AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 4 TO CHAPTER 50 OF DIVISION 2 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING THE GUAM FILM OFFICE.

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. A new Article 4 is hereby added to Chapter 50 of Division 2 of
3	Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

§ 50402. Guam Film Office.
§ 50403. Rules and Regulations.
§ 50404. Powers and Duties.
§ 50405. Guam Film Office Fund.
§ 50406. Permits Required.

§ 50408. Local Production Companies Exempt.
§ 50409. Applicants and Issuance.
§ 50410. Indemnification of Government Against Liability.

§ 50401. Definitions.
(a) Administrator means the administrator of the Guam Film
Office, who shall be the Administrator of the Guam Economic
Development Authority or his/her designee.
(b) Charitable or student films shall mean commercials, motion
pictures, television, videotapes, or still photography produced by a
nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of
Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a
charitable organization or is produced by students of an
educational institution, and for which no person, directly or
indirectly, shall receive a profit from the marketing and production
of the film or from showing the films, tapes, or photos.
(c) Commercial films <i>shall</i> mean and include all activity attendant

to filming any entertainment or advertising programs for any

media now known or hereafter created.

- (d) Filming/Production *shall* mean and include all activity attendant to staging or shooting commercial motion pictures, television shows or programs, and commercial still photography, video tapes, computer-based programs, or other visual reproduction technology now known or hereafter created. The period of filming includes the set-up, strike and time of photography.
- (e) Government *shall* mean the government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities.
- (f) News Media *shall* mean the photographing, filming or videotaping for the purpose of spontaneous, unplanned television news broadcast or reporting for print media by journalists, reporters, photographers or camera operators.
- (g) Private Property *shall* mean any property *not* owned by the government of Guam on which filming would *not* interfere with public right of way, access or safety.
- (h) Studio *shall* mean a fixed place of business where filming activities (motion or still photography) are regularly conducted upon the premises.

§ 50402. Guam Film Office.

There is hereby established within the Guam Economic Development Authority a Guam Film Office. The Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority *shall* be responsible for the administration of the Guam Film Office.

§ 50403. Rules and Regulations.

- (a) Rules and Regulations. The Administrator *shall* establish an advisory committee comprised of individuals and representatives of nongovernmental organizations that have substantial experience in the film, video and media fields in order to cause the promulgation of rules, regulations and fees to govern the form, time and location of filming activity set forth within Guam. The committee *shall* allow for the full participation of any member of the public during its deliberations. The rules and regulations *shall* also provide for the issuance of permits, notification of permit denial and a process of appeal. The rules, regulations, and fees *shall* be adopted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 9, within ninety (90) days upon the enactment of this Article. The rules and regulations *shall* be based upon the following criteria:
 - (1) the health and safety of all persons;
 - (2) avoidance of undue disruption of all persons within the affected area;
 - (3) the safety of property in Guam; and
 - (4) traffic congestion at particular locations in Guam
- **§50404. Powers and Duties.** The Guam Film Office *shall* have the following powers and duties:
- (a) To promote, encourage and advertise the use of Guam facilities and services for the production of films, videos, television programs, audio recordings, computer-generated and other media-related products.

(b) To provide support services to visiting and local production companies, including assistance to film, video and media producers in securing necessary permits or permissions from government of Guam authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities.

- (c) To develop and update annually a resource guide of viable filming locations in Guam, available video and media production facilities, permitting requirements, and tax incentives.
- (d) To work in coordination with the Guam Visitors Bureau to conduct and attend trade shows and production workshops to promote Guam to the national and international film industries.
- (e) To promote and attract business activities in film, video, computer-generated and other media production activity in Guam, and take any other administrative action which may improve Guam's film, video and media production industries in national and international markets.
- (f) To accept any funds, gifts, donations, bequests or grants of funds from private, federal, and public sources for the purpose of this Act.
- (g) To create a "one stop permitting" process by formulating and proposing rules and regulations for standardized permits which *shall* be used by the government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities, to include any requirements set forth in this Act.
- § 50405. Guam Film Office Fund. There is established a fund to be known as the Guam Film Office Fund, which *shall* be administered by the Guam Economic Development Authority Guam Film Office, and be

maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, including the General Fund of the government of Guam. Independent records and accounts *shall* be maintained in connection therewith. Funds of the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be used exclusively for the administration and operations of the Guam Film Office. All funds collected from fees, charges or fines levied pursuant to this Chapter *shall* be deposited into the Guam Film Office Fund, and all interest earned by the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* accrue. Any unencumbered funds remaining in the Guam Film Office Fund at the end of each fiscal year *shall* remain in that Fund. The Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be subject to audits by the Office of Public Accountability.

§ 50406. Permits Required.

- (a) Permit Required. No person shall use any government street, alley, sidewalk, park, pier, way or other public property owned or controlled by the government of Guam for the purpose of making commercial films without first applying for and receiving a permit from the Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her designee, provided, that the provisions of this Chapter *shall not* apply to or be construed to affect (1) news media; and (2) filming solely for private-family use.
- (b) No person shall use any private property for the purpose of making commercial films without first applying for and receiving a permit from the Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her designee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the provisions of this Chapter *shall not* apply to or be construed to affect the following filming on private property:
 - (1) filming which requires *no* parking variances and uses *no* public property or rights of way on public property;

