#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that the recent passage of Public Law 30-227, known as the "Healthcare Insurance
- 4 Transparency Act of 2010", was for the purpose of ensuring that the processes

pursuant to which the government of Guam acquires health insurance coverage for its active employees and retirees are negotiated in a manner so as to ultimately reflect the most economical and beneficial health plan possible. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that although funding for the government of Guam's annual contribution to the health care insurance plan is dependant upon an appropriation to be included in the upcoming fiscal year budget act, the negotiation process is completed prior to the budget process without legislative input or knowledge. The annual task of negotiating the upcoming fiscal year's healthcare insurance plan is conducted and completed without appropriate input and feedback from policy makers responsible for appropriating the available funds of the people of Guam.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to include at least two (2) key Members of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature) in the Government of Guam's Health Insurance Negotiating Team. The Chairpersons of both the Committee on Health and the Committee on Appropriations will be integral members in ensuring any health plan the government of Guam procures for its employees and retirees is the most beneficial, while also being fiscally achievable and realistically reflective of budgetary constraints. It is, further, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to seek to ensure that by the inclusion of two (2) of its Members who chair the Health and the Appropriations Committees in the Negotiating Team it will better ensure the government of Guam does *not* repeat the unconscionable and callous actions of entering into a health insurance plan that is unanticipated and unaffordable for the taxpayers of Guam.

Section 2. Inclusion of Policymakers in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team. The first paragraph of §4302(c) of Article 3, Chapter 4 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

The Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team shall consist of the Director of Administration, who shall be Chairperson; the Administrator of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), or his or her designee; the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, or his or her designee; an employee representative from the Judicial Branch to be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam; an employee representative of the Legislative Branch to be appointed by the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan; the Superintendent of the Department of Education, or his or her designee; the Director of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, or his or her designee; a retiree who is a member of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund to be appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund; one (1) member of the general public, appointed by I Maga'lahen Guåhan; the Chairperson of the Committee on Health or the successor committee of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, or his or her designee, who shall sit as an ex-officio non-voting member; and the Chairperson of the Committee on Appropriations, or the successor committee of I Liheslaturan Guåhan, or his or her designee, who shall sit as an ex-officio non-voting member. The Negotiating Team shall examine the financial information of the prepaid health insurance companies, health care providers or other legal entities for the purpose of developing the most economical and beneficial health plan for the Government of Guam The Negotiating Team may obtain technical employees and retirees. support from other financial and health-related agencies. The Negotiating Team shall develop its rules of procedure in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. The Negotiating Team with the approval

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of I Maga'lahi is authorized to contract an actuary competent to develop 1 2 proposed health insurance rates or other recognized expert to train and/or advise the Negotiating Team." 3 Section 3. Clarification of Applicability of Amendment Pursuant to 4 5 Section 2 of this Act. In an earlier letter to you, this office indicated that it would review the above legislative bill and if deemed appropriate, submit our comments on the bill.

The current health insurance law for government employees – 4 GCA § 4302(c) – provides that a negotiating team consisting of certain member "shall examine the financial information of the prepaid health insurance companies, health care providers or other legal entities for the purpose of developing the most economical and beneficial health plan for the Government of Guam employees and retirees." (emphasis in original). This task of developing the most economical and beneficial health insurance plan for employees throughout the government of Guam is essentially an executive function of the government of Guam.

Section 2 of Bill 56-31 would amend § 4302(c) by adding the following members to the employee health insurance negotiation team: "the Chairperson of the Committee on Health of I Liheslaturan Guahan, or his or her designee; the Chairperson of the Committee on Appropriations of I Liheslaturan Guahan, or his or her designee". Hence, two members of I Liheslaturan Guahan or their designees would be added to the negotiation team.

We believe the addition of two Guam Senators to a negotiating team which performs what is essentially an executive function violates the separation of powers doctrine of the Guam Organic Act. The basis for our belief is, to a large extent, found in the Guam Supreme Court's decision in *In re Request of Governor Gutierrez*, 2002 Guam 1.

