AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 60108(c) OF CHAPTER 60 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, COMPLYING TO UNITED STATES PUBLIC LAW 92-544, RELATIVE TO UTILIZING THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION'S DATABASE IN THE REVIEW OF AN APPLICANT'S ELIGIBILITY FOR A FIREARMS IDENTIFICATION CARD.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*finds that the existing protocol for the application of a firearms

didentification card needs to be updated to ensure the safety and protection

of the people from individuals who possess a criminal record or that may

2 be registered as a terrorist suspect under the United States Federal Bureau

3 of Investigation. This Act will promulgate and implement the appropriate

4 rules and regulations pertaining to the necessary requirement to conduct

5 background checks using the Federal Bureau of Investigation's database in

the review of an applicant's eligibility for a firearms identification card in

compliance with United States Public Law 92-544.

Section 2. §60108(c) of Chapter 60 of Division 3 of Part 2 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read:

"(c) An applicant for an identification card shall apply therefore on a form supplied by the Department and shall provide such information as may be necessary to afford the Department reasonable opportunity to ascertain the facts required to appear upon the card and facts relevant to the applicant's eligibility for a card, and facts necessary to determine whether the applicant may carry a concealed weapon if such permission is sought. The applicant is required to submit to a national criminal background check conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation to process such background checks.

A fingerprint card, or electronic fingerprint data, if so utilized, shall be transmitted to Guam's State Identification Bureau as classified by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for processing of fingerprints."

Section 3. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary

- 1 to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of
- 2 this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or
- 3 application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