1	(2) filming which does not impair the quiet enjoyment of the
2	surrounding properties;
3	(3) filming which does not involve the use of any
4	pyrotechnic devices;
5	(4) a licensed business which regularly employs a licensed
6	pyrotechnic operator;
7	(5) filming by news media;
8	(6) filming solely for private-family use; or
9	(7) filming which <i>does not</i> interfere with the public's use of
10	government property.
11	(c) Except as provided herein, each applicant must comply with all
12	local and federal laws and regulations, and must obtain all necessary permits
13	and licenses as a precondition for the commencement of commercial film
14	production hereunder. Thereafter, the permittee shall remain in full
15	compliance with all local and federal laws, regulations, permits and licenses
16	throughout the filming.
17	(d) Upon reasonable notice by the applicant, the Administrator, or
18	his/her designee, is authorized, upon showing of good cause, to change the
19	conditions under which a permit has been issued, provided that the
20	requirements of this Chapter are met and the government of Guam
21	department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality can
22	undertake all necessary administrative review within the time requested.
23	§ 50407. General Exemptions. The provisions of this Article
24	shall not apply to or affect:
25	(a) News Media. Reporters, photographers or cameramen in the

employ of a newspaper, news service, or similar entity, engaged in the on-

the-spot broadcasting of news events concerning those persons, scenes or 1 2 occurrences which are in the news and of general public interest, including 3 sporting events. 4 (b) Private/Family Use. The filming or video taping of motion 5 pictures solely for private/family use. 6 (c) Charitable Films and Student Films. Projects produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue 7 and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or 8 9 produced by a student(s) of an educational institution. 10 Small Crews. If the crew does not exceed five (5) persons and (d) 11 there is no extensive use of props, equipment, cast or other participants, the small crew shall be exempt if the following conditions are met: 12 13 The crew is filming a parade, demonstration or other (1)special event, and has obtained all permission that may be required. 14 The exemption shall allow them to operate on the same basis as a 15 16 citizen with a camera; or 17 (2)Pedestrian and vehicular traffic is *not* altered: and 18 No special parking provisions are included; and (3) 19 No stunt work is performed; and (4) Permission is obtained from controlling authorities to use 20 (5)21 government of Guam property, other than sidewalks and streets; and Permission is obtained from owners to use private 22 (6)23 property where applicable. 24 § 50408. Local Production Companies Exempt. In addition to

the General Exemptions authorized in §50407 of this Act, the provisions of

1	this Article and the rules, regulations, and requirements authorized herein
2	shall not apply to or affect local production companies if:
3	(a) The production company was incorporated in Guam.
4	(b) Principal owner(s) is a resident of Guam and has filed
5	individual tax returns in Guam for a period of at least three (3) years.
6	(c) The production company maintains its headquarters in
7	Guam.
8	(d) The production company is licensed to do business in
9	Guam.
10	(e) The daily operations of the production company are
11	managed by a resident of Guam.
12	§ 50409. Applicants and Issuance.
13	(a) Issuing Authority. The issuing authority shall be the
14	Guam Film Office Administrator.
15	(b) Applications. Each application for filming under this
16	Chapter must be completed in full and filed with the Administrator, or
17	his/her designee
18	(c) The permit application shall be in a form the
19	Administrator, or his/her designee, may reasonably require. In lieu of
20	the foregoing, the applicant may submit the permit application on the
21	form adopted and in use by the Guam Film Office.
22	(d) The Administrator, or his/her designee, may refer the
23	application to such appropriate government department, agency,
24	autonomous agency, office or instrumentality as are directly impacted
25	by the application, and as he/she deems necessary from the nature of
26	the application for review, evaluation, investigation and

recommendations by the department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality regarding approval or disapproval of the application.

- (e) The Administrator, or his/her designee, *shall* issue a permit under this Chapter if it is determined that the following criteria have been met:
 - (1) the proposed use will *not* unreasonably interfere with or endanger the public peace or rights of nearby residents to the quiet, peaceable enjoyment of their property, or otherwise be detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare;
 - (2) the proposed use will *not* unduly impede, obstruct or interfere with the operation of emergency vehicles or equipment in or through the permit area, or adversely affect the government's ability to perform municipal functions or furnish government services in the vicinity of the permitted area; and
 - (3) the proposed use will *not* constitute a fire or safety hazard and all proper safety precautions will be taken as is reasonably necessary to protect the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- (f) The Administrator, or his/her designee, *shall* deny the permit if the conditions of this Chapter and all applicable laws and regulations have *not* been met or if the application contains incomplete or false information. No permit shall be denied without a clear written explanation of the reasons compelling a denial and the process by which said denial may be appealed.

(g) The Administrator, or his/her designee, may immediately revoke or suspend a permit which has been granted, if the conditions of this Chapter and all applicable laws and regulations are no longer being met, if the information supplied by the applicant becomes, or is determined to be, false or incomplete, or if any substantial change in circumstances results in the proposed use becoming detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.

- (h) The Guam Economic Development Authority Compliance and Audit Department *shall* conduct production site inspections, monitoring, and enforcement of this Act.
- (i) Reimbursement for Personnel. The production company shall reimburse the relevant government of Guam agency for any personnel provided to the company (i.e. police, fire, traffic control, medical personnel) for the purpose of assisting the production. Any cost shall be negotiated, and approved, prior to the shoot date. A fee for issuance of the permit shall be set by the advisory committee.

§ 50410. Indemnification of Government Against Liability.

(a) Prior and as a condition precedent to the granting of a permit under this Chapter, each applicant *shall* agree to indemnify, defend and hold the government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees harmless from and against any and all losses, damages, claims, causes of action, costs, liabilities, penalties, judgments and expenses, including without limitation, defense costs and reasonable legal fees, resulting from any and all claims or damage of any nature, including any accident, loss or damage to persons or property which the government may incur and which arise from or relate to any activity conducted by the

permittee or any of its agents, employees, representatives, contractors or consultants in connection with the rights granted in the permit or under this Chapter. The form of the indemnification agreement *shall* be as determined by the Attorney General of Guam.

§ 50411. Insurance and Bonding Required.

