#### Purpose:

There is a three-fold purpose to the substitute bill: (1) to provide for appointment of a judge or member of the bar to replace a recused member of a Judicial Council subcommittee that is appointed pursuant to statute to deal with charges of misconduct or incapacity of a judge or justice: (2) to provide for appointment of *pro tempore* judges

upon a recommendation of the Guam Bar Ethics Committee for discipline; (3) to grant additional authority to the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court regarding the appointment of referees in more than one division or court, and the use of referees in the Judicial Hearings Division of the Court.

#### Relationship to Existing Law:

Section 1 of the bill adds new provisions to 7 GCA §5104.

<u>Section 2</u> adds new language to 7 GCA §6108 (a) relating to the appointment of *protempore* judges or justices.

<u>Section 3</u> amends 7 GCA §9203(e) to provide for *pro tempore* appointments of a judge or justice from the CNMI to sit on attorney disciplinary cases in which a judge has disqualified himself or herself from hearing the matter.

<u>Section 4</u> adds a new 7 GCA §7119.1 to make it clear that the Presiding Judge may assign referees to more than one division or court in Superior Court. This new statute, combined with the provisions enacted by Section 5 of the bill, clarifies the type of cases that may be assigned to the Hearing Division and heard by referees.

<u>Section 5</u> removes the existing limitation on referees to pre-adjudication matters, thus allowing for greater use of referees in a wider range of cases.

The bill's provisions are compatible with existing Guam statutes relating to the Judicial Council and the Superior Court.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

#### Charles H. Troutman, Compiler of Laws

Mr. Troutman said the changes in the law proposed by the bill are reasonable and he supports them.

#### Anthony P. Sanchez, Administrative Director, Superior Court of Guam

Mr. Sanchez said that the amendments to the law contained in the bill were requested by the Presiding Judge and others on the Superior Court to cover the situations where judges are recused or disqualified, and to allow the Presiding Judge to appoint *pro tempore* judges and to be able to deal effectively with matters before the court. He urged that the bill be passed.

#### III. FINDINGS and RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety and Consumer Protection finds support for passage of Bill No. 396 as substituted by its author, Senator Barrett-Anderson, and further substituted by the Committee and presents its report to the body with its recommendation **TO DO PASS.**