The Legislature's plenary power of appropriation includes the power to impose "conditions upon the expenditure of appropriated funds." Santos, 1982 WL 30790, at \* 3; Schneider, 547 P.2d at 799 ("[T]he appropriation of money and the setting of limitations on expenditures by state executive agencies constitutes an exercise of legislative power."). \* \* \*

However, the Legislature may not set limitations or conditions which "purport to reserve to the legislature powers of close supervision that are essentially executive in character." See Anderson, 579 P.2d at 624 (Colo.1978). "Staffing decision are at the core of the Governor's day-to-day administration of government." Communications Workers, 617 A.2d at 234. Accordingly, the legislature may not set conditions to an appropriation which impinge on the executive's power to "allocate staff and resources" for the proper fulfillment of its duty to execute the laws. See Anderson, 579 P.2d at 623-24.

Id., 2002 Guam 1 ¶¶ 44, 45 (emphasis added). Hence, the court emphasized that it is the legislature's reservation of authority to itself to superintend the decision-making process of the executive that is of concern to the courts.

The Supreme Court of Guam cited with approval a decision from the Supreme Court of Kansas involving a "State Finance Council" composed of the Governor and eight legislators empowered to make personnel decisions typically thought of as belonging to the department of administration, an executive branch agency.

An analogous case is State ex rel. Schneider v. Bennet, 219 Kan. 285, 547 P.2d 786 (1976). In Schneider, the plaintiff challenged the constitutional validity of the law establishing the powers and duties of the state finance council ("SFC"). The SFC was composed of the governor and eight members of the legislature. In accordance with statute, the SFC had various powers, including the powers to: (1) fix or approve the compensation paid to state officers and employees, and (2) approv[e] of assignment of positions in the civil service to classes ... assignment of classes to salary ranges, approv[e] of the pay plan containing a schedule of salary and wage ranges and steps, approv[e] of terms upon which state agencies may furnish housing, food service and other employee maintenance to state officers and employees in the civil service, and ... determin[e] ... the cost and value of such benefits.... The court held that these powers were essentially executive or administrative in nature in that they concern the day-to-day operations of the department of administration and its various divisions. Accordingly, the court invalidated the statute granting these powers to the SFC, holding:

The vesting of such powers in the state finance council in our judgment clearly grants to a legislatively oriented body control over the operation of an executive agency and constitutes a usurpation of executive power by the legislative department.

The court's holding was pronounced in light of the court's agreement that the appropriation of money and the setting of limitations on expenditures by state executive agencies constitutes an exercise of legislative power.

Id., 2002 Guam 1 ¶¶ 49. (most citations and internal quotation marks omitted). Hence, the doctrine of separation of powers comes into play when a legislature places its own members on a council that performs an executive function.

We believe that In re Request of Governor Gutierrez and State ex rel. Schneider, which is cited with approval therein, lead to the conclusion that the amendment proposed by Bill 56-31 violates the Organic Act doctrine of separation of powers.

Ramos was one of the leaders of the near bloodless fourday people power revolution 25 years ago that ousted the late strongman Ferdinand Marcos from 20-year-rule and

helped install Aguino's mother Corazon

"Cory" Aquino to the presidency

President Benigno Aquino III said Friday that the struggle for good governance and the fight against the corruption that characterized the brutal regime of Ferdinand Marcos continues 25 years after the late dictator's ouster in the "People Power" revolution.In a speech to mark the four-day revolt in 1986 that restored democracy and ended Marcos' 20-year regime, Aguino recalled that Marcos ruled with an iron fist as he enriched his family and associates amid the nation's poverty.

Marcos died in exile in Hawaii three years after his ouster. Poverty, corruption and insurgency are still major problems in the Philippines.

Aquino said the revolt raised hopes that democracy would also bring prosperity and a government that would safeguard the people's money, but said that did not happen in the decade under his predecessor. Gloria Macapagal Arroyo.

"There were some who betrayed the public trust and

raided government coffers," he said. "With good governance to fight corruption, we can free our people from poverty."

Arroyo held power for nine years, surviving several coup attempts by disgruntled military officers and impeachment bids by the opposition, who accused her of corruption, election fraud and human rights abuses. She has denied the charges.

