AN ACT TO APPROVE THE LEASE BY AND BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM AND THE GUAM NATIONAL TENNIS FEDERATION, BY ADDING A NEW §77125 TO ARTICLE 1 OF CHAPTER 77 OF TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the Guam National Tennis Federation (GNTF), is a duly registered non-profit organization engaged in the development and promotion of sports activities, namely the sport of tennis, and is the governing body of tennis on Guam. GNTF is 6 responsible for nominating athletes to the Guam National Olympic Committee for

7 selection to Team Guam in international competitions, for training National Team

8 and Junior National Team players, for hosting international and local tournaments,

9 for running various programs aimed at introducing tennis to Guam's youth and

developing young players, and conducting community outreach clinics to promote

tennis (and sports generally) to the island community.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to solidify Guam's image as a bona fide international sports destination in support of expanding our tourism destination to include Sports Tourism for Guam.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes that Guam is poised to become a major regional player in world-class level international tennis events, contributing to the Guam Visitors Bureau's goal of developing Sports Tourism.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that it is the intent of the GNTF to provide a venue for international tennis tournaments, at which elite international players may compete, and to develop the sport of tennis through the introduction and development of tennis to the youth, thereby providing productive and healthy alternatives to sedentary or destructive behavior.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes that the Guam National Tennis Federation is committed to providing programs and competition to the adult community, contributing to the health and well being of the community.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further recognizes that the Guam National Tennis Federation is proposing to build a multi-court facility that meets the standards for international competition as required by the ITF. The construction of a comprehensive tennis center will promote Guam's image as an international sports destination, as well as provide a facility for the Guam National Tennis Federation to implement programs for the benefit of Guam's youth and general population.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Senator Muña-Barnes: This bill 116-31 is to approve the lease between the government of Guam and the Guam Tennis Federation. As an advocate for sports tourism and oversight chair of Parks and Recreation, there is an opportunity to work with the Guam Tennis Federation in supporting and developing sports tourism. As we have seen sports tourism is another source of tourism and an economic driver that could not only bring tourist to Guam but international competition. It is the intent of the organization, non-profit organization, to come to this table to work closely with the government of Guam to lease a portion of lot number 10142 –New acreage property in the Municipality of Dededo for them to lease for their organization as they will develop the facility, build the facility and entice international sports tourism to Guam. I'd be remised Senator if I didn't share the intent through the late Mr. Bill Camacho, who approached our offices, to work closely on this matter. As we look at other sports in that area, already existing and as we develop our existing sports tourism, I think this is a positive move forward in utilizing a portion of this facility to advocate for the sport of Tennis. With that being said, I know we have representatives from the Tennis federation and from the government to present testimonies today.

(b) Testimony

1. Mr. Richard Lai

Mr. Lai: For the record, my name is Richard Lai and I am the President of the Guam Futbol Federation also one of the property beneficiaries federation from the government of Guam. We are the neighbors of the property that you are about to testify and I am here to support this bill 116-31. I just want to put on the record that the 24th legislature signed into law 24-33 to give the property to the Guam Futbol Association and the lease executed in January 1999 between the futbol association and the government of Guam. Since then the futbol association had a property we can call home and we started to develop that property. If you drive by that property today you will see approximately twenty (20) acres of the sports facility that has two full sized of international futbol page, two buildings that consist of roughly about 9,000 square feet with a dormitory, a class room, locker room and two outdoor futsal mini soccer field and one beach soccer field. This is a good example of a good public and private partnership. In 1999, GFA only had roughly about 500 futbol members. As of today we have over 3,000 members. 80% of them are children under 18 years of age. We produce more kids, we call national player, and to participate in international competition than all other sports combined together. We will benefit because of the property.

Without the property and the training facility, it is impossible for the GFA to grow to 3,000 kids and be able to provide that many national players. Right now GFA can be very proud to tell you that each year we have more kids that receive college scholarship to play in college soccer and in Universities in the United States than all the sports combined together on Guam. It's not because we are better, it's not because we are smarter, it was because we were given the opportunity in

1999 by the 24th legislature and we are able to capture that opportunity and develop on that property. As of today, I can tell you that there are over \$2.5 million of grants that came from off-island. That already invested and put up in that facility for permanent infrastructure. The lighting system, the building, the court and the bleachers. We just finished one of the first artificial turfs on Guam which is the first third generation professional quality turf in the entire Micronesia. That turf cost us over \$830,000. FIFA came and inspected and was very pleased with the quality and told us that we are one in the world that can demonstrate every single dollar that FIFA invests on it. And because of that, Senator Pangelinan, one of the big supporters of it, some matching tax came from the government. I'm very proud to tell you Senator, our meeting three weeks ago, we don't even need one more dollar from the government of Guam. We will fund every project from now on because you have proven that this partnership works.

