Enclosed please find Bill No. 73 (COR), "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION OF NURSE ASSISTANTS FOR THE GUAM BOARD OF NURSE EXAMINERS", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-20.

Until this moment there were no rules and regulations governing the certification of nurse assistants in Guam. These dedicated men and women have been serving a vital role in our health care community without proper certification procedures. Establishment of proper safeguards for our island's residents as well as providing guidelines for valuable health care workers is a responsibility the government needs to continue striving to achieve.

These rules and regulations provide a number of safeguards for the community. They set minimum standards of competency and proficiency; they establish educational and examination requirements; and the scope of practice delineated in the rules and regulations acts as a protection for consumers. The rules and regulations also provide for those who are already serving in nurse assistant positions, so that they will continue in this important profession.

A concerted effort among the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners, the Guam Nurse Leaders and the Governor's Office produced these rules and fice of the Speakeand I am pleased to be able to sign Bill No. 73 to put these

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION OF NURSE ASSISTANTS FOR THE GUAM BOARD OF NURSE EXAMINERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Authority for the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners to
Promulgate Rules and Regulations. §12316.1 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated,
authorizes the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners to promulgate rules and regulations
providing minimum qualifications for certification of nurse assistants and approval of
nurse assistants educational programs.

In keeping with the spirit of Public Law 22-51, requiring line department, agencies, and instrumentalities of the Government of Guam to "periodically review all fees which are charged by the respective Agencies for services rendered and adjust the same as needed to actual cost of delivering such services", the fees contained in §3200. Fees, are implemented as if part of the rule-making process under the Administrative Adjudication Law, Chapter 9 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, and as authorized by statute.

1	(b) Submission of Rules and Regulations in Bill Form. Public Law 22-96
2	requires that rules and regulations proposed by a government agency, be transmitted
3	to the Legislature in bill form for the convenience of the Legislature. After passage
4	of Forty-five (45) calendar days, plus seven (7) legislative days, the rules and
5	regulations are approved.

(c) Approval of the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners Certification of Nurse Assistants Rules and Regulations. The following rules and regulations for the nurse assistants are hereby approved:

#### "RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### FOR CERTIFICATION OF NURSE ASSISTANTS

- §100. Purpose. (a) The purpose of these rules and regulations is to ensure that persons functioning as nurse assistants on Guam have met minimum standards of competency as prescribed in these rules; and
- (b) To ensure that nurse assistants meet minimum standards of proficiency and competency set forth by the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners (GBNE); and
- (c) To ensure programs that qualify nurse assistants meet the educational requirements as set forth by the Board; and
- (d) To regulate the scope of practice for nurse assistants in the interest of consumer protection in Guam.
- §200. Legal Authority. §12316.1 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated empowers the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners to establish minimum qualifications through rules and regulations and to set standards for certified nurse assistants educational programs. §12316.1 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, provides: 'Minimum Requirements for and Certification of Nurse Assistants and the Education Programs. The Board shall establish by regulation minimum requirements for nurse assistants and criteria for evaluating such requirements. The Board may also

- establish and administer such procedures as may be necessary to certify that an
- 2 applicant meets duly established minimum requirements. Such procedures shall
- 3 include a provisional period for remedial training of nurse assistants who are
- 4 employed as of the effective date of such regulations and do not meet minimum
- 5 requirements. Disciplinary procedures for decertification of incompetent nurse
- 6 assistants may be established by the Board. The Board shall maintain a registry of
- 7 certified nurse assistants. The Board may approve and reapprove nurse assistants
- 8 educational and continuing education programs.

- § §300. Powers and Duties. The Board shall enforce the provisions of §12316.1 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, as well as other duties, powers and authority as granted by appropriate statutes to include the following:
- 12 (a) Adopt, and from time to time, revise such rules and regulations as may
  13 be necessary to carry out the provisions of §12316.1 of Title 10, Guam
  14 Code Annotated, in compliance with the Administrative Adjudication
  15 Law, Chapter 9 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated;
  - (b) Develop and maintain a nurse assistants registry;
- 17 (c) Develop and enforce standards and periodically evaluate the basic nurse
  18 assistants education programs, and approve the programs that meet the
  19 requirements as set forth in these rules;
- 20 (d) Deny or withdraw approval of nurse assistants educational programs that
  21 do not meet the prescribed standards in accordance with Chapter 2 of the
  22 Administrative Adjudication Law and Chapter 9 of Title 5, Guam Code
  23 Annotated;

