BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the duties of the Guam Public Utilities Commission (PUC) have increased substantially over the last few years. In addition to the core utilities under the regulatory supervision of the PUC (Guam Power Authority, Guam Waterworks 1 Authority, Telecommunications Companies, and the Municipal Golf Course), PUC

2 jurisdiction has been further extended to the Port Authority of Guam and the Solid

3 Waste Division of the Department of Public Works. The PUC Commissioners are

responsible for rate setting in highly complex and varied settings. In 2012 alone,

The number of meetings which the Commissioners are required to attend, and the amount of reading and preparation involved, have also increased substantially. Previously, the Commission had met on a quarterly basis; however, meetings are now required at least once a month, and often twice a month. In addition, Commissioners attend public hearings and workshops on a regular and ongoing basis. They have the difficult duty to determine whether the residents of Guam should be required to pay for just and reasonable utility rate increases.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan takes due note that the request to introduce legislation to address the issue and need for a stipend comes from the Commissioners of the PUC.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that there have only been five (5) Commissioners on the PUC for many years, even though the statute provides for a seven (7) member Commission. The Commission has had difficulties in meeting the quorum requirements to conduct its meetings. It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to authorize the compensation of Commissioners for the services that they perform, and to encourage the residents of Guam to accept and undertake service as PUC Commissioners.

Section 2. A new Subsection (k) is hereby *added* to §12001 [*Public Utilities Commission: Number, Appointment of Commissioners*] of Article 1, Chapter 12, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(k) Commissioners *shall* be compensated at the rate of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per month. Such compensation *shall* be apportioned by the PUC in a fair and equitable manner among the utilities and entities regulated by the PUC. Commissioners *shall not* be eligible for government of Guam retirement or insurance benefits, or other benefits associated with government of Guam employment."

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

Section 4. Effective Date. This provisions of this Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 492-31 (COR) was introduced by Senator D.G. Rodriguez, Jr. and Senator V. Anthony Ada on July 27, 2012, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works and Veterans Affairs on July 30, 2012.

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works and Veterans Affairs convened a Public Hearing that included the subject matter of Bill 492-31 (COR) on Sept. 19, 2012 at 2:00 p.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on the measure.

Public Notice Requirements

In accordance with the Open Government Law, notices were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media outlets on Wednesday, Sept. 12, 2012 (5-Day Notice), and again on Monday, Sept. 17, 2012 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were also issued to various public and private entities.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Mr. Fred Horecky

Provided oral and written testimony

Mr. Fred Horecky, Legal Counsel of the Guam Public Utilities Commission, spoke on behalf of the PUC and in favor of the legislation. He notes that he is joined by Lourdes Palomo, Administrator of the PUC. He began by explaining that the amount of compensation is justifiable given the increased workload of the PUC over the past few years. He noted that for most of its history, the PUC regulated primarily GPA and GWA. However, in 2004 to 2005, responsibility for telecommunications companies was also placed upon the PUC, as were surcharge decisions related to the E911 system. Additionally, over the past three years, the Port Authority of Guam and Guam Solid Waste Authority have also been placed under the jurisdiction of the PUC. Each of these

agencies have separate regulations, rate-designs, and community concerns to balance. While outside consultants and experts are utilized, it is still incumbent on the Commission to review and act upon their findings. In order to properly conduct their roles, Commissioners spend a large amount of time reading and reviewing materials prior to meetings. These meetings, which once occurred on a quarterly basis, now take place at least once or twice a month, which each meeting lasting approximately 2-3 hours. Commissioners also devote time toward attending public hearings and trainings related to actions being reviewed by the PUC. Lastly, Mr. Horecky notes that the proposed compensation amounts for \$84,000 per year, and will be borne proportionately by the regulated utilities and telecommunications companies (and not be drawn from the General Fund). He believes that this proportioned amount will not be an increase significant enough to warrant a rate increase on customers.

Question & Answer

Chairman Tom Ada: Prior to hearing testimony, the Chairman yielded the floor to Senator Rodriguez for an overview of the bill.

