Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 753 (LS), "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE ELIGIBILITY OF BONA FIDE FARMERS TO PROCURE EQUIPMENT THROUGH THE GENERAL SERVICES AGENCY", which I have vetoed.

This is a curious piece of legislation, since it authorizes owners of private businesses, farmers, to place orders through a local government agency, GSA, for equipment and supplies needed to run their private businesses. This legislation has the potential of removing up to \$15 Million of business now enjoyed by the private sector, and would turn the General Services Administration of the Department of Administration into a "Sears and Roebuck" for island farmers.

This legislation allows each person registered as a farmer to have the government process up to \$50,000 of items for use in that person's business. This would mean that trucks, cars, tractors, gas, various farming equipment and supplies would be ordered by the government, individually for each farmer. In fact, this legislation calls for the separate processing of orders for each farmer, and even the economy of scale which could be realized by bulk ordering for a group is eliminated.

Assistance to farmers has been a long tradition on Guam, and a number of programs are offered through the Department of Agriculture, including free seed, free cuttings of plants, and other services. However, turning over

the GSA to the use of farmers would discriminate against other businesses on our island who will wonder why they also do not have the privilege of having the Department of Administration's GSA do their ordering of equipment and supplies for them.

Perhaps it would be better for i Liheslatura to assist farmers in forming a farmers cooperative, which could gain economies of scale through bulk ordering, rather than mandating that the government hire more employees and equipment to process separate orders for each and every private farmer.
