Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 727 (COR), "AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE ON MARITIME AFFAIRS AND FISHERIES", which I have vetoed.

This legislation is unnecessary because it duplicates an already existing volunteer group working with the Vision 2001 Task Force on fisheries. This legislation does not give the "Task Force on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries" any funding or any mandate that is not already being addressed by the Vision 2001 Task Force on fisheries.

All of the groups named as members in this legislation are welcome to contact Mr. Clifford Guzman at 475-9662 and volunteer to work with the Vision 2001 Task Force on fisheries.

It is counterproductive to set up alternative groups by statute, to work in the same areas of planning already in progress by other groups. Confusion will result. Also, this legislation contemplates creating yet another Department or Agency of the government, which in these times of declining revenues, is quite puzzling indeed.



PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULE

The Committee on Transportation, Telecommunications and Micronesian Affairs conducted a Public Hearing at 9 a.m. Tuesday, October 20, 1998 in the Public Hearing Room of I Mina'Bente Kuattro na Liheslaturan Guahan Temporary Bldg. In Hagatna.

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Joseph Q. Cruz, Acting General Manager of the Port Authority of Guam said he supports the intent of Bill 727 but does have some concerns. First, the Task Force may be a duplication of the Governor's Vision 2001 Task Force on Transportation and Transshipment whose objectives are to improve and expand the fisheries industry on Guam with the involvement of various government agencies. He questioned whether adding another GovGuam Department is financially sound in view of budgetary constraints. He said his agency will submit the Vision 2001 reports to the Committee.

He suggests expanding the responsibilities of existing departments or agencies to address the intent of Bill 727. But overall, he said the Port will support the Task Force in its endeavors.

Senator Pangelinan pointed out that a Task Force is necessary since dissemination of information on fisheries is lacking. The Task Force can be

like a repository of information that combines Vision 2001 goals and the goals of this proposed task force on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries

Ms. Dot Harris of the Department of Commerce and Mr. Frank Santos, Harbor Master, who were part of an Ad Hoc Committee that gathered in the '80s to discuss fisheries, see the need to formalize a Task Force because the ideas discussed in the Ad Hoc Committee were never acted upon. Bill 727 will create an entity that will focus on maximizing fisheries and marine resources. Further, Ms. Harris says the creation of a Task Force allows for dialogue among government agencies and key players in the fishing industry. Conservation issues, port of call for research vessels, economic development and assessing resources in our EEZ need to be addressed; therefore such a Task Force is necessary.

Senator Camacho points out that this Maritime Task Force needs to have a research base. Thus, he suggests that ties be developed with the University of Guam.

Mr. Bill Bradford, Vice President of the Guam Fisherman's Co-op, was concerned that certain key players such as the National Marine Fisheries

Agency and the U.S. Coast Guard do not have input. He said both need to be involved since Guam does not have autonomy over its EEZ until a conservation plan is established and since Guam does not have money for an enforcement arm.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that island leaders have long recognized the need to develop Guam's maritime and fisheries potential, and that an ad hoc committee to do so was established as far back as fifteen years ago. The Committee further finds that Governor Carl Gutierrez also recognized the importance of this industry to Guam's continued growth, and established a transportation and transhipment task force as part of his Vision 2001 plan. The Committee finds that there is now a need to "jump start" the efforts to develop Guam's maritime and fisheries industries, and a Task Force comprised of experts from all aspects of the industry is needed in order to develop an action plan within 180 days. Further, the Committee finds that the Task Force can draw on much of the work that has already been done over the years, and that should the Task Force determine that a permanent entity is necessary to continue the development and maintenance of the

maritime and fisheries industry on Guam, then it can recommend the establishment of a Maritime and Fisheries Bureau similar to the Guam Visitor's Bureau and it's role in the Tourism industry.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Transportation, Telecommunications and Micronesian Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 727 to the Twenty-Fourth Guam Legislature with the recommendation **To Pass.**

AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE ON MARITIME AFFAIRS AND FISHERIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslatura finds that there is a continuing need to diversify Guam's economy, and that developing other major industries will stimulate economic growth and help insulate the island from periodic downturns in other major industries. I Liheslatura further finds that there is great economic potential in the Maritime and Fisheries industry, and that it may be necessary to establish within the government a Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Bureau to develop and promote such an industry on Guam.