Senator Rodriguez: The Senator states that of all the boards and commissions on Guam, the PUC is the most complicated and most directly impacts lives on Guam. Positions on the Commission are not cushy, and require significant dedication and hard work. The PUC has sole authority over evaluating and approving rates for important entities that affect the entirety of Guam. Senator Rodriguez also notes that, by legislative design, there are trained and skilled individuals on the Commission, and that these people should be compensated. Even at the proposed amount in this legislation, the Senator notes that the Commissioners are still making less money, per hour, than they would make if they were pursuing their personal careers during that same time. He feels this is a reasonable incentive to stimulate participation in the Commission, particularly given the caliber of individuals needed to serve on the PUC.

Following testimony provided by Mr. Fred Horecky, Chairman Tom Ada opened the floor to Questions and Answers with the Senators present.

Senator Respicio: Thanks Mr. Horecky for his testimony, and expresses his appreciation for the work done by the PUC. He notes that the CCU Commissioners currently receive \$1000 per month, and that the PUC does just as much work. His one concern is for the potential of the increased stipends to be used to justify a rate increase upon consumers. He asks whether the \$84,000 needed annually to implement this legislation can be drawn from the existing PUC budget, or whether new fees will be assessed by the agencies under its jurisdiction.

Mr. Horecky: Answers that the proposed increase can be recovered from the existing budgets of the entities under the PUC's jurisdiction. He notes that, generally, each entity pays \$50-75k to the PUC for administrative purposes, and that the PUC's annual budget

is around \$300k. The \$14k increase for each, though not insignificant, is nevertheless not large enough to necessitate a rate increase on consumers.

Senator Duenas: States that he recognizes the caliber of the PUC members and the hard work they all put in. He also states that the entities under the PUC's jurisdiction should have enough flexibility within their annual budgets to be able to cover this additional cost without needing to raise rates on customers.

Senator Palacios: Asked if the current members of the PUC receive any stipend, and whether this proposed legislation would be in addition to an existing stipend.

Mr. Horecky: Stated that yes, PUC members currently receive \$50 per meeting, but that this legislation would replace that amount. The Commissioners will not receive the \$50 per meeting once this law is in effect.

Senator Rodriguez: Thanks Mr. Horecky for explaining that this stipend will not significantly impact the operating costs of the utilities, and that the small amount constituting the stipend should be viewed as a cost of doing business well. He also states that he is pleased that rates wont increase.

Chairman Tom Ada: Senator Ada asks Mr. Horecky to outline the total administrative costs charged to the entities under the jurisdiction under the PUC, inclusive of the costs associated with hiring independent third parties to review budget requests and rateredesigns (a cost borne by the utilities). Senator Ada also notes that he agrees that more work have been placed on the PUC over the years; he asks whether the PUC has explored potentially removing certain required tasks from its enabling act, such as the requirement for the PUC to review GPA's staffing levels annually regardless of whether there are any new hires that year.

Fred Horecky: Answers that the Commission does review its mandates on an ongoing basis. In regards to the annual GPA staffing pattern review, Mr. Horecky notes that the Commission does not necessarily conduct a new audit every year; rather, if significant staffing changes haven't occurred, the PUC will look to the most recently conducted audit and issue a statement that the document still holds true for the most recent fiscal year. Mr. Horecky further explains that there are two different types of expenses incurred by the PUC: regulatory and administrative. Administrative expenses are related to the operations of the PUC, and are the type of expense that will be increased as part of Bill 492. Regulatory expenses are considered separate, and are billed services that are incurred by the utility as part of budget requests, rate-redesigns, and the like. He agrees with Senator Tom Ada that this amount is much more significant than the administrative fee, but are directly related to the tasks and projects called for by utilities. He also notes that the amount of the increase proposed by this legislation is far less than the total regulatory and administrative fees incurred by the utilities annually.

Chairman Tom Ada: Thanks Mr. Horecky and adjourned the Public Hearing at 3:05 p.m.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs finds that the Public Utilities Commission provides a crucial role in protecting consumers on Guam. Commissioners on the PUC devote a significant amount of time and effort toward properly overseeing the rates of the Utilities, Port Authority of Guam, and telecommunications companies.

The Committee also finds that, while the work of the PUC merits an increase in compensation, a more equitable amount is Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per meeting, not to exceed Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900) per month, instead of the initially proposed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) per month. This change has been reflected in Section 2 (found on page 2) of Bill 492.

As such, the Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs hereby reports out SBill No. 492-31 (COR), as Substituted by the Committee, with the recommendation to report out.