Immediately after that meeting they granted us another half a million dollars for another futbol beach. They already advised us that starting this year, every six (6) months GFA can apply for \$1 million grants for infrastructure development, which I think we can expand to other parts of our island. On top of this one I would like to let the legislature know that by helping the Tennis Association, they will have a home, they would build the facility, they will mirror the success of GFA, we will be more than happy to guide them, train them and educate them on how to do it. GFA has seven full time staff that costs roughly \$200,000 per year for the payroll and I'm proud to tell you that not one dollar of the payroll came from Guam resident contribution. All the \$200,000 payroll is from off island grants. Meaning, if we have the right facility, right sport, right management, and international knows that it will take money to run the business. They will fund us to run the operation.

All the Board of Directors of GFA is unpaid, we are all volunteers, but we have coaches, administrators, facility maintenance, they are all salary employees. And their salaries are all from off island grants. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the legislature for supporting the GFA twelve years ago as we continue to develop that property to provide a sport that our children can rely on and build on and become a better citizen. I hope the legislature and the public will support the Guam Tennis Federation and grant them the property and I will be more than happy to help and guide them on how to apply for international grants. On top of that, as Senator Muna-Barnes said, sports tourism is very important. I happen to be the chairman for sports tourism for the last eight years with GVB and I see all the benefits having professional teams coming to Guam for training and imagine the exposure Guam will receive in the areas like Japan and Korea. That is multibillions of dollars that GVB cannot afford to pay for.

2. Mr. George Lai

Mr. Lai: Hafa Adai Madam Chair Muna-Barnes, Chairman Pangelinan, Vice Speaker BJ Cruz and honorable Senator Rory Respicio. I am George Lai, from Barrigada and a graduate of JFK, public school education and I think I turned out okay.

We are still shocked and saddened that our President Mr. Bill Camacho passed away last month. A special election was held this month on April 11th and I was elected as the new President for the Guam National Tennis Federation. I've got big shoes to fill and as a matter of fact I have a written testimony that is attached with mine by Bill Camacho dated back from November 8, 2010. We have the same vision as Bill and Senator I'm not sure if you remember but I invited you to my banquet and it was Bill's idea to sit you at the head table and we rounded you up and started to ask you about the land to build a tennis court. I have a passion in tennis, I play tennis, as well as soccer.

I was quite impressed with the first meeting I had with the Board of Directors was with last week. Torgun heads the Guam Futures, an international event, where we bring in players from all different countries. I think I have something I can offer, my experience with the GFA. I've been a treasurer for the last six or seven years and I watch the money go in and out. With the connection we have, given the opportunity, to have the land we can fulfill Bill's dreams and some of his goals. With a five-acre land we can build about ten to twelve tennis courts we plan to do stadium courts, standard type, to attract more international players to come to Guam. My main goal as the new President, some of the visions I have is to build tennis into the youth programs. I like kids, I like soccer and as he said we started off with 500 and now have 3,000. I hate to mirror my brother but it is a proven formula and Senator ben was kind enough twelve years ago to give the land to GFA and we just took it and got outside help, we know the government of Guam is short on cash and we look for sponsorships, even locally and I recall that we got over \$600,000 from various different sponsors. They like to the programs. Show them what you can do together as a group, as a board, and people will show interest. We have corporations coming to ask how they can help by donating cash or in kind or things like that. I want to do the same with the tennis, you know it is my philosophy to give back to the community whether it is in monetary or time.

My company started 25 years ago, Quality Distributors, it is well established and I have employees and good management that allows me to do community work. I'm venturing out and wearing a big hat and big shoes to fill but I am certain with my board of directors and committee chair and tennis families that if you give us the land we will build you a tennis court and a tennis complex. Most importantly we will make it affordable for all people on Guam. Tennis is a perception that it is for the rich and well to do but we want to bring it down to the grass roots. I want the kids from Agate, Merizo, and Talofofo to come and play tennis. In Dededo we can attract the big people in Dededo and Yigo. Like I told you if we can take kids off their couch and into tennis players, I kid you not we have kids like 7 or 8 and as old as in the 70's that play tennis. It's a good sport and no better way than working hand in hand with the government and with the expenses it's scary. As associations we need your help with the passage. Again, give us the land and we will build the tennis court.