Implement a disciplinary process consistent with the Administrative **(f)** 1 Adjudication Law, Chapter 9 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated; 2 Issue certification documentation to the nurse assistants who have (g) 3 successfully met the requirements for inclusion on the nurse assistants 4 registry; 5 Notify all nurse assistants listed on the nurse assistants registry of (h) 6 changes in laws, rules and regulations pertaining to nurse assistants; 7 Determine and collect reasonable fees; (i) 8 Act as an evaluating and approving body for the nurse assistants **(i)** . 9 educational programs in the American Pacific region. The request must 10 come from the appropriate governing body, and all expenses for the 11 12 evaluation shall be paid by the requesting jurisdiction; 13 (k) Give the nurse assistants examination according to the rules and regulations formulated by the National Council of State Boards of 14 15 Nursing, its designated testing service and the Board; Deny a certificate to unqualified applicants; **(l)** 16 17 (m) Issue certificate to qualified applicants who have successfully met the requirements of a nurse assistant. 18 Have the power to issue subpoenas, require the attendance of witnesses, 19 (n) 20 administer oaths to persons giving testimony, and enforce compliance 21 upon application to the Superior Court of Guam; 22 Maintain records as required by Guam law; and (0)23 (p) Conduct public hearings, investigations, and studies of nurse assistants practice, nurse assistants education and related matters; and to prepare 24 and issue such publications as will allow the nurse assistants profession 25

to provide safe and effective nurse assistants services to the public.

§400. Definitions. For purposes of this Rules and Regulations, the following terms are defined to mean:

- (a) "Abuse" includes, but is not limited to: physical injury caused by other than accidental means; neglect which leads to physical harm; failure to provide direct care for resident or patient; verbal abuse; theft or misuse of resident funds or property; wrongful touching; or any other deprivation of patient or resident's rights, which may be the result of intentional or negligent behavior.
  - (b) Accountability means the state of being responsible, answerable or legally liable for actions done by a nurse assistants.
  - (c) Approval means the process by which the Board evaluates and grants official recognition to a nurse assistants educational program which meets established standards.
    - (1) Initial approval means a status granted for authorization to admit students and enter into contractual agreements for client facilities. It is granted only after an application has been submitted and reviewed and a survey visit has been conducted by the Board. No students shall be admitted into the program until the institution has received written notification that initial approval has been granted.
    - (2) Conditional approval (Probation) means the status designated to a program which has been determined to be deficient by the Board, and to which written notice is sent to the program provider specifying the deficient areas and the time limit within which the deficiencies are to be corrected.
    - (3) Full approval means a status granted to a program that meets the requirements of the law, and the rules and regulations of the

1		Board. Continuation of full approval is contingent upon the
2		submission of the annual report of the program.
3	(4)	Approved program means a course of training conducted by an
4		educational or health care institution which implements the basic
5		nurse assistants curriculum as prescribed and approved by the
6		Board.
7	(5)	Basic emergency procedures means the care of individuals of all
8		ages with perceived physical or emotional alterations which are
9		undiagnosed and may require prompt intervention.
10	(6)	Board means the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners.
11	(7)	Board of Nursing means other nursing boards within the United
12		States and its territories.
13	(8)	Certificate by endorsement means the process by which
14		individuals holding a current certification, within the United States
15		or its territories, upon meeting all requirements set forth by the
16		Board, can practice as a nurse assistants on Guam.
17	(9)	Clinical facilities means those institutions which are established
18		in a community for the delivery of health care services such as
19		hospitals, extended care facilities, nursing homes, or other sites.
20	(10)	Competency means the ability to perform skillfully and
21		proficiently the role of the certificate holder. The role
22		encompasses essential knowledge, judgment, attitudes, values,
23		skills and abilities which are varied in range and complexity.
24		Competency is a dynamic concept, changing as the certified nurse
25		assistants achieves a higher stage of development within the role.

3	(11)	Course means a series of class sessions devoted to one specific
4		area of a subject. It may include a number of related topics.
5	(12)	Curriculum means the systematic arrangement of learning
6		experiences that include courses, clinical experience and other
7		activities needed to meet the requirements of the nurse assistants
8		program and of the certificate conferred by the program provider
9		(parent institution).
10	(13)	Date of application means the date on which the application form
11		was received by the Health Professional Licensing Office staff
12		working for the Board.
13	(14)	Denial means refusal to issue a current certification.
14	(15)	Director means a professional registered nurse of a health agency
15		who has been designated by the controlling authority or program
16		provider to administer the nurse assistants educational program.
17	(16)	Federal requirements means the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation
18		Act of 1987 and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto.
19	(17)	Graduate nurse assistant means an individual who has
20		successfully completed a basic nurse assistants educational
21		program but has not received certification through examination.
22	(18)	Inactive status means the status a nurse assistants is classified on
23		the registry to signify he/she is not currently certified on Guam.
24		This status must be officially requested by the certificate holder.

1	(19)	Incomplete application means an application which either lacks
2		the required documents or has not been properly completed by the
3		applicant.
4	(20)	Lapsed certificate means an individual's certificate to practice as
5		a nurse assistants has expired.

7		nurse currently licensed in Guam.
8	(22)	Medicaid means the federal program of medical care designed for
9		those unable to afford regular medical services and financed by

26		authorization by the Board to conduct such a program.