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- Liability Insurance. As a condition of issuance of a permit hereunder, every permittee must procure and maintain in full force and effect during the term of the permit a policy (or policies) of insurance from an insurance company licensed to do business in Guam, naming the government of Guam, its officers, employees and agents as coinsured for protection against claims of third persons for any and all liability of permittee with respect to its obligations and liabilities under its permit and this Chapter and its indemnities, including, but not limited to, commercial general liability insurance on an "occurrence" basis against claims for personal injury, including death, bodily injury or property damage liability, and in an amount no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), and which otherwise provides sufficient coverage that the Administrator, or his/her designee, determines to be necessary and adequate under the circumstances. The certificate of insurance shall not be subject to cancellation or modification until after thirty (30) days' written notice to the Guam Film Office. Prior to issuance of any permit, a copy of the certificate of insurance shall be provided to the Insurance Commissioner. A copy of the certificate will remain on permanent file.
- (b) Worker's Compensation Insurance. An applicant *shall* conform to all applicable federal and local requirements for worker's compensation insurance for all persons operating under a permit.

(c) Hold Harmless Agreement. An applicant *shall* execute a hold harmless agreement as provided by the government of Guam and incorporated within the permit issued under this Chapter.

- (d) Faithful Performance Bond. To ensure cleanup and restoration of any public property involved in the filming, the permittee may be required to post a refundable Faithful Performance Bond (amount to be determined by rules and regulations), cash surety or other comparable form of security guarantee at the time application is submitted. Upon completion of filming, cleanup and restoration, and a satisfactory inspection of the site by Guam Film Office Administrator, or his/her designee, the bond may be returned to applicant.
- § 50412. Effective Date. This Article *shall* be effective one hundred eighty (180) days after the date of enactment.
- § 50413. Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable."

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 343-31(COR)

I. OVERVIEW: The Committee on Health & Human Services, Economic Development, Senior Citizens and Election Reform conducted a public hearing on December 01, 2011. The hearing convened at 9AM in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of BILL NO. 343-31(COR)- An act to create the Guam Film Office by adding a new Article 4 to Chapter 50 of Division 2 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated; Sponsored by Senator Tina Rose Muna Barnes.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via hand-delivery/fax and/or email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on November 23, 2011 (5-day notice), and again on November 28, 2011 (48-hour notice).

Senators Present

The public hearing on agenda item Bill No. 343-31(COR) was called to order at 9:04AM.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION.

Chairman Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr., convened the Public Hearing on Bill 343-31(COR). Chairman Rodriguez invited Sen. Muna Barnes, as the author of Bill 343-31 (COR), to explain the intent of the bill.

Next on the agenda is Bill 343 and we'll have the author of the legislation give a brief synopsis.

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes: Si Yu'usMase Mr. Chair. And Mr. Chair I want to thank you for the opportunity that you've done to out this bill on the public hearing for the public hearing agenda today. We have been working close with GEDA and the folks, the local businesses that deal with the film industry and photography industry and I do know today that some of them are here to speak today but if I could give a brief history I want to note that there are 330 film offices on 6 continents around the world and these

offices protect the way their country is used in films. They market their country's viable film locations they increase the capacity for some local film production companies to engage in an international arena. All of these things can be done without burdening local production companies, individual users, and recreational artists. A film office does not cost additional tax dollars does not cost additional tax dollars should this film office be created on Guam. The role of the film office, Mr. Chair, would be led by our government entity GEDA and funded by permitted fees by off-island companies and this is the main intent of this bill 343. I want to note for the record that previously we did introduce bill 324 and there were many concerns from our community we had several meetings before the introduction of the bill we had a follow up round table discussion that we had a full room of photographers and those in the film industry come and testify and share their concerns. We've strengthened the bill 343. We assured that there would be a process to continue to share any concerns and recommendations and this will be provided today. I just want to say in the interest of time as we look at show casing Guam that Guam captures the revenues that come out of them. Using Guam I want to note for the record that Mr. James Cameron who is the film producer for avatars two and three which was a million dollar production. He would like to produce avatar three using the Mariana's trench and we all know that the mariana's trench is right there in our own yard and I also want to say that the top two music videos that are watched in Japan that is performed by AKB48, that production was done here on Guam but Guam is not reaping any of the benefits of what was produced here. A Guam film office would link the international companies hoping to use the Guam brand with local talent I do have 13 sections of the bill Mr. Speaker in the interest of time and I do know that some of our folks here in the industry are here to speak about it and again because you open the opportunity we open the opportunity for additional comments to come in. I'll go ahead and yield to those who are here today.

Chairman: Thank you Senator Barnes. We have Karl Pangelinan from GEDA provided written testimony. Now we have Jason Triplett, James Davis, and Justin Guzman who signed up to testify and please you can start just state your name.

Jason Triplett: Hi my name is Jason Triplett of course and this is James Davis. Forgive me I don't know the formalities of a hearing so I just wanted to thank all the senators for taking this time to listen to us. I want to make it short and quick, our speaker who represents our group couldn't make it today so all I want to do is give you the concerns and Senator Tina Muna-Barnes did you get a write up by any chance?

Senator Tina Muna Barnes: I think my office just received a recent information from you folks and what we'll do is go ahead and append that and work with the committee if they is any mark ups that need to be done. I don't have the full recommendations but I do have a portion of it and if you don't mind we're going to just read it out. All right so the major concern with the bill is just that I guess two major concerns was that the local film community is allowed to and we have young film makers who are now affording cameras who want to go out and experience the whole production of film so in our mind set we just want to protect that aspect and allow the

community to grow. Our personels who were trying to do business in the community for this type of industry for us and so we can't pay our staff. All of this is just passionate work that we're trying to do so we want to just protect that and allow it to grow. That's one of the main concerns, the second one is we are totally in favor of this bill. We want it to happen because it's going to benefit us it's going to benefit the island and the list goes on. But one of the things we want to really make sure of is that if the bill does go through that the measures that are put into the bill are safe guarded from favoritism, when you mix business and politics that's a concern with the community and so number 1 if you don't mind me three anti-services that you can consider. Number 1:[reads written testimony]

These are the three measures that we want to hopefully implement. Thankyou.

