Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 291 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §5001(f) TO PART A, ARTICLE 1, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 5 OF TITLE 5 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO MANDATING THAT ALL PURCHASES MADE FOR GOVERNMENT TRAVEL AUTHORIZATION MUST BE ROTATED FAIRLY AND COMPETITIVELY AMONG ALL LICENSED TRAVEL AGENCIES OPERATING IN GUAM.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-85.

This legislation adds a procurement policy to the Guam Procurement Laws, stating that rotating of travel business take place for government travel to all licensed travel agencies operating in good standing in Guam.

It is very desirable that this policy be explicitly stated. It will discourage any drifting into patterns that may occur when various travel arrangements are made throughout the government. All businesses on Guam should have an equal chance to prosper from the economic use of the taxpayer's dollars.

There are provisions in the policy that the agencies used by the government be in good standing and currently licensed. This will ensure that government business is conducted with duly licensed agencies that will be qualified to deliver the necessary services. There are also provisions to adopt rules and regulations for travel agency business. This will clarify any questions on how the rotating is to be carried out.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §5001(f) TO PART A, ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 5, DIVISION 1 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO MANDATING THAT ALL PURCHASES MADE FOR GOVERNMENT TRAVEL AUTHORIZATION MUST BE ROTATED FAIRLY AND COMPETITIVELY AMONG ALL LICENSED TRAVEL AGENCIES OPERATING IN GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. The Guam Legislature finds that the government of Guam spends nearly Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) in air travel annually. Commissions paid by the airline companies on air travel purchases of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) to local travel agencies can easily amount to nearly Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00). While the government of Guam must employ cost cutting measures throughout the government of Guam, including the legislative, judiciary and executive branches, and all autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies, it must, at the same time and equally as important, insure that those local travel agency businesses, on good standing, with valid business licenses, is guaranteed the opportunity to a fair and competitive share of the travel business from the government of Guam.

Section 2. Section 5001(f) of Part A, Article 1, Chapter 5, Division 1 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby added to read as follows:

"(f) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, procurement of air travel vouchers by the government of Guam, including the legislative, judiciary and executive branches, and all autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies, including the A. B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority, the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Housing & Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the University of Guam, the Port Authority of Guam, the Guam Rental Corporation, the Guam Community College, the Guam Water Works

Authority, the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, the Guam Mass Transit Authority, the Guam Visitor's Bureau, the Public Defenders Service Corporation, the Guam Educational Telecommunication Corporation, the Guam Election Commission, the Civil Service Commission, the Department of Education, the Guam Environmental Protection Agency and the Guam Vocational Rehabilitation, from local travel agencies with valid business license and on good standing with the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall be rotated fairly and competitively to insure that no single travel agency or a small group of travel agencies monopolize the sale of air travel vouchers to the The Director of the Department of government of Guam. Administration, who shall be responsible in administering this Act as it applies to the executive branch, with representatives from the executive, judiciary and legislative branches shall be responsible, within ninety (90) days from the enactment of this Act, for the development of the necessary rules and regulations to insure that the intent of this Act is followed and implemented by all branches and agencies of the government of Guam and pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law. Each branch of the government of Guam, executive, legislative and judiciary, shall be responsible in implementing and adhering to the rules and regulations developed herein in their own respective branches. Failure to procure air travel voucher following the rules and regulations developed herein shall invalidate and render the approved travel authorization null and void and any expenditure shall be completely and totally the responsibility of the traveler and any

expenditure the government of Guam incurred shall be reimbursed by the respective traveler. The traveler shall not be reimbursed in any manner whatsoever for any of these expenditures. Anyone authorizing such reimbursement shall be guilty of fraud and shall be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law."

PUBLIC HEARING

Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman of the Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services (CPFA&GGS) called to order at 9:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 27, 1997, a public hearing to gather testimony on Bill No. 291, "An Act to Amend Section 5001, Part A of Article 1 of Division 1 of Chapter 5 of 5 GCA by Adding a New Section 5001(f) Relative to Mandating that All Purchases Made for Government Travel Authorization Must be Rotated Fairly and Competitively Among All Licensed Travel Agencies Operating in Guam."

BACKGROUND

The government of Guam annually spends approximately \$4,000,000.00 in airline travel, with commissions paid to travel agencies totaling close to \$400,000.00 each year. In order to ensure that no single travel agency, or group of travel agencies, monopolize the sale of air travel vouchers to the government, the measure seeks to ensure that the procurement of air travel vouchers by the government of Guam be equitably and competitively rotated among those local travel agencies that have valid

business licenses, and who are in good standing with the Department of Revenue and Taxation. The Director of the Department of Administration shall be tasked with administering this act as it applies to the executive branch, with representatives from the executive, judiciary and legislative branches responsible for the development of the necessary rules and regulations to insure that the act is followed and implemented by all branches and agencies of the government of Guam, and in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law.

TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Ms. Frances C. Schier, Guam Society of Travel Agents ('GSTA") President, along with former GSTA President Frances Santos, submitted written testimony, as well as presented oral testimony in support of Bill No. 291. Both recognized the importance of ensuring that local travel agencies, having valid business licenses, and that are in good standing with the Department of Revenue and Taxation, be guaranteed the opportunity to a fair and competitive share of airline travel business from the government of Guam by having procurement of air travel vouchers rotated. Ms. Schier and Ms. Santos emphasized the importance of the change in language from the original version which called for the "bidding out" of travel services to the rotation of such services in the current version of the measure. Ms. Santos stated that such language would be deemed inappropriate under the standards imposed by the International Airlines Travel Agent Network ("IATAN"), which certifies and approves local travel agencies for business operations. To "bid out" travel services would be inappropriate due to the fact that airfares are standard, regardless of the travel agency, and that it is illegal under IATAN standards to discount any airfare, therefore negating a "bidding out" process. Both Ms. Schier and Ms. Santos emphasized that many local travel agencies are small businesses and that these businesses survive on commissions. They went on to stress the need for government of Guam agencies to settle accounts in a timely manner. Ms. Frances Santos recommended that Travel Authorizations be issued at the same time tickets are issued. (Written testimony attached.)

All other individuals present to testify, presented oral testimony in support of the measure, as well as expressed similar testimony and concerns on billing procedures.

Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman, inquired on the extent of the problems facing the travel agencies regarding prompt payment by government of Guam agencies. Frances Santos responded by stating that the problem of prompt payment has been a reoccurring problem, most especially with payments that must be remitted from the Department of Administration and the Department of Education.

Senator Anthony C. Blaz, Chairman of the Committee on Finance and Taxation, stated that the government has the responsibility to fairly and competitively rotate

the procurement of air travel vouchers. He thanked the chairman for expeditiously hearing the measure.

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. stated that he is in support of Bill No. 291, and emphasized that all agencies must exercise fiscal responsibility in ensuring payment is remitted in a timely manner.

The Bureau of Budget and Management Research, in its fiscal note, finds that Bill No. 291 would require a considerable investment of resources from the Department of Administration to implement the act, which would have to be absorbed in the department's operational budget.

FINDINGS

The Committee finds that Bill No. 291 be reported out with technical changes in which any and all reference made therein to "Section 5001(e)" be changed to read Section 5001(f)".

RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services hereby reports out Bill No. 291, as substituted by the author, with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

Dear Senator Blaz:

This letter is in reference to your Bill proposing that the Government of Guam change their travel procedures to bid out travel services.

As President of the Guam Society of Travel Agents here on Guam we would like to arrange for a meeting with you to present our input on this matter.

Travel Agencies here on Guam are governed by the International Airlines Travel Agent Network. Agencies must be certified and approved by IATAN in order to operate a travel agency. Domestic travel within the Continental U.S. have been deregulated, however, International travel is regulated by Federal Law.

As such, travel agencies adhere to standards imposed by IATAN (International Airlines Travel Agent Network).

We are in full support of your proposal to circulate the travel business among the Travel Agencies however, the competitive bidding process would be inappropriate. All airfares are standard regardless of which travel agency you use. It is illegal under IATAN regulations to discount any airfare already established by a carrier. Of course, advance purchase fares are lower than regular economy fares. An agent may question a prospective traveller as to the conditions of their travel and whether the advance purchase restrictions would be suitable for their travel needs. The Government of Guam may take advantage of these advance purchase tickets if they are able to make immediate payments upon issuance of these tickets. Once these tickets are issued penalties apply when cancellations or changes in travel dates occur.

It would be an unfair business practice for the Government to expect travel agencies to carry the financial burden of penalties or to bankroll these expenses.

We would appreciate meeting with you to discuss this matter as it affects the members in our organization. Please contact Liz Duenas at 646-7991 for a meeting date.

FOOTNOTES: !/The bill would require all government entities to rotate travel vouchers among the various travel agencies by requiring the Director of Administration with other representatives from the Judiciary and Legislative branch to develop rules and regulations. This would require a considerable investment of resources from Department of Administration to implement the act, which would have to be absorbed in their operational budget.
