AN ACT TO ADD NEW SUBSECTIONS (m) AND (n) TO \$9106 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO REQUIRE THAT AT LEAST ONE (1) DIRECTOR ON THE GUAM VISITORS BUREAU HAVE A BACKGROUND IN CHAMORRO FOLK ARTS, LANGUAGE, CULTURAL HERITAGE OR HISTORIC PRESERVATION, AND TO REQUIRE REPRESENTATION OF BOTH GENDERS ON THE GVB BOARD.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that tourism is likely to remain Guam's most important industry for
- 4 many years, and the Guam Visitors Bureau's surveys reveal that a majority

of visitors have expressed an interest in Guam's folk arts, culture, 1 language, heritage and history. Members of various travel industries, 2 retailers, company operators, hoteliers, tour airline including 3 representatives and restaurateurs are frequently elected or appointed to 4 the Board of Directors of the Guam Visitors Bureau (GVB). However, 5 individuals with expertise in our island's folk arts, culture, language, 6 heritage and history are not always found on the Board. There can be no 7 denying the importance of folk arts, culture, language, heritage and history 8 in attracting and entertaining visitors, and an individual with such 9 expertise should always be a member of the GVB Board. 10

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that existing Guam law mandates the membership of both genders on appointed boards and commissions, among other requirements. However, the unique status of the GVB Board has raised questions about whether appointing authorities are exempt from the mandates.

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to require that the appointees of *I Maga'lahi* follow existing appointing requirements as contained in §2105 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated. It is further the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that the appointees of *I Maga'lahi* include an individual who possesses expertise in our island's folk arts, culture, language, heritage or history.

Section 2. A new §9106(m) is hereby *added* to Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

"(m) Appointments made by *I Maga'lahi* shall conform to the requirements of §2105 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated."

1	Section 3. A new §9106(n) is hereby added to Title 12 of the Guam
2	Code Annotated, to read as follows:
3	"(n) Appointments made by I Maga'lahi shall include an
4	individual who possesses expertise in our island's folk arts, culture,
5	language, heritage or history."
6	Section 4. Effective Date. The provisions contained herein shall
7	become applicable upon the effective date of this Act
