AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE I MAGA'LAHEN GUÅHAN TO TRANSFER ABANDONED STAFF HOUSING PROPERTIES HELD BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO THE ATURIDAT GIMINA' YAN RENUEBAN SUIDAT GUAHAN (GUAM HOUSING AND URBAN RENEWAL AUTHORITY) FOR THE PURPOSE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that several
- 3 dwellings throughout the island, commonly referred to as "DOE Staff Housing,"
- 4 are no longer in use and in severe disrepair. Absent a significant rehabilitation

effort, these abandoned structures pose a danger to the people of Guam and clearly contradict the intent of existing law.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that it has clearly outlined a policy in favor of the elimination of slum and blight, and increasing the inventory of affordable housing. Specifically, §5101 of Chapter 5, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, states in part, "these slum and blight conditions, and the continuing shortage of decent housing for low-income families present problems of immediate and long-range governmental concern."

I Liheslatura further finds that Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan is the agency best suited to rehabilitate these housing units to augment Guam's growing need for affordable housing. While a leveraging of various federal resources may fund, in whole or in part, the rehabilitation of these abandoned housing units, I Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes that these properties must first be transferred to Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan in order for several of the properties to be surveyed and rehabilitated with Aturidat funds.

Section 2. Transfer of Abandoned Staff Housing. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, I Maga'lahen Guåhan is hereby authorized to transfer the government of Guam properties described below to Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan for use as affordable housing, temporary emergency shelters, or to house nongovernmental organizations duly registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation as a nonprofit organization. The Board of Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan shall re-parcel the lots described below to contain only those areas on which staff housing is currently erected. All other lands resulting from the re-parceling authorized under this Section shall be retained by the government of Guam:

(a) Agat Staff Housing, containing an area of 6.4 acres, as shown on Map C4-64T429, municipality of Agat, the metes and bounds and legal

description thereof to be determined by a survey to be obtained by *Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan* upon transfer;

- (b) *Talofofo* Staff Housing, as shown on Map D4-70T228, municipality of *Talofofo*, the metes and bounds to be determined by a survey to be obtained by the *Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan* upon transfer;
- (c) *Dededo* Staff Housing, Lot 10114-NEW-3, municipality of *Dededo*, containing an area of 20,061+/- square meters, or 215,925+/- square feet, or 4.96 acres, as shown on L.M. Check No. 002FY95, Land Management Drawing Number 12-94T576, recorded under instrument 520470;
- (d) Yigo Staff Housing, located within the basic Lot No. 7116-R6, municipality of Yigo, the metes and bounds and legal description to be determined by a survey to be obtained by Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan upon transfer; and
- (e) *Merizo* Staff Housing, containing an area of 1.9 acres, as shown on Map C4-64T459, municipality of *Merizo*, also shown and identified as the Staff Housing Area within the *Pigua* Subdivision, Tract 261, Increment 1, as shown on L.M. Check 199FY77, Land Management No. 14T77T041, the metes and bounds and legal description to be determined by a survey to be obtained by *Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan* upon transfer.

1. Mayor Vicente Taitague, Talafofo

Mayor Taitague: (Read written testimony). Hopefully we can make changes to the bill to reflect my preferences.

Panel Comments and Questions

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you very much Mr. Mayor, si yu'os ma'ase.

2. Mr. Martin Benavente, GHC

Mr. Benavente: First of all I would like to say that I have submitted what the houses look like today. Some corrections, before we start, I don't think the numbers are the same before. 5 units in Yigo, one occupied for one abandoned. In Dededo, there are only 9 left over as GHURA, though different programs demolished and rehabilitated some and turned them into other programs. So, there are only 9 remaining there and non-profit groups and individuals occupy some. In Agat, I counted 13 because there is a fire station and a police department there now and some may have been removed. The Mayor said there should be 6 in Talafofo and I don't know the count for Merizo so I won't try to attempt to correct that. We should be mindful of that.

(Read written testimony)

Panel Comments and Questions

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you and si yu'os ma'se.