Chairman: Mr. James Davis, please.

James Davis: Good Morning ladies and gentlemen. The only concern that I have is just the proper way of saying on the bill stating that the local film makers over here are really accepted because it's still not clear. I tried to gather all the cinematographers on this island and most of them are students, most of them are aspiring film makers. So they're just starting right now and most of their concerns is about the local community and all that stuff so that's my only concern. They're not here right now to speak up so I don't want to speak for them but it's the exemption on this bill. That's the only thing. Thank you.

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes: Thank you.

Chairman: Yes, thank you.

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes: thank you Mr. Chair I just want to note to Mr. Davis that on section 7 if any of those who continue to see that the policy that is done on section 7 is not prudent for then that they can recommend and make any suggestions on and what we'll do is we'll look it up with the committee and this continues to go through collaboration before it gets delivered on the floor so again our office is open to any recommendations I want those folks to make sure that regarding the exemptions which is on section 7 of the bill, please don't hesitate to come in and see us on that and that's where the key is on local exemption which would be on section seven

Chairman: Thank you. Mr. Jerry White?

Jerry White: Hi senators, my name is Jerry White. I just wanted to comment I'm in favor o the bill and I would like to give you a brief synopsis on what the current filming industry is all about. I represent an association called the Guam International Media Coordinators Association made up of about seven members. Local companies like Guam TB there's a representative, other representatives is the FM 104 others that we have Island Grip Services which provide professional Hollywood style film making equipment on Guam which a lot of people may not have heard of this before we as a non-profit organization, we've been in business for the seven

years currently also working with the department of labor and also working with the immigration services. We actually as a part of the information that Senator Barnes had mentioned that we actually do a lot of overseas filming such as AKB48 that she had mention that just to give you an overview that it's gotten on Youtube and it's gotten 32,000,000 viewers for one video which was which everything was shot on Guam not many people on Guam may know about this but the people in Japan are actually fully aware of where these locations were done and how it was shot and who were in the makings so our goal basically is by supporting the bill we would like to promote to bring over filming crews and industries from abroad to Guam and the main reason why is so they can not only utilize Guam but to promote Guam and that's what the business is for – to promote Guam. And also as she had mentioned there are actually over 330 film commission offices world wide and we are the only territory within the area without a film office so having the film office would actually create an introduction for people from overseas and to actually bring over Hollywood so called people out here to give them the opportunity to actually come out to Guam and possibly even give a chance to aspiring local film makers a chance to possibly work with these people because we do hire a lot of local people and our main crews are the local people that work with the professionals so by promoting this and helping create this bill would help Guam in the future as far as the industries so that's basically what I wanted to input in Thank you very much.

Chairman: Thank you very much Mr. White. Is there any questions or comments speaker?

Speaker Ben Pangelinan: Thank you very much Mr. Chair. I just kind of want to get a little bit of a history back in 1986 I was a special assistant for governor Ricky Bordallo for business and economic affairs and this was one of my responsibilities we actually had a coordination out of the Governor's office to facilitate media coordinators who wanted to bring in professional models to maybe do so and we actually had a pretty good industry and what really changed at that time was the itch to process of allowing these individuals to come in it became so red-taped and tangled that it wasn't profitable and easy anymore to bring these models in or their top film crew workers on a very temporary basis, 30 days 45 days to come and do the filming to work with local. We were able to work with quit a number of these production companies coming to Guam but because of changes in the federal law so I think that we still need to go back and kind of focus on some of that I'm sure you're very familiar working with the immigration of some of the changes in the law over the last years and we need to kind of work with the federal delegate here to try and if we really want to open up this ability here to grow our local film maker and talent by allowing them to collaborate with off-island professionals then we really have to engage also the federal agencies on this to make it a little easier and then facilitate it to a local coordinating office that's established like I said that was something that I did as part of my duties in the front office under business economic and foreign affairs but the establishment of something like this would help facilitate this industry so I certainly commend the author on establishing it and making it apart of our business infrastructure rather than on a basis of whether or not the policy is of an administration it shouln't be something that is part of our business

infrastructure for facilitating off-island every time we provide a venue for this that's an export that's how you account for that in our economic statistics. Tourism is an export. They come here but its an export when you look at it from an economic aspect of what contributes to economic activity so tourism really is an export of Guam's resources in terms of the prestige business infrastructure but we want to make sure that there are protections, opportunities, and requirements for collaboration with local production companies that would bring one or two of their top guys with services to go along and help with the shooting or filming are hired locally and that gives them the ability to own heir talent and own their skills and this is something that I think will become very beneficial to our own local community as well as our economic base here. Thank you very much Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Thank you very much.

Jason Triplett: I think Senator Tina Muna-Barnes mentioned that I think It was Jospeh Ada that also tried again so I'm just wondering what is the problem why do they make it so difficult

Speaker Ben Pangelinan: Again these are some of the issues on the federal side in terms of visas work permits and we were able to carve out some of the authority and permits from the federal jurisdiction but was has occurred is they've ringed back in the ability to approve these permits and so forth and that something that I think we just have to work on the federal side. With our congressional delegate to get try and get some of those exemptions back in from where they were at before so I think those are some of the things to their own politics over there in regards to their own national concerns, security concerns and things like that.

