Enclosed please find Bill No. 579 (COR), "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000.00) TO THE MAYOR OF TAMUNING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND FOR REPAIRS OF DAMAGES ON PUBLIC FACILITIES INFLICTED BY SUPER TYPHOON PAKA.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-202.

The damage to the Tamuning Community public facilities was extensive, due to Supertyphoon Paka. Unfortunately, there is some delay between the time of the claims submitted and the time that actual money is realized from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to assist in the repair of damaged facilities. This appropriation will allow work to begin on the needed facilities during the interim time period, and will allow some mitigation of the property to avoid damages from future typhoons which are sure to come.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Seventy-five Section 1. Tamuning Municipality Appropriation. 1 2 Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the 3 Community Development Fund of the Tamuning Mayor for the repair and mitigation cost associated with the community center, storage warehouse and 4 gymnasium damages inflicted by Super Typhoon Paka. The Mayor of 5 6 Tamuning is to seek repair and mitigation funding through the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") for the total repair and mitigation 7 8 cost associated with the damages inflicted by Super Typhoon Paka and any portion of this appropriation found to be reimbursable shall be reimbursed 9 10 directly to the General Fund.

Committee Report on Bill No. 579(COR)

"AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SEVENTY
FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000.00)
TO THE MAYOR OF TAMUNING
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND
FOR REPAIRS OF DAMAGES INFLICTED
BY SUPER-TYPHOON PAKA."

I. OVERVIEW:

Pursuant to the requirements of Public Law 24-109, notice of the Public Hearing on Bill No. 579(COR) was sent to all media on Thursday, April 2, 1998 and a reminder memorandum was sent on Monday April 6, 1998. Additionally, a public hearing notice was published in the Pacific Daily News on Thursday, April 2, 1998 and on Sunday, April 5, 1998.

II. COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT:

The hearing vas called to order by the Ct rman of the Committee on Finance and Taxation, Vice Speaker Anthony C. Blaz.

III. BACKGROUND ON BILL 579(COR):

Findings: The Municipality of Tamuning through the Mayor's Office has identified funding needs estimated in excess of \$300,000.00 to rebuild, replace or repair sports facilities, community center and support facilities largely as a result of damages from supertyphoon Paka. This does not include costs to repair the Mayor's Office.

The level of FEMA grant available is uncertain at this time but will not meet total needs.

Bill 579(COR) appropriates a nominal \$75,000.00 to supplement available FEMA grant in order to jump-start the

village's youth a 'sports activities largely in 'pardy or at a standstill.

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES:

The two written testimonies firmly substantiated the merit of and supported Bill 579(COR).

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee, having conducted a sufficient hearing, does hereby recommend to the Legislature TO Bill 579 (COR)- "AN ACT TO DO PASS **APPROPRIATE SEVENTY THOUSAND FIVE DOLLARS** (\$75,000.00) TO THE **MAYOR OF** TAMUNING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND FOR REPAIRS OF DAMAGES INFLICTED BY SUPER-TYPHOON PAKA."

Good merning Members of the Committee.

I am Mayor Luis Herrero of the Municipality of Tamuning. My presence before the committee this morning is to justify my request for additional funds necessary to rebuild, replace and repair the sports facilities and the demolished buildings severely damaged by Super-Typhoon Paka in the municipality of Tamuning. FEMA's damage assessment fell far below the estimated cost to restore these facilities back to their original condition prior to Super-Typhoon Paka.

The need to repair the Sports facility is URGENT. These facilities which are situated between Tamuning Elementary and LBJ Elementary schools, are used daily by the elementary school students, as well as by the organized community teams during the weekend and after-school hours.

The <u>Tennis and Basketball Courts</u> need resurfacing and painting.

The overhead lighting needs fixture replacement, the electrical conduits need realignment, electrical lines and fixtures need to be repaired and waterline leaks need to be fixed.

The lavatory facility needs to be repaired. It will require replacement

of light fixtures and conduits, a thorough cleaning of the filth and painting over graffittied walls. The bleachers are in their worst condition.

They are either mangled or broken.

The <u>Baseball Field</u> needs much improvement which includes resoiling and resodding. The field currently is not safe because of loose gravel and an unlevel playing field. The mangled fences that surround the courts and ball field and provide protection from the congested traffic on San Antonio Road, must be replaced.

A portion of the <u>Gymnasium</u> roof was destroyed during Super-Typhoon Paka. This caused extensive water damage to the interior insulation and gypsum wall. The water damage has also caused the rubberized flooring and paints to peel and separate from the concrete floor.

The <u>Community Center</u> will require extensive repair. Extensions on two sides of the building were completely blown away by Super-Typhoon Paka. The lavatory fixtures and wood partitions are damaged and need to be replaced. The damaged tile flooring and broken jalousie or louvers on the windows are broken and need to be

replaced. After the building is repaired, it will also need to be painted. The Community Center is used as a multi-purpose building by the people in the municipality. It is used for Village meetings, arts and crafts and physical fitness classes for youth and adults, and for Christening, Birthday and Wedding parties. Some of our youth programs are on hold because the building or the facility is currently unsafe.

The Storage Building was completely demolished by Super-Typhoon Paka. The storage building housed the maintenance equipment used to clean public main roads and road-sides, as well as the village streets and empty lots. It was also used for storage of office and cleaning supplies and equipment needed in the daily operation of the Municipal office.

The reconstruction of a new storage building is urgent. Presently, we are using the Community Center to store the equipment and supplies.

This deprives the community from using the Community Center.

I humbly seek your approval of my request for additional funds necessary to rebuild, replace and repair the sports facilities and buildings severely damaged by Super-Typhoon Paka in the

municipality of Tamuning.

As I said earlier, the need to repair the Sports Facility is urgent. It is urgent because the youth of our community are at risk of being injured if they play amongst the damage and disrepair. We need to give the people of our community an outlet, a place where they can go for some semblance of normalcy.

Good Afternoon Mr. Chairman and Senators,

My name is Frank Herrero, I am here on behalf of the Municipality of Tamuning, Tumon and Harmon.

The intend of the bill speaks for itself. Facilities show for it.

In the past years these facilities have not been adequate for the growing community. The public demand of the usage has been great. It's about time, we as a community, together with the help of your committee and the legislature coming together to rebuild our facilities. making it safer and more adequate for all to use.

Mr. Chairman, Senators, you been there, you seen it. you played it. and you talk about it. Now you are making it happen. Tamuning is a growing community, our leisure resources and recreation is viable for our community. and when I mean community, I speak of the general Public, from Yigo to Merizo utilizing our facilities. Tumon is our sister village, part of our growing economy begins there. They look at what we have to offer in recreation. The facilities in our village is not readily available to meet the demand.due to the conditions.

You seen Paseo Park, Tiyan fields. People gather in hundreds to recreate themselves. That began because of our facilities that we had in Tamuning. Tamuning is the starting block of recreation. Hundreds of people use to utilize are our facilities. Now a handful.

The past Typhoon inflicted serious damages to our facilities, making it a hazard. Mr. Chairman, the author of this bill has seen, been there as well as every senator. Let make enough is enough. We must do it right. Not a patch there and here, but, a facility upgrade to meet every standard and to say money well spend for the people of Guam and our visitor.

The passage of this bill with it's recommended increase in fundings would not make it a SPG facilities. But it will adequate enough and a facility that SPG would have been set here.

Mr. Chairman and committee member, I ask each and every one of you to approve this bill and it's increase in fundings and join our Mayor in our improved facilities, but no one is to old for recreation.

I tip my hat of to you for taking this step and making it happen, thank you.