3. Mr. Joe Cepeda

Mr. Cepeda: My name is Joe Cepeda and I am sitting on the same Board of Directors for the GFA with Richard and George. I am a product of Guam tennis. I've represented Guam in four South Pacific games years ago. I currently hold a bronze medal in mixed doubles division. Why am I doing this? I'm giving back to my community. I am here to speak about the youth and the

elders. Not so much the sports tourism, that's a given. I want to talk about the youth and the adults. I am in support of Bill 116-31 to lease the government land. As one of the instructors of the Tennis Academy of Guam, I've seen the number of junior players jump from the last three to four years. Three to four years, there were only 25 juniors playing in the tournament. In the most recent junior tournament we had, we had over 150, astronomical. Even more surprising, we have over 300 kids play in the IIAAG high school league. Where do all these kids play? What are some of the major facilities we have now? We have Agana and the Tamuning courts. Thirty years ago we practically had a court in every village. How do I know? I used to play 30 years ago. These courts have deteriorated, they have been converted to skate parks or are just growing jungle now. Playing tennis is on the rise, sadly, playing courts are on the decline.

Dededo, being the most populated, probably needs it the most, the biggest facility on the island. There are a lot of players that play through the night and the day in Agana and Tamuning. That's about five courts we are talking about? How many players can they accommodate in such a short time? Having that facility in the Northern part of the island will help tennis. Tennis is one of the few sports that you can play well into your senior years. Challenging others, not just your skill level but also your age group. Tennis is also a great sport for families. Being involved in soccer, being involved in youth soccer in the summer, I've seen what sports can do for kids. The effects of sports on youths are immeasurable physically, academically and socially. We need to provide the facilities, bottom line. To take a bigger step here, Richard was bragging about futbol, futbol is the biggest sport here. Why am I saying this? Because they are taking futbol to the backyard. Tennis recently has taken the same approach. They take it smaller and call it mini tennis, quick start tennis. Under 10 kids will compete with the big rackets and a big ball. Just last year, the sport of tennis, adopted the small game and now tennis can be brought to the backyards. Tennis can be taken to the basketball courts in Merizo, Talofofo, Umatac and that is one of my passions to bring that there. But still we need a central area and that central area will not only benefit sports tourism but it will provide for the youth. How many times do we see problems with youth in Dededo, Yigo, and Astumbo. Providing that facility with the federations help with providing programs, this is a positive step.

A public private partnership is a win-win situation. I humbly ask for your support with this bill.

4. Torgun Smith

Mr. Smith: My name is Torun Smith and I been a tennis player since the 70's. Joe taught me how to play tennis, him and his brother Pete in the late 70's. we are partners in the tennis academy of Guam and I'm also a private coach. I also coached the national team and played for the national team. I'm also a silver medalist in the Micronesian Games, one step below coach Joe. I also was a past president of the federation in the 90's treasure of the federation in the 90's. I'm currently a board member. I'm the tournament director of the Guam futures, which is an international ATP points in professional sanctioned for the ITF. That is a little bit of my background. I'm here in support of the bill. Just having more courts on Guam would be a benefit particularly in the north where tennis courts are lacking. I remember when there were tennis courts in every village and now there skate parks or what have you. I know GMTF has a lot of

programs for the national teams, local tournaments, and national tournaments. So there is a lot that is going on with tennis here. We had officials from the Guam futures go to the Tokyo Open, which is the highest level of tournament and some of our 16, and 17-year-old line umpires were calling lines for famous tennis stars. League tennis and team tennis for youth and adults and more interscholastic for lower levels besides high school we can get tennis into the middle schools. When and if we are granted this land we have U.S. TA provides a service to help design the land. We will work with the international tennis federation and maybe FIFA. I had inquires from players from Japan and Korea asking to bring camps and students for weeks at a time but we don't have a venue to say yes. So, this will help bring tennis to everybody. I mentioned in my written testimony that there can be something that can memorialize Bill Camacho because this was his passion. So perhaps we can name a courts or part of the facility after him.

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you Mr. Smith. Mr. Pete Calvo.

