1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I *Lihselaturan*

3 *Guåhan* finds that former Senator Jesus R. Quinene, a statesman in the First

4 and Second Guam Legislatures, was a champion in strengthening our

1 infrastructure and educating our children. From the building of new schools,
2 to the construction of the roadway leading to the present Agat-Umatac Road,
3 Senator Jesus R. Quinene was pro-active and his leadership was put to the
4 benefit of the entire island.

5 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further acknowledges that through the work,
6 foresight and action of former Senator Jesus R. Quinene, the Government of
7 Guam Retirement Fund was created, providing retirement annuities and
8 benefits to employees of the government of Guam and their survivors.

9 It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to commemorate the
10 memory and contributions of the late Senator Jesus R. Quinene by naming the
11 present Retirement Fund Building in his honor.

12 **Section 2.** Section 833 is hereby *added* to Chapter 8, Article 1 of Title 1
13 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

14 **"Section 833. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building.**

15 The Retirement Fund Building, located in the Municipality of Maite,
16 Guam, shall hereafter be known as the '*Senator Jesus R. Quinene*
17 *Retirement Fund Building.*' Any provisions in the laws of Guam referring
18 to the Retirement Fund Building are hereby deemed to read the '*Senator*
19 *Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building.*' *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*, the
20 Director of the Retirement Fund, the Mayor of Mongmong-Toto-Maite
21 ('M-T-M') and members of the M-T-M Municipal Planning Council,
22 shall cause to be erected appropriate nameplates or signs designating
23 the Retirement Fund Building as the '*Senator Jesus R. Quinene Retirement*
24 *Fund Building.*' Further, at such ceremony as *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*, the

**AN ACT TO ADD §833 TO ARTICLE 1 OF TITLE
1 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
RENAMING THE RETIREMENT FUND
BUILDING AS THE "SENATOR JESUS R.
QUINENE RETIREMENT FUND BUILDING".**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** I Liheslaturan Guahan
3 finds that former Senator Jesus R. Quinene, a statesman in the First and
4 Second Guam Legislature, was a champion in strengthening our
5 infrastructure and educating our children. From the building of new
6 schools, to the construction of the roadway leading to the present Agat-
7 Umatac Road, Sen. Jesus R. Quinene was pro-active and his leadership was
8 put to the benefit of the entire island.

9 I Liheslaturan Guahan further acknowledges that through the work,
10 foresight and action of former Sen. Jesus R. Quinene, the Government of
11 Guam Retirement Fund was created providing retirement annuities and
12 benefits to employees of the government of Guam and their survivors.

1 It is therefore the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to commemorate
2 the memory and contributions of the late Sen. Jesus R. Quinene by naming
3 the present Retirement Fund Building in his honor.

4 **Section 2.** Section 833 is hereby added to Chapter 8, Article 1 of Title
5 1 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

6 **"Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building.** The Retirement
7 Fund Building, located in the Municipality of Maite, shall hereafter be
8 known as the "Sen. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building". Any
9 provisions in the laws of Guam referring to the Retirement Fund Building
10 are hereby deemed to read the "Sen. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund
11 Building". The Governor of Guam, the Director of the Retirement Fund,
12 the Mayor of Mong Mong-Toto-Maite and members of the M-T-M
13 Municipal Planning Council, shall cause to be erected appropriated
14 nameplates or signs designating the Retirement Fund Building as the "Sen.
15 Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building". Further, at such ceremony as
16 the Governor, the Director of the Retirement Fund and the Mayor of M-T-
17 M and members of the M-T-M Municipal Planning Council deem
18 appropriate, the "Sen. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building," shall
19 be officially named and a plaque bearing the name, picture, and brief
20 history of the contributions of the late Senator Jesus R. Quinene to the
21 people of Guam shall be affixed within a suitable spot in or on the
22 building."