Section 2. Creation of the Task Force. There is established the Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Task Force ("Task Force") which is vested with the powers and duties specified in this Chapter. The Task Force shall consist of eleven (11) members, nine (9) who shall be appointed by I Maga'lahen Guåhan, and two (2) who shall be appointed by the Speaker of I Liheslatura no later than thirty (30) days subsequent to the effective date of this Act. I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall select the members so as to ensure that the Task Force includes at least one (1) representative each from the Guam

Economic Development Authority; the Department of Agriculture, Division of Fish and Wildlife; the Department of Commerce; the University of Guam Marine Lab; the Port Authority of Guam; the Guam International Airport Authority; the Chamber of Commerce Maritime Affairs Committee; the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative; and the Tuna transhipment industry. The members shall elect from among their membership a Chairperson to preside over meetings, and a Vice-Chairperson to preside over meetings in the absence of the Chairperson.

Section 3. Task Force powers and duties. The Task Force shall hold public meetings to examine the potential of the Maritime and Fisheries industry; the establishment of a Maritime and Fisheries Bureau within the government of Guam; the establishment of a Fisheries development fund; and the establishment of a regional Fishing Cooperative with other governments of the Micronesian region. The Task Force shall issue a report to I Maga' lahen Guåhan and the Speaker of I Liheslatura within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this Act. The report shall include an analysis of the potential of the Maritime and Fisheries industry and recommendations for governmental action.

Section 4. The Guam Economic Development Authority shall provide the necessary staff support to the Task Force.

Section 6. Termination of Task Force. The Task Force shall terminate upon the acceptance of its report by I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Speaker of I Liheslatura.

TESTIMONY ON BILL 727
"AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE ON MARITIME AFFAIRS AND FISHERIES"

GOOD MORNING MADAME CHAIRWOMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM SUPPORTS THE OVERALL INTENT OF BILL 727. ANY MEASURE THAT IS DESIGNED TO IMPROVE AND DIVERSIFY GUAM'S ECONOMY AND CREATE MORE BUSINESS FOR THE PORT IS, ON ITS FACE, A GOOD MEASURE. WE DO HAVE SOME CONCERNS, HOWEVER.

MUCH OF WHAT IS PROPOSED BY THIS LEGISLATION IS ALREADY BEING ADDRESSED BY THE GOVERNOR'S VISION 2001 TASK FORCE ON FISHERIES AND TRANSPORATION AND TRANSSHIPMENT. THE GOALS SET OUT IN THAT VISION WERE DERIVED THROUGH THE INPUT OF LEADERS IN THOSE AREAS AND MANY HAVE BEEN, OR ARE, IN THE PROCESS OF BEING IMPLEMENTED BY VARIOUS GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.



IN THE FISHERIES SECTION OF VISION 2001, THE TASK FORCE IDENTIFIED TWO MAJOR OBJECTIVES, WITH 21 SUB OBJECTIVES, TO IMPROVE AND EXPAND THE FISHERIES INDUSTRY ON GUAM. TO DATE, MORE THAN TEN OF THOSE SUB OBJECTIVES HAVE BEEN COMPLETED THROUGH CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN THE ORIGINAL TASK FORCE AND VARIOUS GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TASKED TO CARRY OUT THE PLAN.

LIKEWISE, OF THE THREE OBJECTIVES AND TWELVE SUB OBJECTIVES IDENTIFIED FOR TRANSSHIPMENT, FIVE HAVE NOW BEEN COMPLETED.

AREAS THAT THE VISION IS ADDRESSING ARE THE EXPANSION OF A LOCAL **FISHING** FLEET THROUGH INCENTIVE PROGRAMS. COOPERATION WITH OTHER MICRONESIAN ISLANDS TO DEVELOP REGIONAL FISHERIES, THE **IMPROVEMENT OF** PORT INFRASTRUCTURE, THE COLLECTION OF DATA, MARKETING AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF SUPPORT INDUSTRY SUCH AS AQUACULTURE.

AMONG THE AGENCIES INVOLVED IN THIS PROCESS ARE THE GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, THE PORT AUTHORITY, THE AIRPORT AUTHORITY,

CUSTOMS & QUARANTINE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE.

THESE PARTIES MEET REGULARLY TO DISCUSS THE PROGRESS ON

THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF VISION 2001.

I AM ALSO A LITTLE CONCERNED ABOUT WHAT SEEMS TO BE THE OVERALL GOAL OF THE MARITIME AFFAIRS AND FISHERIES TASK FORCE - TO CREATE A MARITIME AND FISHERIES BUREAU WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM. ALTHOUGH I SUPPORT THE INTENT OF THIS LEGISLATION TO HELP THE FISHING AND MARITIME INDUSTRIES, I QUESTION WHETHER ADDING YET ANOTHER **GOVGUAM** DEPARTMENT IS FINANCIALLY SOUND IN VIEW OF OUR BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS. THE LEGISLATURE MAY WISH TO CONSIDER EXPANDING RESPONSIBILITIES OF EXISITING DEPARTMENTS OR AGENCIES TO ADDRESS THE INTENT OF BILL 727.