Jerry White: may I actually comment. Thank you very much Senator Pangelinan. I just want to give a brief update in regards to the federal regulations on what is happening and one of the main reasons we established and formed a non profit organization called GIMCA is to basically battle with that basic federal problem and since then it took six years to actually incorporate GIMCA, the filming association it's a small member as I said it was a six or seven but it was a legitimate business that all of us as small as we are have been. One of our chairman, George Johnson was our chairman so we actually had a vas experience in that field already so since then it took us about seven years in which we have been talking about immigration a person in particular, rocky minor to which he had asked us to work with the department of labor and since then we've been able to bring in filming crews. we took an example in Hawaii and how the film industry in Hawaii is doing so we kind of used their rules and regulations and applied it to us and so therefore this time at the immigration services are very aware of what we do and they accept visa waivered country filming production crews to be able to come into Guam so that actually has been going on for the last five years. That has actually been up to par so that has been a promotional stance by supporting this bill in order to tell people that this is actually open and we would like to sell this bill for business on Guam.

Speaker Ben Pangelinan: Are you bringing in the crew from non-profit or anybody can do that now?

Jerry White: There's a procedure, which is publicly known, but you would have to work with immigration but also you would have to work in conjunction with the department of labor. It's a tedious task however it's much easier right now that we could actually give these permits within a 10 day period so we don't work with the H2 visas, we don't do that anymore. So that's actually been cleared and it's been forced for the last five six years already

Speaker Ben Pangelinan: so basically a visa waivered country can send in a work crew and do the work here

Jerry White: The other matter here is that we do announce all the workers of the work coming up. But these main people that we bring from overseas have their plans on doing it so what we do over here is we work with the department of labor in trying to actually list people that we need locally and a lot of the times we do have an advertisement in the department of labor listings so that we do have the opportunity to hire these people to join the filming crew so it's just the difference of standards possibly but with the professionalism that the overseas countries have we're still in the baby stages of working with the local people that they need to learn little by little. So by hopefully joining little by little that they can expand get more experience and possibly work with them and so we're trying to promote both sides as much as possible.

Speaker Ben Pangelinan: Thank you very much.

Chairman: Thank you very much speaker Ben. Senator Tom Ada? None? Senator Barnes?

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes: Just so you know for the record that we did get the email this morning so we'll go ahead and append it to today's pubic hearing. Thank you.

Chairman. Thank you very much, thank you for being here this morning. If there are any other testimonies they can submit it to my office or here at the mailroom of the Guam Legislature.

There being no other testimony, or comments by Senators, Chairman Rodriguez declared the bill as having been heard, and concluded the public hearing on Bill No. 343-31(COR). The committee would continue to accept written testimony for a period of ten (10) days subsequent to the public hearing.

§50413. Severability.

§50401. Definitions.

- a) "Administrator" means the administrator of the Guam Film Office, who *shall* be the Director of the Guam Economic Development Authority or his/her designee.
- b) "Charitable or student films" *shall* mean commercials, motion pictures, television, videotapes, or still photography produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or is produced by students of an educational institution, and for which no person, directly or indirectly, *shall* receive a profit from the marketing and production of the film or from showing the films, tapes, or photos.
- c) "Commercial films," *shall* mean and include all activity attendant to filming any entertainment or advertising programs for any media now known or hereafter created.
- d) "Filming"/"Production" *shall* mean and include all activity attendant to staging or shooting commercial motion pictures, television shows or programs, and commercial still photography, video tapes, computer-based programs, or other visual reproduction technology now known or hereafter created. The period of filming includes the set-up, strike and time of photography.
- e) "Government" shall mean the Government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities.
- f) "News Media" shall mean the photographing, filming or

videotaping for the purpose of spontaneous, unplanned television news broadcast or reporting for print media by journalists, reporters, photographers or camera operators.

- g) "Private Property" *shall* mean any property not owned by the Government of Guam on which filming would not interfere with public right of way, access or safety.
- h) "Studio" *shall* mean a fixed place of business where filming activities (motion or still photography) are regularly conducted upon the premises.

§50402. Guam Film Office.

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There is hereby established within the Guam Economic Development Authority a Guam Film Office. The Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority *shall* be responsible for the administration of the Guam Film Office.

§50403. Rules and Regulations.

a) Rules and Regulations. The Administrator *shall* establish a committee comprised of individuals and representatives of Non Governmental Organizations that have substantial experience in the film, video and media fields in order to cause the promulgation of rules, regulations and fees to govern the form, time and location of filming activity set forth within Guam. The committee *shall* allow for the full participation of any member of the public during its deliberations. The rules and regulations *shall* also provide for the issuance of permits, notification of permit denial and a process of appeal. The rules, regulations, and fees *shall* be adopted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated,

1	Chapter 9, within ninety (90) days upon the enactment of this Article.
2	The rules and regulations shall be based upon the following criteria:
3	1. The health and safety of all persons;
4	2. Avoidance of undue disruption of all persons within the

- §50405. Guam Film Office Fund. There is established a fund to be known as the Guam Film Office Fund, which *shall* be administered by the Guam Economic Development Authority Guam Film Office and be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, including the General Fund of the government of Guam. Independent records and accounts *shall* be maintained in connection therewith. Funds of the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be used exclusively for the administration and operations of the Guam Film Office. All funds collected from fees, charges or fines levied pursuant to this Chapter *shall* be deposited into the Guam Film Office Fund and all interest earned by the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* accrue. Any unencumbered funds remaining in the Guam Film Office Fund at the end of each fiscal year *shall* remain in that Fund. The Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be subject to audits by the Office of Public Accountability.