5. Pete Calvo

Mr. Calvo: Thank you very much Chairman Pangelinan. (read written testimony; see attach). I just want to make a comment we have a great partnership with the football association. I wish the non-profits organization could take the same kind of program that soccer has provided for the island of Guam. I wish tennis all the luck. The more facilities we have the more opportunities we have for our kids, elders, and community to interact. So we support this bill. Our thing is at some point in time all these facilities are being built individually will have to be tied as a sports complex and to tie that in you need an administrative building. We have to plan for the integration of all facilities to be operated cohesively.

6. Rick Ninete

Mr. Ninete: My name is Rick Ninete and I'm with Parks and Recs and I manage the Ninete Tennis Center. The testimonies today gave many good points. In 1985 I was tasked to survey all the tennis courts and I courted 22 public courts. At that time they were not maintained so they turned into boonies. I was the national federation president for over 16 years and in my experience it has started out with Joe Paulino in 972. We wouldn't be here if it wasn't for him. I was hired by ITF in 1993 to do a circuit in Micronesia and I started in Nauru. While I was in Nauru they have associations but the Philippines association out number the local and they had a problem on who represents Nauru. So when I came back I said I'm going to change that and I was going to make the Guam tennis association the nation association of Guam. I hope that this bill 116 is passed. In addition I would like to name the complex the Joe Paulino tennis complex and the tennis stadium the Bill Camacho tennis stadium.

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you very much Mr. Ninete. That concludes the testimony for this panel is there anybody else who wishes to testify. Is there any question from this panel?

Panel Comments and Questions

Senator Muna-Barnes: I just think it's important mr. calvo to know to look at the successes of these non-profit organization. I think it's time to move on all of those positives. So I will work with the speaker to address all the concerns you brought fourth today. Thank you Mr. Speaker

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Senator Ada?

Senator Ada: I do have a concern about section 3 on the terms of the lease. I understand what that means but if that is not in there is that a deal breaker.

Mr. George Lai: It might be possible if we don't get enough grant then we might have to run it like a business and borrow money and mortgage the land but by then we should have a plan to pay back the mortgage. I would prefer to leave this there but if we don't need to borrow then we will not do that. It just gives us some flexibility.

I don't think there is any provision in here that says you are going to go out and mortgage the property that the legislature has a say in it. I would have some concern about the mortgage wording. Thank you

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you we will take those concerns under consideration and will try to work with you. Thank you very much gentlemen that conclude the public hearing on bill 116.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds 2 3 that the Guam National Tennis Federation ("GNTF"), is a duly registered nonprofit organization engaged in the development and promotion of sports activities, 4 5 namely the sport of tennis, and is the governing body of tennis on Guam. GNTF is responsible for nominating athletes to the Guam National Olympic Committee for 6 selection to Team Guam in international competitions, for training National Team 7 8 and Junior National Team players, for hosting international and local tournaments, for running various programs aimed at introducing tennis to Guam's youth and 9 developing young players, and conducting community outreach clinics to promote 10 11 tennis (and sports generally) to the island community.

- It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to solidify Guam's image as a bona fide international sports destination in support of expanding our tourism destination to include Sports Tourism for Guam.
- I Liheslaturan Guahan recognizes that Guam is poised to become a major regional player in world-class level international tennis events, contributing to the Guam Visitors Bureau's goal of developing Sports Tourism.
- I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that it is the intent of the GNTF to provide a venue for international tennis tournaments at which elite international players may and develop the sport of tennis through the introduction and development of tennis to the youth, therby providing productive and healthy alternatives to sedentary or destructive behavior.
 - I Liheslaturan Guahan recognizes that the Guam National Tennis Federation is committed to providing programs and competition to the adult community, contributing to the health and well being of the community.

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I Liheslaturan Guahan further recognizes that the Guam National Tennis Federation is proposing to build a multi-court facility that meet the standards for international competition as required by the ITF. The construction of a comprehensive tennis center will promote Guam's image as an international sports destination as well as provide a facility for the Guam National Tennis Federation to implement programs for the benefit of Guam's youth and general population.