BILL 727 ALSO PROPOSES TO HAVE THE GOVERNOR APPOINT MEMBERS TO THE TASK FORCE FROM VARIOUS GOVERNMENT AGENCIES. CURRENT LAW PROHIBITS A GOVGUAM EMPLOYEE FROM RECEIVING A STIPEND WHILE SERVING ON A BOARD OR COMMISSION. IS IT THE INTENT OF BILL 727 TO CHANGE THE CURRENT PRACTICE?

GIVEN THE FACT THAT THE VARIOUS AGENCIES HAVE BEEN WORKING ON THIS ISSUE FOR THE PAST COUPLE OF YEARS, THE CREATION OF A TASK FORCE BY LAW SEEMS A LITTLE UNNECESSARY AND A DUPLICATION OF EFFORTS. SHOULD YOU FIND IT NECESSARY TO LEGISLATE WHAT HAS ALREADY BEEN TAKING PLACE, HOWEVER, THE PORT WILL GLADLY SUPPORT THE TASK FORCE IN EVERY WAY POSSIBLE.

The Department of Commerce is submitting input relative to Bill No. 727 (COR):

AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE ON MARITIME AFFAIRS AND FISHERIES

The enhancement of the fisheries sector's contribution to Guam's overall economy is a vested responsibility of the Department of Commerce, as identified in the Department's enabling legislation, which includes the mandate to, "...investigate, study and undertake ways and means of promoting and encouraging the prosperous development and operation of the legitimate interest and welfare of Guam business, industry and commerce."

Rather than create an additional entity within the Government of Guam, we would recommend strengthening the capabilities of agencies such as Commerce, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Port Authority of Guam and other agencies to support the economic development of fisheries by providing them with the resources needed to effectively implement their respective mandates.

The formal establishment of a working body comprised of both public and private sector counterparts to examine various fisheries related issues is a good idea. Commerce had, for many years, provided a public forum for discussion under the Ad Hoc Committee on Fisheries, but again, due to limitations in resources, this program has been placed on the



backburner. The Governor's Vision 2001 Fisheries Task Force is another excellent example of how a public/private sector partnership can work together to develop a plan of action to promote the industry. We would recommend that the scope of a fisheries working group not be limited to a task force with specific duties and deadlines, but rather, be created as a coordinating body to ensure that pertinent parties are kept abreast of latest developments and issues affecting the fisheries industry, and are available to provide support in resolving issues, promotion of the industry, and other industry needs (i.e. research, liaison services).

We greatly appreciate your concern and active efforts to address the pressing needs affecting the potential growth and development of fisheries on Guam. The basic mechanisms to accomplish these ends are already existing within the Government of Guam structure. What is needed is greater resource support for the agencies to enable us to accomplish our respective mandates. We look forward to further discussing these concerns with you. Dangkolo na Si Yu'os Ma'ase.

Esteemed Senators,

As a long time proponent for the development of commercial fishing opportunities on Guam we applaud your recent efforts to promote the commercial fishing industry through bill #727. We believe many avenues exist to further both local and regional fisheries development, whether small scale or large.

Over the past 16 years Guam has seen the arrival of both purseseine and longline fishing fleets and their associated industries. Support and service sector and secondary processing of products companies have augmented the Guam economy with employment opportunities and associated tax revenues. Growth has not come without it's share of misunderstanding and competitive positioning.

Regarding the creation of a Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Task Force, any effort to further develop the commercial fishing industry will be appreciated. Gov. Guiterrez's Vision 2001 began a process of identifying specific factors necessary to enhance our industry and accomplished a great many of their objectives within a short period of time. We are concerned that the formation of a new task force might be duplication of process, even though the Task Force would be responding to the Legislature, not the governor directly. It is our feeling that the commercial fishing industry of Guam should form a business group comprised of the various levels of involvement within the industry, principally the fleet/vessel owner/operators(both longline and purseseine), the service/supply/processor sector, and the transportation(air/fuel) sector. With a consolidated industry based front, our multi-level industry could better address and respond to the multitude of issues that affect us all. Once we have achieved a balanced representation and platform, the coalition would be better prepared to work with government task forces, whether Vision 2001 or the one being proposed by your legislation.

Regretfully the commercial fishing industry competes as much with itself as it does in the world or regional market. Until such time that industry goals become acceptable to the majority of it's players, government based efforts may receive a less than adequate rate of approval. Regardless, our company will continue to support yours and Gov. Guiterrez's efforts to improve our industry conditions and opportunities.