§50406. Permits Required.

a) Permit Required. No person *shall* use any government street, alley, sidewalk, park, pier, way or other public property owned or controlled by the Government of Guam for the purpose of making commercial films without first applying for and receiving a permit from the Guam

2 provisions of this chapter shall not apply to or be construed to affect (1) news media and (2) filming solely for private-family use. 3 b) No person shall use any private property for the purpose of making 4 commercial films without first applying for and receiving a permit from 5 Guam Film Office 6 Administrator or his/her designee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the provisions of this chapter shall not 7 apply to or be construed to affect the following filming on private 8 9 property: 1. 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d) Upon reasonable notice by the applicant, the Administrator or his/her designee is authorized, upon showing of good cause, to change the conditions under which a permit has been issued, provided that the requirements of this chapter are met and the government of Guam department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality can undertake all necessary administrative review within the time requested.

§50407. General Exemptions. The provisions of this Article *shall* not apply to or affect:

- A. News Media. Reporters, photographers or cameramen in the employ of a newspaper, news service, or similar entity engaged in the on-the-spot broadcasting of news events concerning those persons, scenes or occurrences which are in the news and of general public interest, including sporting events.
- B. Private/Family Use. The filming or video taping of motion pictures solely for private/family use.
- C. Charitable Films and Student Films. Projects produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or produced by a student(s) of an educational institution.
- D. Small Crews. If the crew does not exceed five persons and there is no extensive use of props, equipment, cast or other participants, the small crew *shall* be exempt if the following conditions are met:
 - 1. The crew is filming a parade, demonstration or other special event and has obtained all permission that may

1	be required. The exemption shall allow them to operate
2	on the same basis as a citizen with a camera; or
3	2. Pedestrian and vehicular traffic is not altered; and

- e) The Administrator or his/her designee *shall* issue a permit under this chapter if it is determined that the following criteria have been met:
 - The proposed use will not unreasonably interfere with or endanger the public peace or rights of nearby residents to the quiet, peaceable enjoyment of their property, or otherwise be detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare;
 - 2. The proposed use will not unduly impede, obstruct or interfere with the operation of emergency vehicles or equipment in or through the permit area, or adversely affect the government's ability to perform municipal functions or furnish government services in the vicinity of the permitted area; and

- 3. The proposed use will not constitute a fire or safety hazard and all proper safety precautions will be taken as is reasonably necessary to protect the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- f) The Administrator or his/her designee *shall* deny the permit if the conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations have not been met or if the application contains incomplete or false information. No permit *shall* be denied without a clear written explanation of the reasons compelling a denial and the process by which said denial may be appealed.

- g) The Administrator or his/her designee may immediately revoke or suspend a permit which has been granted, if the conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations are no longer being met, if the information supplied by the applicant becomes, or is determined to be, false or incomplete, or if any substantial change in circumstances results in the proposed use becoming detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- h) The Guam Economic Development Authority Compliance and Audit Department *shall* conduct production site inspections and monitoring.
- i) Reimbursement for Personnel. The production company *shall* reimburse the Government of Guam for any personnel provided to the company, (i.e. police, fire, traffic control, medical personnel) for the purpose of assisting the production. Any cost *shall* be negotiated, and approved, prior to shoot date. A fee for issuance of the permit *shall* be set by the advisory committee.

§50410. Indemnification of Government Against Liability.

a) Prior and as a condition precedent to the granting of a permit under this chapter, each applicant *shall* agree to indemnify, defend and hold the Government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees harmless form and against any and all losses, damages claims, causes of action, costs, liabilities, penalties, judgments and expenses, including without limitation, defense costs and reasonable legal fees, resulting from any and all claims or damage of any nature, including any accident, loss or damage to persons or property which the government may incur and which arise from or relate to any activity conducted by the permittee or any of its agents, employees, representatives, contractors or consultants in connection with the rights granted in the permit or under this chapter. The form of the indemnification agreement *shall* be as determined by the Attorney General of Guam.

§50411. Insurance and Bonding Required.

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(a) Liability Insurance. As a condition of issuance of a permit hereunder, every permittee must procure and maintain in full force and effect during the term of the permit a policy (or policies) of insurance from an insurance company licensed to do business in Guam naming the Government of Guam, it's officers, employees and agents as coinsured for protection against claims of third persons for any and all liability of permitteee with respect to its obligations and liabilities under its permit and this chapter and its indemnities, including, but not limited to, commercial general liability insurance on an "occurrence" basis against claims for personal injury, including death, bodily injury or property damage liability, and in an amount no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), and which otherwise provides sufficient coverage that

the Administrator or his/her designee determines to be necessary and adequate under the circumstances. The certificate shall not be subject to cancellation or modification until after thirty days' written notice to the Guam Film Office. Prior to issuance of any permit, a copy of the certificate of insurance shall be provided to the Insurance Commissioner. A copy of the certificate will remain on permanent file. (b) Worker's Compensation Insurance. An applicant shall conform to all applicable federal and local requirements for worker's compensation insurance for all persons operating under a permit. (c) Hold Harmless Agreement. An applicant shall execute a hold harmless agreement as provided by the Government of Guam and incorporated within the permit issued under this chapter. (d) Faithful Performance Bond. To ensure cleanup and restoration of any public property involved in the filming, the permittee may be required to post a refundable Faithful Performance Bond (amount to be determined by Rules and Regulations), cash surety or other comparable form of security guarantee at the time application is submitted. Upon completion of filming, cleanup and restoration and a satisfactory inspection of the site by Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her designee, the bond may be returned to applicant. §50412. Effective Date. This Article shall be effective 180 days after the date of enactment. §50413. Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to any

person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such

invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this law, which

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- can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to
- this end the provisions of this law are severable."