Aquino is the son of the country's two democracy icons. His mother. Corazon Aquino. claimed victory against Marcos in the fraud-marred elections two weeks before the revolt, and was installed as his successor. His father and Marcos' archrival, former Senator Benigno "Ninoy" Aquino, was assassinated by soldiers in 1983.

Aquino has resumed peace talks with communist insurgents and Muslim separatist rebels to end more than four decades of armed conflict that has also stunted the country's

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

AN ACT RELATIVE TO POLICYMAKERS PARTICIPATING IN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM HEALTHCARE INSURANCE NEGOTIATING TEAM, BY AMENDING §4302(c) OF ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 4, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 that the recent passage of P.L. 30-227, known as the "Healthcare Insurance 3 Transparency Act of 2010", was for the purpose of ensuring that the processes 4 pursuant to which the government of Guam acquires health insurance coverage for 5 its active employees and retirees are negotiated in a manner so as to ultimately 6 reflect the most economical and beneficial health plan possible. I Liheslaturan 7 Guahan further finds that although funding for the government of Guam's annual 8 contribution to the health care insurance plan is dependant upon an appropriation 9 to be included in the upcoming Fiscal Year Budget act, the negotiation process is 10

completed prior to the budget process without Legislative input or knowledge. The annual task of negotiating the upcoming fiscal year's healthcare insurance plan is conducted and completed without appropriate input and feedback from policy makers responsible for appropriating the available funds of the people of Guam.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to include at least two key members of the Guam Legislature in the Government of Guam's Health Insurance Negotiating Team. The Chairpersons of both the Committee on Health and the Committee on Appropriations will be integral members in ensuring any health plan the government of Guam procures for its employees and retirees is the most beneficial, while also being fiscally achievable and realistically reflective of budgetary constraints. It is further, the intent of *I Liheslatura Guahan* to seek to ensure that by the inclusion of two of its members who chair the Health and Appropriations Committees in the Negotiating Team, it will better ensure the government of Guam does not repeat the unconscionable and callous actions of entering into a health insurance plan that is unanticipated and unaffordable by the taxpayers of Guam.

Section 2: Inclusion of Policymakers in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team. Subsection (c) of §4302 of Article 3, Chapter 4, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

"(c) A Negotiating Team consisting of the Director of Administration, who shall be Chairperson; the Administrator of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities ('DISISD'), or his or her designee; the Director of Bureau of Budget and Management Research, or his or her designee; an employee representative from the Judicial Branch to be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam; the Chairperson of the Committee on Health of I Liheslaturan Guahan, or his or her designee; the Chairperson of the

Committee on Appropriations of I Liheslaturan Guahan, or his or her designee; 1 an employee representative of the Legislative Branch to be appointed by the 2 Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guahan; the Superintendent of the Department of 3 Education, or his or her designee; the Director of the Government of Guam 4 Retirement Fund, or his or her designee; a retiree who is a member of the 5 Government of Guam Retirement Fund to be appointed by the Board of Trustees of 6 the Government of Guam Retirement Fund; and one (1) member of the general 7 public, appointed by I Maga'lahen Guahan, shall examine the financial 8 information of the prepaid health insurance companies, health care providers or 9 other legal entities for the purpose of developing the most economical and 10 beneficial health plan for the Government of Guam employees and retirees. The 11 Negotiating Team may obtain technical support from other financial and health-12 related agencies. The Negotiating Team shall develop its rules of procedure in 13 accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. The Negotiating Team with 14 the approval of I Maga'lahi is authorized to contract an actuary competent to 15 develop proposed health insurance rates or other recognized expert to train and/or 16 advise the Negotiating Team." 17

Section 3. Clarification of Applicability of Amendment pursuant to Section 2 of this Act. The amendment provided pursuant to Section 2 of this Act shall only apply to the first paragraph of Subsection (c), and shall not affect or change the existing accompanying Parts 1, 2, and 3 of Subsection (c) of §4302 of Article 3, Chapter 4, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, which shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

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Section 4. Effective Date. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the provisions of this Act shall be effective upon enactment.