It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to authorize the compensation of Commissioners for the services that they perform, and to encourage the citizens of Guam to accept and undertake service as PUC Commissioners.

Section 2. A new subsection (k) is hereby added to §12001 [*Public Utilities Commission: Number, Appointment of Commissioners*] of Article 1, Chapter 12, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(k) Commissioners shall be compensated at the rate of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per meeting for their services, but not to exceed Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900) per month. Such compensation shall be apportioned by the PUC in a fair and equitable manner among the utilities and entities regulated by the PUC. Commissioners shall not be eligible for government of Guam retirement or

insurance benefits, or other benefits associated with government of Guam employment."

Section 3. **Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become immediately effective upon enactment.

An Act Relative to Providing Compensation to the Commissioners of the Guam Public Utilities Commission WRITTEN TESTIMONY OF FREDERICK J. HORECKY, LEGAL COUNSEL, ON BEHALF OF THE GUAM PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

The Guam Public Utilities Commission [PUC] appreciates the efforts of Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr. and Senator Tony Ada in introducing this Bill. The PUC fully supports the Bill. The Bill provides just compensation for the Commissioners of the PUC.

Compensation for the Commissioners of the PUC is justified by the substantial increase in the workload of the Commission over the past few years. For most of its history, the PUC only regulated a few "core" utilities, the Guam Power Authority and the Guam Waterworks Authority. There would be an infrequent case involving the municipal golf course. During 2004 to 2005, responsibility for regulation of telecommunications companies was placed upon the Commissioners of the PUC. PUC also sets a surcharge for the E911 system and insures that each telecommunications company pays the appropriate surcharge based upon its number of lines/accounts.

Just within the last three years, PUC jurisdiction and regulatory responsibility has been extended to the Port Authority of Guam and the Guam Solid Waste Authority.

The Port and GSWA present the PUC with entirely new issues and subject material

completely unrelated to the utilities previously regulated by the PUC. Not only has the number of regulated entities greatly increased, the dockets filed by each utility and the scope of issues has increased many-fold. It is not uncommon that, in meetings of the PUC, the Commissioners are required to address diverse issues involving four or five different utilities or companies.

A heavy burden is placed upon the Commissioners. They must continually address complex issues affecting the wellbeing of the people of Guam, such as whether water or power rates must be increased. They are the ultimate decision makers in disputes and arbitrations between telecommunications companies. They have increasingly addressed issues concerning sales of telecommunications companies and reorganizations. For regulated utilities, Commissioners must review and approve utility contracts in excess of one million dollars under the "contract review" power. Under the present PUC structure, there are consultants and advisors that provide the Commissioners with opinions on matters before them; however, ultimate responsibility for understanding, addressing and deciding utility issues rests squarely on the Commissioners' shoulders.

The Commissioners perform what is akin to a quasi-judicial function. In arbitrations and contested proceedings, they make final decisions. As indicated above, the issues involving each of the varied utilities are completely different; they involve different subject matters, requirements and understanding of the decision making parameters. Prior to each monthly meeting, the Commissioners are required to

undertake a significant amount of reading to understand complex matters, particularly in rate cases. The number of rate cases and the complexity thereof are increasing all the time. During this year alone, the Commission has addressed rate cases for the Port Authority of Guam and the Guam Power Authority. It is currently addressing an annual rate "true-up" for GWA on its five-year rate plan and a rate increase proposal by the Guam Solid Waste Authority. I have attached copies of Agendas from recent meetings to give you an understanding of the breadth and scope of issues before the Commissioners.

Previously the Commission met on a quarterly basis; now it meets at least once a month and sometimes twice a month. The PUC meetings normally extend from approximately two to three hours. The Commissioners also attend numerous public hearings conducted before the PUC on rate and other matters. Committee meetings and occasional workshops are also required. Given the expansion of PUC activities, it can only be assumed that the commitments and obligations of Commissioners will continue to greatly increase in the next few years. Our Commissioners deserve compensation for the dedicated work that they perform and will continue to perform in the future.

The PUC is an independent body. It is non-political. While its members are appointed by the Governor, Commissioners do not submit courtesy resignations upon the election of a new Governor. Commissioners serve from one administration to

another. In addition, unlike executive branch entities, compensation for PUC Commissioners would be paid by the regulated utilities themselves.