Dear Honorable Senator,

Thank you again for allowing us to work with you to continue to strengthen Bill 343-31 and ensure that it is truly meeting the intent. Although version 2 addressed many of the original issues, it is recommended the following anti-favoritism language be added without modification or revision:

- 1. The Administrator, or any Guam Film Office employee, may not show favoritism by referring any entities to any other local business or group in any communications, be it verbal, print or electronic.
- 2. Guam Film Office will, at no charge, accept Vendor submissions of all properly-licensed Guam businesses in industries governed by this Bill. The complete Vendor List will appear in <u>Alphabetical</u> order in any Vendor referral communications, be it verbal, print or electronic.
- 3. On an annual basis the GEDA Board of Directors will elect Guam Film Office committee members. GEDA will allow for the full participation of any member of the public during this vote

Additionally, here are some concerns that still need to be addressed prior to a public hearing. It still seems unclear

Section 50403, Rules and Regulations, states: "The rules, regulations, and fees shall be adopted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 9, within ninety (90) days upon the enactment of this Article." Although this statement is clear, there is concern about the composition of the board and potential "agendas" of those members. If other suggestions made in this letter are recognized and included, then the concern about the permits and attendant requirement of liability insurance will be addressed.

In section 50405 – Guam Film Office Fund, if this office is to be self-sustaining and there are concerns as to the number of employees will be in this office and how much will be charged for permits in order to "sustain" this office. Additionally, it is known that permits are not necessary for news media and filming solely for private-family use, who will be arbiter of the latter?

In section 50408- Local Production Companies Exempt, "Principal owner(s) is a resident of Guam and has filed individual tax returns in Guam for a period of at least three (3) years." There needs to be consideration of the returning student, or the those who have been "claimed" by tax-payers residing on Guam. This would benefit the recent high school or college graduate who may not have personally been a taxpayer but whose parent or guardian have been continuous residents and were able to claim them on their income tax forms.

Finally, many filmmakers agree that if the Bill is for off island production companies, please consider a clear statement in the Bill such as: "Local Filmmakers and production companies will not be affected at all by any additional measures/regulations brought about by Bill 343-31."

§50401. Definitions.

- a) "Administrator" means the administrator of the Guam Film Office, who *shall* be the Director of the Guam Economic Development Authority or his/her designee.
- b) "Charitable or student films" *shall* mean commercials, motion pictures, television, videotapes, or still photography produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or is produced by students of an educational institution, and for which no person, directly or indirectly, *shall* receive a profit from the marketing and production of the film or from showing the films, tapes, or photos.
- c) "Commercial films," *shall* mean and include all activity attendant to filming any entertainment or advertising programs for any media now known or hereafter created.
- d) "Filming"/"Production" *shall* mean and include all activity attendant to staging or shooting commercial motion pictures, television shows or programs, and commercial still photography, video tapes, computer-based programs, or other visual reproduction technology now known or hereafter created. The period of filming includes the set-up, strike and time of photography.
- e) "Government" *shall* mean the Government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities.
- f) "News Media" shall mean the photographing, filming or

videotaping for the purpose of spontaneous, unplanned television news broadcast or reporting for print media by journalists, reporters, photographers or camera operators.

- g) "Private Property" *shall* mean any property not owned by the Government of Guam on which filming would not interfere with public right of way, access or safety.
- h) "Studio" *shall* mean a fixed place of business where filming activities (motion or still photography) are regularly conducted upon the premises.

§50402. Guam Film Office.

There is hereby established within the Guam Economic Development Authority a Guam Film Office. The Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority *shall* be responsible for the administration of the Guam Film Office.

§50403. Rules and Regulations.

a) Rules and Regulations. The Administrator *shall* establish a committee comprised of individuals and representatives of Non Governmental Organizations that have substantial experience in the film, video and media fields in order to cause the promulgation of rules, regulations and fees to govern the form, time and location of filming activity set forth within Guam. The committee *shall* allow for the full participation of any member of the public during its deliberations. The rules and regulations *shall* also provide for the issuance of permits, notification of permit denial and a process of appeal. The rules, regulations, and fees *shall* be adopted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated,

There is established a fund to be known as the Guam Film Office Fund, which *shall* be administered by the Guam Economic Development Authority Guam Film Office and be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, including the General Fund of the government of Guam. Independent records and accounts *shall* be maintained in connection therewith. Funds of the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be used exclusively for the administration and operations of the Guam Film Office. All funds collected from fees, charges or fines levied pursuant to this Chapter *shall* be deposited into the Guam Film Office Fund and all interest earned by the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* accrue. Any unencumbered funds remaining in the Guam Film Office Fund at the end of each fiscal year *shall* remain in that Fund. The Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be subject to audits by the Office of Public Accountability.

§50406. Permits Required.

Filming by news media; 18 Filming solely for private-family use; or 19 20 Filming which does not interfere with the public's use of 21 government property. c) Except as provided herein, each applicant must comply with all local 22 and federal laws and regulations, and must obtain all necessary permits 23 and licenses as a precondition for the commencement of commercial 24 film production hereunder. Thereafter, the permittee shall remain in full 25 compliance with all local and federal laws, regulations, permits and 26

licenses throughout the filming.

d) Upon reasonable notice by the applicant, the Administrator or his/her designee is authorized, upon showing of good cause, to change the conditions under which a permit has been issued, provided that the requirements of this chapter are met and the government of Guam department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality can undertake all necessary administrative review within the time requested.