1	Section 2. Authorization to lease land. I Maga'lahen Guåhan is
2	authorized to lease a portion, no less than 20,235± square meters of land area, of

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

I would like to give you a little background of the Guam National Tennis Federation. The present Guam National Tennis Federation's roots go back to 1972 when it was first chartered as the Guam Tennis Club (GTC). GNTF is now the governing body of tennis in Guam. As the governing body, GNTF is the final decision on Guam's representation for regional and international tennis sporting competition such as the South Pacific Games, Mini Games, Micronesian Games, and the North Pacific Jr. Qualifier events. This year, the GNTF successfully celebrated its 39th Chamorro Open Tennis Classic with multiple Skilled and Open Divisions tournament challenges.

The leasing of this land in the Municipality of Dededo to GNTF is consistent with promotion of sports in the northern part of the island where there is a high population with few venues for sporting activities. The GNTF currently hosts a number of tournaments each year, such as the Quality Cup/Shirley's Memorial in January; Chamorro Open in March/April; the National Team Qualifier and the National Pacific Qualifier in June; and the Juniors Tournament in May, September, and December; Additionally, GNTF assists Guamerica in facilitating the Governor's Cup and Shell Jr. Cup in July. Recently, we've added the Guam Future's International event to this list. Obtaining a lease for this land will go a long way in ensuring that GNTF continues to be able to hosts these events at a quality venue.

Last month, Bill Camacho, GNTF President passed away unexpectedly. I have the unenviable task now as the incoming president to ensure that his vision of an international tennis facility be built at the Dededo Sports Complex

Unfortunately, Bill is not physically here today. However, I would like to think that his spirit is here, encouraging us all for the passage of Bill 116-31. Again, thank you for the opportunity to speak in support of Bill 116-31.

I am submitting this letter of interest to lease approximately five (5) acres of land at the Dededo Sports Complex, a portion of Lot No. 10142-New, Municipality of Dededo, for the construction of a tennis center. We believe that such center will serve two important goals. First, it will put Guam on the international professional/tourist tennis map thus leading to significant economic benefits. Second, such center will inevitably promote tennis (and sports generally) on Guam, particularly among our youth.

The Guam National Tennis Federation (GNTF) is the governing body of tennis on Guam. The federation is responsible for nominating athletes to the Guam National Olympic Committee for selection to Team Guam in international competitions, for training our National Team and Junior National Team players, for hosting international professional and local amateur tournaments, for running various programs aimed at introducing tennis to our youth and developing young players, and conducting community outreach clinics to expand tennis (and a healthy lifestyle generally) to the island community. Our current board of directors includes myself, Vice-President Sandra Low, Secretary Swami Swami, Treasurer Joseph Cruz and board members Torgun Smith, Joseph Cepeda, Landon Nadler, Joven Acosta, and Curt Wyatt.

I am asking for your support by authorizing the government of Guam to lease a portion of the property described above to GNTF for the construction of a tennis facility.



Madam Chair, Senator Muna-Barnes, and distinguished Committee Members:

On Bill No. 116-31, the department supports the establishment of a venue for tennis that would allow for world-class level international tennis events that would attract elite international tennis players and be used by our local tennis players as well.

We recognize the Guam National Tennis Federation's role in the promotion and development of tennis in Guam and support their effort to provide opportunities for tennis to flourish in Guam and abroad. The potential for tennis to contribute to sports tourism is only enhanced by the building of a world class facility. These opportunities will inspire our youth and community to get active and involved.

If this arrangement can be formatted like the Guam Football (soccer) Association, our department has no problem supporting the intent and will deliver what is necessary for the GNTF to succeed. However, we are concerned about the leasehold provision and the obligation to the arrangement that may be negotiated by the GNTF. As you may recall, the contracts negotiated by the Guam Baseball Federation, which went belly up, is now on our plate to satisfy the obligation. We are not saying it will fail, but need to ensure we are shielded from that possibility.

Additionally, may we request public access and general use be stipulated to ensure the community at large is able to engage in the benefit this facility may bring. Indeed, as with all our partners, we require data to be submitted to track use and demographics as well as monitor financial responsibility.

The History of the Guam National Tennis Federation

The history of the Guam National Tennis Federation dates back to 1972 when the Guam Tennis Club (GTC) was chartered. The first constitution was written for the GTC with about ten charter members, and led by Joe Paulino, its first president.

In 1986, GTC was renamed the Tennis Association of Guam (TAG) under the leadership of Helga Hosie and became affiliated with International Tennis Federation (ITF) and the U.S. Tennis Association (USTA).