Compensation for PUC Commissioners is not paid from the General Fund. It is fully appropriate that the regulated utilities pay the full cost of regulation, including compensation for Commissioners. If the legislature approves PUC Commissioner compensation, the cost of such compensation will be apportioned among all of the utilities. At \$1,000.00 per Commissioner per month, the total Commissioner compensation required (even assuming a full complement of seven Commissioners, which has not been in place for many years) would be \$84,000.00 per year. In terms of the overall cost of utility regulation, this is a small sum.

Since the cost would be apportioned among the regulated utilities and telecommunications companies, there is no likelihood that such compensation would cause any rate increase. Commissioners of other boards, as well as boards of the government of Guam, are compensated. Clearly, under appropriate circumstances, Commissioners may be authorized to receive compensation. The appropriateness of Commissioner compensation should be judged upon the merits of each specific situation.

The regulated utilities should be required to bear the expense of Commissioner compensation. We urge the Legislature to authorize the Public Utilities Commission to assess amounts for Commissioner compensation to the regulated utilities. The authorization for such compensation for Commissioners will encourage the citizens of

Guam to accept and undertake service as PUC Commissioners. The issue is not what amounts other boards or commissions receive as compensation. In the context of utilities regulation, utilities should have to bear the full cost of regulation, which includes the valuable services provided by Commissioners. Since Commissioners perform and undertake many services that are for the direct benefit of the regulated entities, such entities should be required to bear the expense for compensation to Commissioners for their services.

The PUC respectfully requests the Legislature approve Bill No. 492-31 (COR), An Act Relative to Providing Compensation to the Commissioners of the Guam Public Utilities Commission. Thank you for your consideration of this important issue.

Previously you and I had discussed the possibility of legislation providing compensation to PUC Commissioners for their service. As Counsel to the Commission, I hereby submit draft legislation which would provide compensation to the Commissioners of the Guam Public Utilities Commission. In my opinion, such compensation is justified for a number of different reasons.

The workload of the Commission has grown substantially over the last few years. Now, in addition to the core utilities (Guam Power Authority and Guam Waterworks Authority, the municipal golf course, and the telecom companies), PUC jurisdiction has been extended to the Port Authority of Guam and the Solid Waste Division of the Department of Public Works. Commissioners are responsible for rate setting in highly complex and varied settings.

Commissioners are required to undertake a significant amount of reading to understand these complex rate setting matters. Prior to PUC meetings, Commissioners are presented with lengthy briefing materials. They are required to read such materials in order to adequately respond to pressing issues, such as the system development charge, decisions on rate increases, and other technical matters frequently considered by the Commission. Over the past three years, the PUC has handled numerous major rate

proceedings for PAG, GWA, GPA) and implementation of the system development charge. The rate proceedings involve Commissioner attendance at public hearings.

On an ongoing basis, the Commissioners address complex and contested proceedings concerning the telecommunications companies.

PUC meetings and public hearings occur during the evening hours and require the Commissioners to be away from their families for long periods of time. In addition, there have been numerous meetings with the regulated entities and workshops. Previously, the Commission met on a quarterly basis; now it meets at least once a month, and sometimes twice a month. Public hearings and workshops are additional attendance obligations which occur on regular and ongoing bases.

I believe the PUC commitments of the Commissioners will only increase in the next few years. At present there are pending rate proceedings involving PAG, GPA, GWA, and the Solid Waste Division. It is difficult and stressful for the Commissioners to have to decide such matters.

At present the PUC only has five Commissioners, although the statute provides for seven Commissioners. Compensation could provide an additional incentive for persons to serve on the Commission.

Finally, there is precedent for such compensation. See 12 GCA §79106, wherein compensation is provided to the Commissioners of the Consolidated Commission on Utilities. Such compensation will not come from the General Fund, but would be apportioned among the regulated utilities and entities. The PUC Commissioners hope that you will be willing to sponsor this draft bill. We would be glad to work with you further in that regard. Thank you for your consideration, and please let me know if you have any further questions.

If you like, the Chairman and I would be glad to meet with you on this matter.