3. Mr. Marcel Camacho, GHURA

Mr. Camacho: I want to thank you Mr. Chairman for brining this measure to the floor, I want to thank the honorable Senator Tina Rose Muna-Barnes and Vice Speaker BJ F. Cruz for their sponsorship of this bill.

(Read written testimony)

I just might add by listening to the testimony by the good Mayor of Talafofo and by my good college here from Guam Housing Corporation (GHC), who works with me very closely on tackling the affordable housing situation on Guam. Regardless of how the disposition ends up,

GHURA would like to help to provide affordable housing for the community, whether it be to hand it over to Chamorro Land Trust or to GHC ultimately, we would support that in our efforts if that is in our mandates. Thank you Senators.

Panel Comments and Questions

Senator Palacios: Just one point, Mayor Taitague, when you say Chamorro Land Trust, as it says in the bill GHURA, I want to make it clear that they are two different ones. I just want to make that clear.

Mayor Taitague: Yes, I am aware, that is just my preference.

Senator V. Ada: I was at a function last night and one of the Mayors came up to me regarding this bill and they were asking why we don't transfer this over to the Mayors? There was an incident where a fire overcame a home and they became homeless. The first person they called to help find them a home was the Mayor. Some where they would be able to provide short term housing for these families before they get into GHURA or find housing or to rebuild their current home. Mayor Tatiague, what are your thoughts on that?

Mayor Taitague: As far as Talafofo housing, there are 6 housing, I cannot go there and renovate those homes, I don't have the funds. You give me the funds and I have no problem renovating those homes. I just have no money to do those things. That's why I prefer to give to Chamorro Land Trust and have them lease it out to the individual recipients so they can improve the area. Instead of the government improving the area.

Senator V. Ada: So, if an amendment was made to this bill to, not all of it but let's just say 6 homes, 6 homes would be turned over to the Mayors council would GHURA be able to assist the Mayors council in renovating these homes to be able to be used as emergency homes for these families?

Mr. Benavente: Currently we have emergency housing coming out of GHURA and GHC. The disadvantage is that they don't have the funding or capabilities to maintain these buildings. I have a fire victim family that lives right now in LADA, before that we housed them in a local hotel, it's cheaper to put them in an existing unit that has furniture, stove, refrigerator, and power. Those are the practical things. If you put them there, you will have the problem of who will furnish it, who will maintain the power and the water, it's a problem for the Mayors because I know what it used to be like. It's hard to say no when you are an elected political official. We have to be careful how we do that. If you want to support the housing for emergency housing, support the housing agencies because we are able to bill, collect, and maintain the units. We have maintenance groups in both our offices. Whenever he (GHURA) doesn't have vacancies he would call me and when I don't have vacancies to assist the flooding and fire victims I will call him. It's been working for many years.

I pity the Mayor who has one house two people who need it. Even with us, how can we leave a house vacant all this time waiting for someone to have an emergency? It's not practical. If it is within our existing inventory, we can stick them in there and upgrade them later when something

better comes available. I'm recommending we leave it the way it is. We are assisting Mayors when they come with their requirement. We just assisted the Santos family from Barrigada, we do do that, we are committed to do that.

The reason for the turning over of these abandoned homes to GHURA is because they have the funds to put them in a position where we could, 1) rent them, as I mentioned earlier we have at least 8-10 families that are already living there, some with power and some without power. How did they get power when they don't own the property? If we put the money into it we can fix it. Some can afford to home own, we can rent it for low cost. GHURA's rates are good, our rates are good. That's where we put them in until they can rebuild their damage homes. I recommend we just turn it over to GHURA because they have the money. His (Mayor Taitague) concern about Chamorro Land Trust, who do you think we have in LADA Gardens? It's the people who are eligible for Chamorro Land Trust. We are servicing the people who are not ready for home ownership so we are telling them, before you are ready, while you are getting ready, rent a unit.

These units have been sitting there for 100 years right? They are just abandoned, the good thing about these units is because they have infrastructure. They have roads, sidewalks, power, water and sewer. We can get it online right away. When we don't manage properties, people come in there and manage it for us and we don't receive property tax or anything in return. I'm asking that we keep it the way it is sir.