In 1994, under my leadership as President of TAG, I established a governing body of tennis for Guam by renaming TAG the Guam National Tennis Federation. As the governing body, GNTF makes the final decisions on the memberships of the state teams for the South Pacific Games, Mini Games, Micro Games, North Pacific Jr. Qualified, and any other national or international representation for Guam.

GNTF has secured membership with the Guam National Olympic Committee, Oceania Tennis Federation, and continues its strong ties with the International Tennis Federation and USTA.

With the growth of the GNTF the federation has provided its members with classic tournaments, junior tournaments, tennis camps, tennis leagues, and has even coordinated visits from tennis greats like Tracy Austin and Ai Sugiyama as well as visits from ITF's master professionals Rob Casey, Joe Brooke, Rodney Kop, Tan Poh Seng, Dan Santorum, and the late Lency Tenai. Daniel O'Connell, ITF Development Officer has made almost annual visits to Guam since GNTF became affiliated with the ITF.

Now, as GNTF celebrates its 39th anniversary with the 39th Chamorro Open Tennis Classic it is my hope that Bill No. 116-31 will be passed as Guam's tennis community has grown and needs this venue. It is my sincere hope that should this bill be passed that consideration be given to naming the new tennis complex the Joe Paulino Tennis Complex, and in addition, that the stadium court be named the Bill Camacho Stadium.

Buenas yan Hafa Adai Mr. Chairman and Members of the Guam Legislature, I am Joann G. Camacho, Acting General Manager of the Guam Visitors Bureau. I appreciate the opportunity to speak with you today.

One niche market that holds great promise in enhancing and diversifying Guam's visitor industry is sports tourism. Guam's unique geography, climate, and culture make it poised to become the "sports paradise" of our Asia-Pacific region. What Hawaii is to the United States with regards to sports tourism, Guam should aspire to be for Japan, Korea, China, Hong Kong and our other Asia-Pacific neighbors.

One of the Guam Visitors Bureau's goals is to continue to develop the island as the choice destination for international sporting events and training camps. Just this year alone, Guam has benefited from international sporting events such as the Guam Rugby International Tournament, Guam Cup Large Ball Table Tennis Tournament, Smokin' Wheels Guam Global Junior Circuit Event and the Guam Governor's JLPGA Golf Tournament. Additionally, over fourteen professional teams from Korea and Japan and six college level teams have just completed their winter training here. More prominent perhaps are the thousand of off-island visitors that come each year to Guam to enjoy our world-class golf facilities and ocean sports.

It is clear that the aggressive promotion of sports tourism can bring many more visitors to our island while at the same time raising the overall visibility of our entire tourism product. I support Bill 116-31 because it is good for the community of Guam to promote healthy activity for fitness for youth and adults. Sports are an important part of a community and Guam National Tennis Federation (GNTF) has shown they would like to expand the opportunity for tennis to grow on Guam. The lease of this land will allow GNTF to build more tennis courts in the northern part of Guam, where tennis courts are lacking.

Currently, there are mainly 3 tennis venues available to the public, Rick Ninete Tennis Center in Hagatna, Tiyan courts and Tamuning Tennis courts by the mayor's office. Only 2 of these venues have lights for use at night. Other venues are mostly at the hotels and require membership or not available for public use. To have the opportunity to build more tennis courts in the area of the sports complex where so many other sport and fitness venues are currently located would be a great boost to the development of tennis programs. There is a very large population of residents in the northern part of Guam and this would make the option of playing tennis more convenient.

I know the GNTF is committed to tennis programs for youth and adults. This land would give an opportunity for GNTF to expand programs including but not limited to, development of youth and national teams; provide a venue for local tournaments and international tournaments; officials

training, league tennis, team tennis for youth and adult, coaching opportunities, community clinics for juniors & adults, interscholastic programs for all ages, sports tourism.

I believe the GNTF plans to work with USTA's on the design of a complex to include main "center" court plus several additional courts in a park setting, as well as seeking grants and funding from International Tennis Federation development sources.

My understanding is the GNTF plans to work with the mayors and GVB to promote sports tourism through tennis and this new facility. GNTF currently has been granted the opportunity to host the "Guam Futures" which is a tournament that is part of the ITF Pro Circuit. 2010 was our 1st year for the tournament and we had fantastic response with over 150 entries from around the world, unfortunately the event is limited to a draw of 32 players in the main draw. The event promoted Guam around the region and the world. Players who attended expressed interest in coming back to train when their countries are too cold for outside tennis.