If the Bill becomes Public Law, the PUC will consider this increase for stipends under its annual operating budget whose funds are generated through an equitable assessment from its regulated entities. Finally note that PUC funding is accounted for separately from the Government of Guam and is not subject to Legislative enpropriation.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent: I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the duties of the Guam Public Utilities Commission have increased substantially over the last few years. In addition to the core utilities under the regulatory supervision of the PUC (Guam Power Authority, Guam Waterworks Authority, Telecommunications Companies, and the Municipal Golf Course), PUC jurisdiction has been further extended to the Port Authority of Guam and the Solid Waste Division of the Department of Public Works. The PUC Commissioners are responsible for rate setting in highly complex and varied settings. In 2012 alone, the Commissioners have already addressed rate proceedings involving the Port Authority, and proceedings are underway for the Guam Power Authority and the Guam Waterworks Authority.

The number of meetings which the Commissioners are required to attend, and the amount of reading and preparation involved, have also increased substantially. Previously the Commission met on a quarterly basis; however meetings are now required at least once a month and often twice a month. In addition, Commissioners attend public hearings and workshops on a regular and ongoing basis. They have the difficult duty to determine whether the citizens of Guam should be required to pay for just and reasonable utility rate increases.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan takes due note that the request to introduce legislation to address the issue and need for a stipend comes from the Commissioners of the PUC.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that there have only been five Commissioners on the PUC for many years, even though the statute provides for a seven member Commission. The Commission has had difficulties in meeting the quorum requirements to conduct its meetings. It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to authorize the compensation of Commissioners for the services that they perform, and to encourage the citizens of Guam to accept and undertake service as PUC Commissioners.

Section 2. A new subsection (k) is hereby added to §12001 [*Public Utilities Commission: Number, Appointment of Commissioners*] of Article 1, Chapter 12, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(k) Commissioners shall be compensated at the rate of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month for their services. Such compensation shall be apportioned by the PUC in a fair and equitable manner among the utilities and entities regulated by the PUC. Commissioners shall not be eligible for government of Guam retirement or insurance benefits, or other benefits associated with government of Guam employment."

Section 3. **Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become immediately effective upon enactment.

Previously you and I had discussed the possibility of legislation providing compensation to PUC Commissioners for their service. As Counsel to the Commission, I hereby submit draft legislation which would provide compensation to the Commissioners of the Guam Public Utilities Commission. In my opinion, such compensation is justified for a number of different reasons.

The workload of the Commission has grown substantially over the last few years. Now, in addition to the core utilities (Guam Power Authority and Guam Waterworks Authority, the municipal golf course, and the telecom companies), PUC jurisdiction has been extended to the Port Authority of Guam and the Solid Waste Division of the Department of Public Works. Commissioners are responsible for rate setting in highly complex and varied settings.

Commissioners are required to undertake a significant amount of reading to understand these complex rate setting matters. Prior to PUC meetings, Commissioners are presented with lengthy briefing materials. They are required to read such materials in order to adequately respond to pressing issues, such as the system development charge, decisions on rate increases, and other technical matters frequently considered by the Commission. Over the past three years, the PUC has handled numerous major rate

proceedings for PAG, GWA, GPA) and implementation of the system development charge. The rate proceedings involve Commissioner attendance at public hearings.

On an ongoing basis, the Commissioners address complex and contested proceedings concerning the telecommunications companies.

PUC meetings and public hearings occur during the evening hours and require the Commissioners to be away from their families for long periods of time. In addition, there have been numerous meetings with the regulated entities and workshops. Previously, the Commission met on a quarterly basis; now it meets at least once a month, and sometimes twice a month. Public hearings and workshops are additional attendance obligations which occur on regular and ongoing bases.

I believe the PUC commitments of the Commissioners will only increase in the next few years. At present there are pending rate proceedings involving PAG, GPA, GWA, and the Solid Waste Division. It is difficult and stressful for the Commissioners to have to decide such matters.

At present the PUC only has five Commissioners, although the statute provides for seven Commissioners. Compensation could provide an additional incentive for persons to serve on the Commission.

Finally, there is precedent for such compensation. See 12 GCA §79106, wherein compensation is provided to the Commissioners of the Consolidated Commission on Utilities. Such compensation will not come from the General Fund, but would be apportioned among the regulated utilities and entities. The PUC Commissioners hope that you will be willing to sponsor this draft bill. We would be glad to work with you further in that regard. Thank you for your consideration, and please let me know if you have any further questions.

If you like, the Chairman and I would be glad to meet with you on this matter.
