AN ACT TO AMEND §6114 OF CHAPTER 6 OF TITLE 3, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE CRIMINAL RECORD OF A PERSON SEEKING PUBLIC OFFICE.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. §6114 of Chapter 6, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 "§6114. Convicted Felons and Others Shall Not be
- 5 Candidates. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all candidates for
- any elected public office, board or commission must not have been

convicted of a felony, and must *not* have been convicted of a misdemeanor involving criminal sexual conduct or crime of moral turpitude.

At the time of filing for candidacy with the Commission, a candidate shall submit: (1) a clearance from the Guam Police Department, and a clearance from the Judiciary of Guam; and (2) a signed affidavit attesting that the candidate has not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor, as described herein in this Section, in any State or Territory of the United States or foreign country. The cost for the police clearance and the court clearance required by this Section shall be borne by the person seeking the public office."

**Section 2**. **Effective Date.** The effective date of this Act *shall* be retroactive to April 1, 2010.

AN ACT TO AMEND §6114 OF CHAPTER 6 OF TITLE 3, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE CRIMINAL RECORD OF A PERSON SEEKING PUBLIC OFFICE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. §6114 of Chapter 6, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read:

"§6114. Convicted Felons and Others Shall Not be Candidates. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all candidates for any elected public office, board or commission must *not* have been convicted of a felony, and must *not* have been convicted of a misdemeanor involving criminal sexual conduct or crime of moral turpitude.

At the time of filing for candidacy with the Commission, all candidates *shall* submit: (1) obtain and submit a clearance from the Guam Police Department, and shall submit: (1) a fingerprint card, or electronic fingerprint data, if so utilized to the Guam's State Identification Bureau, as classified by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for processing of fingerprints. The fingerprints shall be forwarded to the FBI for a national criminal history record check. The results of the FBI check will be returned to the Guam Police Department, and shall not be further

disseminated outside the receiving governmental agency. A certification of the results may be provided to the candidate upon request; which includes a search of a nation-wide database, such as the National Crime Information Center of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for any previous non-expunged or non-pardoned conviction of a felony, or previous non-expunged or non-pardoned conviction of a misdemeanor involving criminal sexual conduct or crime of moral turpitude; and (2) a signed affidavit attesting that the candidate has *not* been convicted for a felony or misdemeanor, as described herein in this Section, in any State or Territory of the United States or foreign country. The cost for the police clearance and FBI background check required by this Section shall be borne by the person seeking the public office."

**Section 2**. Effective Date. The effective date of this Act *shall* be retroactive to April 1, 2010.