§50407. General Exemptions. The provisions of this Article *shall* not apply to or affect:

- A. News Media. Reporters, photographers or cameramen in the employ of a newspaper, news service, or similar entity engaged in the on-the-spot broadcasting of news events concerning those persons, scenes or occurrences which are in the news and of general public interest, including sporting events.
- B. Private/Family Use. The filming or video taping of motion pictures solely for private/family use.
- C. Charitable Films and Student Films. Projects produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or produced by a student(s) of an educational institution.
- D. Small Crews. If the crew does not exceed five persons and there is no extensive use of props, equipment, cast or other participants, the small crew *shall* be exempt if the following conditions are met:
 - 1. The crew is filming a parade, demonstration or other special event and has obtained all permission that may

1	be required. The exemption shall allow them to operate
2	on the same basis as a citizen with a camera; or
3	2. Pedestrian and vehicular traffic is not altered; and
4	3. No special parking provisions are included; and
5	4. No stunt work is performed; and
6	5. Permission is obtained from controlling authorities
7	to use Government of Guam property, other than
8	sidewalks and streets; and
9	6. Permission is obtained from owners to use private
10	property where applicable.
11	§50408. Local Production Companies Exempt. In addition to the General
12	Exemptions authorized in §50407 of this act, the provisions of this Article
13	and the rules, regulations, and requirements authorized herein shall not
14	apply to or affect local production companies if:
15	1. The production company was incorporated in Guam.
16	2. Principal owner(s) is a resident of Guam and has
17	filed individual tax returns in Guam for a period of
18	at least three (3) years.
19	3. The production company maintains its headquarters
20	in Guam.
21	4. The production company is licensed to do business

23	5. The daily operations of the production company are

25	§50409. Applicants and Issuance.
26	a) Issuing Authority. The issuing authority shall be the Guam Film
27	Office Administrator

- b) Applications. Each application for filming under this chapter must be completed in full and filed with the Administrator or his/her designee
- c) The permit application *shall* be in a form the Administrator or his/her designee may reasonably require. In lieu of the foregoing, the applicant may submit the permit application on the form adopted and in use by the Guam Film Office.
- d) The Administrator or his/her designee may refer the application to such appropriate government department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality as are directly impacted by the application and as he/she deems necessary from the nature of the application for review, evaluation, investigation and recommendations by the department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality regarding approval or disapproval of the application.
- e) The Administrator or his/her designee *shall* issue a permit under this chapter if it is determined that the following criteria have been met:
 - The proposed use will not unreasonably interfere with or endanger the public peace or rights of nearby residents to the quiet, peaceable enjoyment of their property, or otherwise be detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare;
 - 2. The proposed use will not unduly impede, obstruct or interfere with the operation of emergency vehicles or equipment in or through the permit area, or adversely affect the government's ability to perform municipal functions or furnish government services in the vicinity of the permitted area; and

- 3. The proposed use will not constitute a fire or safety hazard and all proper safety precautions will be taken as is reasonably necessary to protect the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- f) The Administrator or his/her designee *shall* deny the permit if the conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations have not been met or if the application contains incomplete or false information. No permit *shall* be denied without a clear written explanation of the reasons compelling a denial and the process by which said denial may be appealed.
- g) The Administrator or his/her designee may immediately revoke or suspend a permit which has been granted, if the conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations are no longer being met, if the information supplied by the applicant becomes, or is determined to be, false or incomplete, or if any substantial change in circumstances results in the proposed use becoming detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- h) The Guam Economic Development Authority Compliance and Audit Department *shall* conduct production site inspections and monitoring.
- i) Reimbursement for Personnel. The production company *shall* reimburse the Government of Guam for any personnel provided to the company, (i.e. police, fire, traffic control, medical personnel) for the purpose of assisting the production. Any cost *shall* be negotiated, and approved, prior to shoot date. A fee for issuance of the permit *shall* be set by the advisory committee.

§50410. Indemnification of Government Against Liability.

a) Prior and as a condition precedent to the granting of a permit under this chapter, each applicant *shall* agree to indemnify, defend and hold the Government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees harmless form and against any and all losses, damages claims, causes of action, costs, liabilities, penalties, judgments and expenses, including without limitation, defense costs and reasonable legal fees, resulting from any and all claims or damage of any nature, including any accident, loss or damage to persons or property which the government may incur and which arise from or relate to any activity conducted by the permittee or any of its agents, employees, representatives, contractors or consultants in connection with the rights granted in the permit or under this chapter. The form of the indemnification agreement *shall* be as determined by the Attorney General of Guam.

§50411. Insurance and Bonding Required.

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(a) Liability Insurance. As a condition of issuance of a permit hereunder, every permittee must procure and maintain in full force and effect during the term of the permit a policy (or policies) of insurance from an insurance company licensed to do business in Guam naming the Government of Guam, it's officers, employees and agents as coinsured for protection against claims of third persons for any and all liability of permitteee with respect to its obligations and liabilities under its permit and this chapter and its indemnities, including, but not limited to, commercial general liability insurance on an "occurrence" basis against claims for personal injury, including death, bodily injury or property damage liability, and in an amount no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), and which otherwise provides sufficient coverage that

1 the Administrator or his/her designee determines to be necessary and 2 adequate under the circumstances. The certificate shall not be subject to cancellation or modification until after thirty days' written notice to the 3 Guam Film Office. Prior to issuance of any permit, a copy of the 4 certificate of insurance shall be provided to the Insurance 5 Commissioner. A copy of the certificate will remain on permanent file. 6 (b) Worker's Compensation Insurance. An applicant shall conform to 8 all applicable federal and local requirements for worker's compensation 9 insurance for all persons operating under a permit. (c) Hold Harmless Agreement. An applicant shall execute a hold 10 harmless agreement as provided by the Government of Guam and 11 incorporated within the permit issued under this chapter. 12 13 (d) Faithful Performance Bond. To ensure cleanup and restoration of 14 any public property involved in the filming, the permittee may be required to post a refundable Faithful Performance Bond (amount to be 15 16 determined by Rules and Regulations), cash surety or other comparable form of security guarantee at the time application is submitted. §50413. Severability. *If* any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law, which

- this end the provisions of this law are severable."