1	(27)	Nurse assistant registry means a listing of all individuals who
2		have been certified by the Board.
3	(28)	Practice means the performance of services by a nurse assistants
4		that requires education, training, and skills as specified in these
5		rules and regulations.
6	(29)	Primary instructor means a registered nurse, currently licensed
7		on Guam, who is responsible for teaching and evaluating the
8		students enrolled in a nurse assistants educational program.
9	(30)	Program means a plan of study which consists of several related
10		courses and has as its objective the preparation of individuals to
11		function safely as nurse assistants.
12	(31)	Program Director means a registered nurse, currently licensed on
13		Guam who is administratively responsible and accountable for a
14		nurse assistants educational program.
15	(32)	Program provider means a school, college, nursing facility or
16		other institution that conducts a nurse assistants educational
17		program.
18	(33)	Reinstatement means the procedure of restoring a nurse assistants
19		certificate which has lapsed, was inactive, suspended or revoked.
20	(34)	Reissuance means the process of replacing a nurse assistants
21		certification by giving a duplicate original copy.
22	(35)	Revocation means withdrawal of a certificate to practice as a
23		nurse assistants, or an order of annulment or cancellation of a
24		certificate.

21	(d)	Payment of the appropriate fee. Fees remitted to the Board are non-
22		refundable.
23	§800 <b>.</b>	Responsibilities of the applicant. It shall be the responsibility of the

25	(a)	Correspond or communicate directly with the Board.

- 1 (b) Follow through with the submission of all required documents until application is completed.
  - (c) Periodically contact the Board concerning the status of the application.
  - (d) Inform the Board in writing to withdraw an application.

- (e) Inform the Board of any change in name or address. A nurse assistants who has a change in name shall submit a notarized copy of a marriage certificate, or court order showing the change to the Board. A duplicate certificate with the change shall be issued by the Board upon receipt of such evidence and payment of the required fee. All certificate renewals will be mailed to the most current known address on file.
- (f) Give written notification to the Board office prior to an examination date, if unable to take the scheduled examination. A specific reason must be indicated. If the reason is acceptable to the Board, i.e., candidate is ill, death in immediate family, accident, etc., the applicant's examination date may be extended to the next examination date. Failure to take the assigned examination without prior Board approval may result in removal of the applicant from the eligibility list. A reexamination fee will be charged to all applicants who are rescheduled to take the examination. A reexamination fee will not be charged to those applicants who are rescheduled due to lack of space.
- (g) Notify the Board, in writing, of the loss of a certificate. A duplicate certificate for the current renewal period shall be issued by the Board upon receipt of the required documents and payment of fees.
- (h) Maintain a current Guam nurse assistants certification.
- §900. Responsibility of the Employer. Nursing administrators, agency heads or other employers, who employ nurse assistants without current certification are in

Applicants applying after the two (2) year limitation period shall be considered by the Board on a case by case basis. The applicant may be required to satisfactorily complete an approved program or course of study, including basic skills in nurse assistants, or follow specific remedial measures, as prescribed by the Board, prior to being scheduled to take an examination.
- (f) Transcripts shall include information on the nursing education program(s), including programs which were completed in less than the usual length of time, through advance standing or transfer of credits from one institution to another.
- (g) Credentials of education and certification, if not in English, shall be accompanied by a certified translation.

Any change of name, after filling the original application, must be (h) 1 supported by an affidavit satisfactory to the Board. 2 Any applicant who cannot demonstrate fulfillment of the education (i) 3 requirements shall be notified in writing and must satisfy the deficiency 4 before being admitted to the examination. 5 An applicant who meets the deadline and is granted Board and National **(i)** 6 Council of State Boards of Nursing examination approval is entitled to a 7 preassigned seating and site to write the examination. 8 The deadline for completion of application is one hundred ten (110) days (k) 9 prior to a scheduled examination. #### GENERAL OVERVIEW:

The main purpose of Bill 73 is to provide adequate rules and regulations for the proper certification of nurse assistants. These rules and regulations provide for a consistent criteria for applicants desiring certification as Nurse Assistants and a standard listing of fees required by the applicant. These rules and regulations will ensure that a standard is met for certification as a nurse assistant on Guam.

### LEGISLATIVE INTENT:

It is the intent of the Guam Legislature to implement the Rules and Regulations for Nurse Assistants for the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners to provide a standard for certified nurse assistants and fees.

#### FINDINGS:

The Committee on Health And Human Services finds that during the public hearing held on March 24, 1997 several of those testifying had concerns about the specific language in the original bill, however supported the need for rules and regulations for Certification of Nurse Assistants for the Board of Nurse Examiners. Oral or written testimony was presented by Daisy Tydingco, Guam Board of Nurse Examiners, Theo Cruz, Associate Administrator Guam Memorial Hospital, Julie Taylor, Guam Memorial Hospital, Andrea Fung, Guam Community College, Tina Blas, R.N., Helen Ripple, R. N., Janette Tanos, HPLO. Maureen Fochman, R. N.

Changes reflecting many of the concerns expressed at the Public Hearing were made and the Committee has Substituted the attached Bill 73.

#### **SECTION ANALYSIS:**
