BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that electronic voting machines have been prohibited from further usage in
- 4 Guam because of problems created in past elections. While most early electronic
- 5 voting devices were problematic, the role of similar devices in future elections

should *not* be ignored, as Guam and the nation continue efforts to increase electoral integrity.

I Liheslatura finds that devices in which votes are entered, and which then print a voter's completed ballot, have been praised for increasing the accuracy of elections. Voters enter their votes into these machines, and a Voter Verified Paper Ballot (VVPB) is printed, which the voter then verifies. Correct ballots are then placed into the ballot box. The VVPBs can then be processed, votes can be counted, and can be audited and stored as if hand-marked paper ballots were used.

If the voter makes an error, the VVPB becomes a spoiled ballot. The voter will then repeat the process until the voter's intent is printed. The VVPB can help to ensure that the basic democratic principle of counting all eligible votes is achieved. This process also eliminates stray marks and light marks that often lead to under-counting votes. This process can also assist disabled voters, allowing them to mark their ballots privately and independently, complying with the Help America Vote Act (HAVA).

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslatura* to *repeal* and *reenact* §7103.1 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, to authorize the use in Guam elections of electronic voting machines that produce VVPBs that can be counted by optical scanners, and also by hand.

Section 2. §7103.1 of Chapter 7 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is *repealed* and *reenacted* to read:

"§7103.1. Electronic Voting Machines and Voter Verified Paper Ballots (VVPB).

Electronic voting machines, on which voters *shall* enter their vote, and from which Voter Verified Paper Ballots (VVPB) *shall* be printed for

1	verification of accuracy by voters before casting, shall be permitted for use
2	in Guam elections, provided:
3	(a) that the VVPB voting machines used in Guam elections
4	are warranted to be accurate by the manufacturer;
5	(b) that precinct officials have been properly trained in the
6	operation, basic maintenance and replacement of supplies in VVPB
7	voting machines;

9	procedures, which shall be established, to inform voters about the

The voter shall verify that the vote printed is as intended, and the verified vote shall be placed in a ballot box. The VVPB is intended to reduce problems in the voting process, and to provide a means to audit election results."

Dear Senator Rodriguez:

Hafa adai. Thank you for hearing Bill No. 128-31(LS). Please allow this to serve as my sponsor statement on the bill; and I respectfully request that you enclose this statement with your committee report, as a part of the record on Bill No. 128-31 (LS) - "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT GUAM CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 3: ELECTIONS § 7103.1, RELATIVE TO 'ELECTRONIC VOTING MACHINES' AND 'VOTER VERIFIED PAPER BALLOTS' (VVPB), AND TO DEFINE A 'VOTER VERIFIED PAPER BALLOT."

The people of Guam suffered an unfortunate experience with electronic voting machines in the 2006 elections, and the use of such devices was outlawed by Public Law 29-33. I was the author of that law, and I hope to be the author of the law that reinstates voting machines in Guam's elections. Public Law 29-33 stopped the use of electronic machines until they provide "a paper printout from which a voter may verify his ballot's accuracy, and which the Commission can utilize in auditing and recounting votes."

Bill No. 128-31 (LS) seeks to do just that. It requires the use of a "voter verified paper ballot," or "VVPB." Under this voting system, the voter enters his or her vote into the voting machine, which then prints the completed ballot, marked according to the voter's intent. The voter can verify the accuracy of the ballot before placing it in the ballot box. Unlike electronic voting, the GEC will have a paper ballot that can be audited or recounted if necessary. An additional benefit of the VVPB is that it will eliminate stray marks, marks outside the lines, gray marks, over-votes, and also crossover votes during primary elections.

Bill 128-31, the fourth bill I have introduced relative to our election processes, sets guidelines for the GEC to implement the VVPB machines, including proper training for election workers, and having service technicians on-site during elections. The proper and accurate counting of all valid votes must be our goal, and I believe the VVPB will be a great benefit to improve the process.

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT GUAM CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 3: ELECTIONS § 7103.1, RELATIVE TO "ELECTRONIC VOTING MACHINES" AND "VOTER VERIFIED PAPER BALLOTS (VVPB), AND TO DEFINE A "VOTER VERIFIED PAPER BALLOT."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that electronic voting machines have been prohibited from further usage in Guam because of problems created in past elections. While most early electronic voting devices were problematic, the role of similar devices in future elections should not be ignored, as Guam and the nation continue efforts to increase electoral integrity.

I Liheslatura finds that devices in which votes are entered and which then print a voter's completed ballot, have been praised for increasing the accuracy of elections. Voters enter their votes into these machines, and a "voter-verified paper ballot" (VVPB) is printed, which the voter then verifies. Correct ballots are then placed into the ballot

1	box. The VVPBs can then be processed, votes can be counted, and can
2	be audited and stored as if hand-marked paper ballots were used.

If the voter makes an error, the VVPB becomes a spoiled ballot. The voter will then repeat the process until the voter's intent is printed. The VVPB can help to ensure that the basic democratic principle of counting all eligible votes is achieved. This process also eliminates stray marks and light marks that often lead to under-counting votes. This process can also assist disabled voters, allowing them to mark their ballots privately and independently, complying with the Help America Vote Act (HAVA).

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslatura* to *repeal* Title 3 GCA § 7103.1, "Electronic Voting Machines," and to *reenact* a *new* § 7103.1, to authorize the use in Guam elections of electronic voting machines that produce VVPBs that can be counted by optical scanners, and also by hand.

Section 2. Title 3 Guam Code Annotated § 7103.1 is repealed and reenacted to read:

"§ 7103.1. Electronic Voting Machines and Voter Verified Paper Ballots (VVPB).

Electronic voting machines, on which voters shall enter their

1	vote, and from which Voter Verified Paper Ballots (VVPB) shall be
2	printed for verification of accuracy by voters before casting, shall
3	be permitted for use in Guam elections, provided:
4	(a) The VVPB voting machines used in Guam elections
5	are warranted to be accurate by the manufacturer; and
6	(b) Polling place personnel have been properly trained
7	in the operation, basic maintenance and replacement of
8	supplies in VVPB voting machines; and
9	(c) Polling place personnel have been properly trained
10	in procedures, which shall be established, to inform voters
11	about the proper use of the VVPB machines; voter
12	verification that their ballot has being printed correctly
13	based on each voter's choices; the handling of spoiled ballots
14	associated with the machines; and the placing of correctly
15	printed ballots in ballot boxes; and
16	(d) Each VVPB machine shall not be networked to the
17	Internet or to any other voting machine or computer through
18	either wired or wireless connections; and
19	(e) Ballot tallies from individual VVPB machines shall
20	be recorded by hand, entered into a log, and either included

with the ballots in the ballot boxes to be delivered to a vote
tabulation center; or if tabulated on site, shall be included
with the counted ballots when delivered to storage; and

(f) The on-site services of a manufacturer-authorized technician or technicians *shall* be available in Guam prior to and during each election, and until the polls have officially closed, to ensure the proper set-up and operation of the VVPB machines."

Section 3. A *new* § 1120. Definitions: Voter Verified Paper Ballot (VVPB) is *added* to Title 3 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 1, General Provisions to read:

"§ 1120. Definitions: Voter Verified Paper Ballot (VVPB).

A voter verified paper ballot is a ballot printed on paper by a voting process in which a voter enters their voting choices into a computer and the voter's ballot is printed in a format which is readable by the human eye. The voter *shall* verify the vote printed is as intended and the verified vote *shall* be placed in a ballot box. The VVPB is intended to reduce problems in the voting process, and to provide a means to audit election results."