Chairman Pangelinan: That concludes the public hearing on Bill No. 235, thank you and si yu'os ma'ase.



I would like to begin by thanking you for publicly hearing Bill 235-31. and for allowing this statement to be read into the record on my behalf. The measure as proposed would AUTHORIZE I MAGA 'LAHEN GUAI IAN TO TRANSFER ABANDONED STAFF HOUSING PROPERTIES HELD BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO THE ATURIDAT GIMINA' YAN RENUEBAN SUIDAT GUAHAN (GUAM HOUSING AND URBAN RENEWAL AUTHORITY) FOR THE PUROSE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

As stated in section 1 of the Act, while a leveraging of various federal resources may fund, in whole or in part, the rehabilitation of these abandoned housing units, these properties must first be transferred to Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guahan in order for several of the properties to be surveyed and rehabilitated with GHURA funds.

Many of these staff housing units are mired in a cycle of blight and continual disrepair, posing a significant risk to young children and other passersby. As recommended during the recent Guam Housing Symposium, Bill 235 -31(COR) will allow GHURA to rehabilitate 46 abandoned staff housing units in to affordable homes through a combination of federal programs. The abandoned units are in the following locations:

Agat	14
Talofofo	5
Dededo	17
Yigo	5
Merizo	5

GHURA's recent housing study indicates that Guam's organic growth will need an additional 6,000 affordable homes by 2020. Though this measure is a small step in the right direction, I believe we have a responsibility to turn abandoned housing into affordable homes wherever we find them.

Using the existing inventory of homes to house these residents not only makes economic sense; it's the most responsible use of excess land," explained the Vice Speaker, "The cost of improving these homes should be minimal therefore allowing the government to help the maximum number of families while limiting the cost to our tax payers.





Mr. Chairman and members of this committee, we applaud you for your commitment as well in this very sensitive and important issue on affordable housing in the interest of the people of Guam.



Roland M. Selvidge Resident Member Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA) strongly support the passage of bill 235-31. This Bill, if passed, will increase our much needed housing stock which will assist us continue to fulfill our mission in providing affordable housing to the residents of Guam. Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority is mandated under Public Law 6-135, the law which created the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, to ensure housing conditions are adequate and affordable, and the dwelling accommodations are safe, sanitary and decent for the neediest residents in our community.

Guam is faced with a serious threat of housing shortage in the next five to ten years due to the pending military buildup. However, even without the military buildup, the organic growth of our population alone will have a defined impact in the housing shortage. According to the housing study that GHURA commissioned in 2009, the study estimates that there will be a shortage of 6,000 units of affordable housing by 2016. GHURA is challenged with the monumental task of developing additional affordable housing to meet the demands reported in the study.

GHURA however, can't resolve this concern alone. It will take a collaborative effort between the Government of Guarn, GHURA, other autonomous agencies, private sector developers and land owners, and this legislative body to tackle this inevitable dilemma. Our preparation for this daunting challenge is crucial to our success in reducing the housing shortage.

This is why this Administration unveiled its 5-year Strategic Plan at the housing symposium held on June this year which gives New Direction to develop an estimated 3,000 units of affordable housing for Guam's low and moderate income rental and homebuyer market. The Governor of Guam has also directed GHURA and other Governmental Agencies to work in partnership with other stakeholders to ensure that we adhere to and effectuate the 5-year plan. Our commitment is to increase our housing inventory and to reduce the demand through education and job opportunities.



The Strategic Plan includes the development of a livable and sustainable community, so that people don't have to go far to get jobs. The sustainable community would include reliable transportation near the development for easy commute. The Plan also identified public lands such As-Atdas, CLTC, Lada Estates, Sagan Linayan and GHURA owned properties for future development so that the Guamanian Dream of homeownership or affordable rental can become a reality. It also encourages private land owners to develop mixed income units with the possibility of some financial assistance from USDA and GHURA HUD funds.

