BACKGROUND :

The Department of Parks & Recreation Off-Island Sports Travel Fund is lacking the funds necessary to support requests for travel funding for off-island participants. Funds requested for three off-island events: Asian Region Preliminary Round of the Asian Football Confederation Under 16 Championships in Nepal; U.S.A. Junior National Volleyball Championship in Denver Colorado and the Australian (Basketball) Masters Games. Off-island participation by sports teams has proven worthwhile and promising especially for Guam's youth.

Lucky Sakamoto Fundraising I am grateful to be able to provide you our input with regard to Bill No. 573(LS) which is currently scheduled for public hearing on Monday, April 13, 1998.

As I know you are aware, Guam Soccer has been improving its performance in the international arena in recent years. The success behind our program has been the dedication and determination, most especially from our youth.

The competition which the Under-16 Team will be attending is the Asian Football Confederation's Under-16 Championships, which are the preliminaries to competing in the Under-17 World Championship of FIFA. It is mandatory that one participate in the Under-16 tournaments to be able to participate in next year's Under-17 tournaments. It is also important for our youth to experience these international competitions in order that our programs can expand.

As the legislative findings have so poignantly stated, the travel expenses to Nepal are astronomical and the itinerary to get there difficult at least. It will take our players two (2) full days to get to the site of the competition in Birgunj.

The 1999 South Pacific Games will be upon us in a little more than one (1) year and a number of the players who are participating on the Under-16 Team will likely qualify to participate in the 1999 South Pacific Games. That says a great deal for the quality of the youth teams, and the dedication of the coaches. In order to better prepare these players for the future, our participation in these events is necessary. It is also necessary for Guam to participate in two (2) Asian Football Confederation Tournaments every two (2) years in order to maintain our vote in both AFC and FIFA. Therefore, it is a necessity that we participate twice a year so that our voice may be heard. Anthony C. On behalf of the players, coaches and administrators, I wish to commend the legislature, in general, and the sponsors of the bill, in particular, for their foresight and assistance in such programs. The soccer program is one of the programs that teaches many important lessons, not the least of which is anti-drug.

The cost of higher education is becoming astronomical and any assistance that the kids can provide to their families in bearing those costs enables their families to then send their children to institutions of higher learning. This can only benefit the entire community in the long-run.

The amount of money that is being offered to assist in this endeavor will reap benefits far beyond the dollar amount invested not only to the individuals participating, but to Guam as a whole.