I have also had inquiries for individuals and groups from Japan and Korea asking for a venue to bring large groups of students for several days to weeks to train on Guam.

As some of you may know GNTF lost our late president, my friend Bill Camacho to an unexpected and sudden heart attack, just over a month ago, March 15, 2010. I know Bill was very passionate about this tennis complex/park project and I share his passion and want to see the project through in his memory. I would like to suggest the tennis park complex be named in Bill's memory, if this was to be included in this bill and become law, his efforts would never be forgotten.

I believe GNTF would also like to see improvements made to the existing public tennis facilities for all the same reasons stated to improve our sport. I will also be working with the GNTF to see what can be done to facilitate improvements to the existing venues.

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

Buenas yan Hafa Adai! Our department has reviewed the bills as presented, and wishes to report its findings and recommendations.

BILL NO. 116-31 (COR)

The department recommends the following changes be made to Section 2 of the Bill:


"I Maga'lahen Guahan is authorized to lease a portion, no less than 20,235± square meters of land area, of a portion of Lot No. 10142 NEW-R4, Municipality of Dededo, consisting of 54,396± square meters to the Guam National Tennis Federation".

Land Management supports the implementation of programs that benefit Guam's youth and general population and hereby approves the approval of the bill with the recommended changes as mentioned above.

BILL 65-31 (COR)

After review and research into the bill our departments findings indicate that the government land, Lot Nos. 5138-2-R3NEW-1-2 and 5138-2-R3NEW-1-R2, has been administratively transferred to the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), to allow their department to apply for and receive federal, local and private grants to build a public facility.

In addition to that, Lot No. 5138-2-R3NEW-1-1 (formerly a portion of Lot No.5138-2-R3) is currently being leased by the Guam Rehabilitation and Workshop Center, Inc., a not for profit Guam Corporation for a term of twenty (20) years, commencing on June 1, 1993 and ending on May 31, 2013, with an annual rental of One Dollar (\$1.00), as authorized by Public Law 19-34.



The department has determined that if the bill is passed, Section 3, directs the department to consolidate these properties without any compensation. Due to the extensive research, field survey and mapping of these three (3) lots, the department does anticipate a fiscal impact of approximately Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) for the services.

The documents to support our comments are attached for your easy reference.

In view of the above, the department does not recommend the passage of Bill 65-31 (COR), however, we have no objection to the approval of Bill No. 116-31 (COR).

AN ACT TO APPROVE THE LEASE BY AND BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM AND THE GUAM NATIONAL TENNIS FEDERATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the Guam National Tennis Federation ("GNTF"), is a duly registered non-3 profit organization engaged in the development and promotion of sports activities, 4 namely the sport of tennis, and is the governing body of tennis on Guam. GNTF is 5 responsible for nominating athletes to the Guam National Olympic Committee for 6 selection to Team Guam in international competitions, for training National Team 7 and Junior National Team players, for hosting international and local tournaments, 8 9 for running various programs aimed at introducing tennis to Guam's youth and developing young players, and conducting community outreach clinics to promote 10 tennis (and sports generally) to the island community. 11

- It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to solidify Guam's image as a bona fide international sports destination in support of expanding our tourism destination to include Sports Tourism for Guam.
- I Liheslaturan Guahan recognizes that Guam is poised to become a major
 regional player in world-class level international tennis events, contributing to the
 Guam Visitors Bureau's goal of developing Sports Tourism.

- I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that it is the intent of the GNTF to provide a venue for international tennis tournaments at which elite international players may and develop the sport of tennis through the introduction and development of tennis to the youth, therby providing productive and healthy alternatives to sedentary or destructive behavior.
 - I Liheslaturan Guahan recognizes that the Guam National Tennis Federation is committed to providing programs and competition to the adult community, contributing to the health and well being of the community.
 - I Liheslaturan Guahan further recognizes that the Guam National Tennis Federation is proposing to build a multi-court facility that meet the standards for international competition as required by the ITF. The construction of a comprehensive tennis center will promote Guam's image as an international sports destination as well as provide a facility for the Guam National Tennis Federation to implement programs for the benefit of Guam's youth and general population.

Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, the lease by the government of Guam to the GNTF of the Lot and improvements thereon, *shall* be executed by *I Maga' lahi* and the duly authorized representative of the GNTF and *shall* require the concurrence of *I Liheslaturan Guahan*;

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