We believe these are doable plans if we stay the course but we need your help. We will be coming to you in the near future to identify impediments, obstacles or threats that may hinder the overall success of the Plan. Our solutions may take legislative actions.

Mr. Chairman, the homeless population has increased by approximately 42 % since last year. This fact is alarming! We must aggressively tackle the housing shortage before it becomes an overbearing burden in our community. We must not let our guard down; we must act now to curtail homelessness.

The transfer of the DOE staff housing is a good start to a significant undertaking. GHURA can start the rehabilitation and/or demolition of the housing units soonest since we have the funding to start the work without delay.

We urge you to please pass Bill 235-31.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE I MAGA 'LAHEN GUÅHAN TO TRANSFER ABANDONED STAFF HOUSING PROPERTIES HELD BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO THE ATURIDAT GIMINA' YAN RENUEBAN SUIDAT GUAHAN (GUAM HOUSING AND URBAN RENEWAL AUTHORITY) FOR THE PUROSE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 2 several dwellings throughout the island commonly referred to as 3 "DOE Staff Housing" are no longer in use and in severe disrepair. 4 Absent a significant rehabilitation effort, these abandoned structures 5 pose a danger to the people of Guam and clearly contradict the intent 6 of existing law. 7 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that it has clearly outlined a 8 policy in favor of the elimination of slum and blight, and increasing 9 the inventory of affordable housing. Specifically, §5101 of Chapter 5 10 of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated states in part, "these slum 11 and blight conditions, and the continuing shortage of decent housing 12

for low-income families present problems of immediate and long-1 range governmental concern." 2 I Liheslatura further finds that Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban 3 Suidat Guåhan is the agency best suited to rehabilitate these housing 4 units to augment Guam's growing need for affordable housing. While 5 6 a leveraging of various federal resources may fund, in whole or in part, the rehabilitation of these abandoned housing units, I 7 Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes that these properties must first be 8 9 transferred to Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan in order for several of the properties to be surveyed and rehabilitated with 10 Aturidat funds. 11 Section 2. Transfer of Abandoned Staff Housing. I Maga 'Lahen 12 Guåhan is hereby authorized to transfer the Government of Guam 13 14 properties described below to Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan for use as affordable housing, emergency shelters, or any 15 other purpose which the Board of Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban 16 Suidat Guåhan determines to be the best public use. The Board of 17 Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan may re-parcel the lots 18 described below to contain only those areas on which staff housing is 19 currently erected. All other lands resulting from the re-parceling 20 authorized under this section shall be retained by the Government of 21 22 Guam: 23 (a) Agat Staff Housing containing an area of 6.4 acres as shown on Map C4-64T429, Municipality of Agat, the metes 24 and bounds and legal description thereof to be determined 25 by survey to be obtained by Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban 26

Suidat Guåhan upon transfer; and

(b) Talofofo Staff Housing as shown on Map D4-70T228, 1 2 Municipality of Talofofo, the metes and bounds to be determined by a survey to be obtained by the Aturidat 3 Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan upon transfer; and 4 5 (c) Dededo Staff Housing, Lot 10114-NEW-3, Municipality of Dededo, containing an area of 20,061+/- square meters or 6 215,925+/- square feet or 4.96 acres as shown on L.M. 7 8 Check No. 002FY95, Land Management Drawing Number 12-94T576, recorded under instrument 520470; and 9 (d) Yigo Staff Housing located within the basic Lot No. 7116-10 R6, Municipality of Yigo, the metes and bounds and legal 11 description to be determined by survey to be obtained by 12 13 Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban Suidat Guåhan upon transfer; and 14 (e) Merizo Staff Housing containing an area of 1.9 acres as 15 shown on Map C4-64T459, Municipality of Merizo, also 16 shown and identified as Staff Housing Area within the Pigua 17 Subdivision, Tract 261, Increment 1, as shown on L.M. 18 Check 199FY77, Land Management No. 14T77T041, the 19 metes and bounds and legal description to be determined by 20 survey to be obtained by Aturidat Ginima' Yan Rinueban 21 Suidat Guåhan upon transfer. 22
