AN ACT TO CREATE THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM PERFORMANCE REVIEW PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Findings. The government of Guam is in great need of
- 3 improving its service to its customers, improving the quality and efficiency of
- 4 service and of re-organizing in a manner that improves service while reducing

costs. As a step in this long-term improvement, it is critical that the departments and agencies of the government itself take a strong role in addressing these issues. To do this, a performance review is required that involves the participation of every government agency in evaluating its own performance, defining who specifically is being served by the activities of that agency, re-defining service objectives where clear gaps exist, re-defining program objectives and activities in ways that meet the actual and articulated needs of defined customers, eliminating waste, recommending consolidations of services as appropriate, allocating resources and personnel, and developing continuous feedback mechanisms from customers in order to continuously improve customer service.

- Section 2. (a) Every department, agency, autonomous agency, office, instrumentality and activity of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam, all of which shall hereinafter described as "instrumentalities," shall over the course of the six (6) months subsequent to the effective date of this Act conduct a thorough performance review of all of their activities pursuant to this Section and the conditions and details described herein.
- (b) Every instrumentality and activity of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam shall, as a first step in this review, convene a review committee which shall include, as a minimum, the director, the instrumentality or head of the instrumentality if otherwise designated, and every administrator of every division of the instrumentality. This review committee shall be responsible for conducting the performance review and promulgating such review upon completion.

The review committee shall divide all functions, services and (c) activities, without exception, into elements that shall be designated "programs". Each program shall be a distinct and discrete unit of activities designed to meet directly complimentary objectives and serving precisely the same customers. For example, for these purpose the Office of Highway Safety is not a program. It actually consists of several programs that can be designated as follows, "public relations campaign through mass media intended to disseminate traffic information to Guam drivers" and "collecting data from traffic accidents and providing such data to highway designers". These are separate and distinct programs, because they have different objectives, different activities, but most important, different customers. This degree of distinction shall be employed throughout the process. Administrative and similar so-called support activities shall be designated as separate and distinct programs, and not lumped in with other programs as "support." All activities and work associated with an instrumentality must be divided and designated into programs.

(d) The review committee shall designate, as part of its review, "customers" for each program. Customers are defined as that portion of the public that directly interacts with the program, or otherwise receives direct benefit from the program. The term direct is important here. Broad customer designations, such as "the people of Guam" are unacceptable for lack of focus. As an example, the program designated "inspecting restaurants for health violations," which is currently provided by the Division of Environmental Health, DPHSS may have benefit to the public in general. However, for the purposes of this review the customer of this program is that portion of the

- public that interacts with the program, namely the restaurants. Virtually all
 programs should have a fairly definable and distinct group of customers.
- The review committee shall "assign" to each program those 3 positions currently filled whose activities and work are directly used by the 4 5 program to service its customers. In this fashion, program by program and position by position, all positions currently filled in an instrumentality shall 6 7 be assigned to a program. In such cases where a position may, in reality, 8 work for more than one (1) program, the review committee shall designate a proportion of that position to each program for which the position works. 9 10 The total of such proportional assignments must equal one hundred percent 11 (100%), for example, if a clerk/typist in fact works for two (2) programs, a 12 quarter of the time for Program A and three quarters (3/4) of the time for 13 Program B, then the review shall include a clerk/typist assigned to Program A at twenty-five percent (25%) and one to Program B at seventy-five percent 14 15 The review, when assigning positions to programs, must clearly 16 indicate the specific real-time activities of the position within the context of 17 the program to which they are assigned. This is not a position description, but 18 an actual accounting of the day to day activities of that particular position as 19 it relates to the job, or jobs, at hand.
 - (f) The review committee shall assign material resources and equipment to each program, again using proportions should a piece of equipment be utilized by more than one (1) program.

(g) The review committee shall clearly articulate the service objectives of each program and clearly illustrate how these objectives meet the actual needs of each customer of each program.

- 1 (h) Where programs do *not* clearly meet the needs of customers, the 2 review committee shall identify gaps or deficiencies in service provided by a 3 program.
 - (i) The review committee shall identify new objectives or new activities for each program to better meet the actual needs of customers.

- 6 (j) The review committee shall recommend re-assignments of 7 personnel and resources to implement new objectives or activities.
 - (k) The review committee shall make recommendations with respect to program similarities and activity similarities, both within and without the organization, and recommend consolidations of effort and re-organization of programs, within and without the organization, as appropriate.
 - (l) The review committee shall identify areas of waste, and make recommendations for the elimination of such waste.
 - (m) The review committee shall develop a continuous mechanism for acquiring valid feedback from its customers with respect to specific services provided by each program, the effectiveness of such programs, the efficiency of such programs and other customer service issues. These feedback mechanisms must be continuous and perpetual. The review committee shall also devise mechanisms to constantly incorporate such customer feedback directly into the planning and budgetary processes of the various programs.
 - (n) Within one hundred twenty (120) days of the effective date of this Act, each review committee shall hold public hearings with their customer groups and the general public to present the work and recommendations of the committee and to accept testimony from the public. Such testimony shall be incorporated into the work of the committee.

- Section 3. Each review committee shall complete its assignments and
- 2 report to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guahan the results of their work within
- 3 one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this Act.

Committee Report on BILL NO. 730

"An act to create the Government of Guam Performance Review."

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs held a public hearing on Friday, September 11, 1998 at 10:00am at I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public notice of the hearing was announced in the September 6^{th} , 7^{th} , and 11^{th} 1998 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

There being no individuals present to provide oral testimony on the bill, the Chairman declared the bill officially heard by the Committee on Rules, Government Reform, and Federal Affairs.

II. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee finds that Bill 730 is aimed at improving the efficiency and quality of service in the government of Guam. The intent of the measure is also to reorganize the government of Guam in a manner that improves service while reducing the cost of providing that service. The Committee finds that the bill would require every department, agency, autonomous agency, office and instrumentality of the executive branch of the government of Guam to conduct a performance review. This review includes the convening of a review committee, which shall divide all functions, services and activities of that instrumentality into "programs." The review committee is further tasked with articulating the service objectives of each program and identifying gaps or deficiencies in service wherever they may exist. From its assessment of the programs the review committee shall identify any new objectives that enable the program to better meet the needs of its customers, as well as recommending the reassignment of personnel and resources to implement new objectives.

The Committee further finds that Bill 730 requires the review committees to identify any areas of waste and make recommendations to eliminate such waste. There will also be mechanisms to ensure that customer feedback is constantly incorporated into the planning and budget processes of the programs. In addition, the measure requires that each review committee hold public hearings with their customer groups and the general public to present the recommendations of the committee and to accept any testimony from the public.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs, to which Bill No. 730 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Kuåttro Na Liheslaturan Guåhan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 730** "An act to create the Government of Guam Performance Review."

The intent of the proposed bill is to induct a performance review of every apartment, agency, autonomous agency, office, and activity of the executive branch of the government of Guam. This performance review as a result of a thorough extraction of how each program/operation/service is provided or performed within the department/agency, will recommend improvements and plans to increase efficiency and effectiveness while keeping costs of operations to a minimum.

Though no appropriation is being made, presently, the potential for a fiscal impact is likely to occur. Such that conducting and implementing a performance review may require training, additional manpower, supplies, extensive time, and possible piecemeal contractual services. Furthermore, it should be noted that this function is not incorporated in the agencies'/departments operations budget. Therefore, additional funding may be required to carry out the intent of this bill. If this review is completely contracted out to the private sector, funding would have to be identified, thus, causing more strain on the General Fund.

The actual fiscal impact can not be ascertained at this time due to the lack of information.
