#### COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

#### I. OVERVIEW

Bill 40-32 (COR) was introduced on February 8, 2013 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation on February 8, 2013.

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation convened a public hearing on Bill 40-32 (COR) on February 19, 2013 at 5:30 pm in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on the measure.

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on February 11, 2013 (5-Day Notice), and again on February 15, 2013 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 5:31 pm.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

#### Chief John Wusstig (Acting)

Provided oral and written testimony (see attached)

Mr. Wusstig is currently Battalion Chief and the Acting Fire Chief of the Guam Fire Department (GFD). He states support for Bill 40-32, particularly changing the classification of penalty from "misdemeanor" to "civil violation," to enable the timely adjudication of citations issued by GFD, for fire code violations. Chief Wusstig states that GFD conducts inspections to alleviate fire hazards that can potentially result in physical injury, loss of property, or loss of life. Although GFD attempts to achieve compliance through education, GFD may still need the leverage of penalty assessment to ensure compliance with the Guam Fire Code. Fines will assist Fire Officers in obtaining compliance while performing necessary regulatory function of inspections/investigations associated with the Fire Code. Chief Wusstig closes by re-stating GFD's full support of Bill 40-32.

#### Phil Tydingco

Provided oral testimony

Mr. Tydingco is the Chief Deputy Attorney General (CDAG) with the Guam Office of the Attorney General. He testifies in support of the bill. States that he has been working with Sen. Tom Ada's office, as well as with the Guam Fire Department (GFD), and is aware of the situation as explained in the Legislative Findings & Intent of the bill. States that many similar citations exist in the Traffic Court. The enforcement of fire code citations occur in the Traffic Court Violations Bureau of the Judiciary. Current statute classifies the violation of Fire Codes as a Misdemeanor. Procedurally, the adjudication of these violations would require that GFD file the citation with the Attorney General's Office for prosecution. Given the limited manpower resources at the AGO, the prosecution of most fire code violations would most likely be given a low priority than most of the criminal cases handled by the AGO. In effect, the ability to enforce fire code violations would be very much constrained.

CDAG Tydingco clarified that since 1979, the custom and practice in the Judiciary has been to adjudicate the citations in the Traffic Court. However, in January of 2013, the Superior Court issued a Decision & Order that the Traffic Court is not the proper venue for adjudication of fire code violations. Instead, the adjudication of criminal cases should be conducted in Superior Court and must be prosecuted by the AGO or a representative of the AGO. If a guilty verdict is rendered by the Court, the violator would be subject to a \$1,000 fine and up to one year imprisonment, and would have a criminal record for life.

The reclassification of a fire code violation from a "Misdemeanor" to a "Civil Violation", with an associated penalty schedule would be the more practical way to achieve enforcement of the Fire Code. CDAG Tydingco expressed support, and hopes that bill becomes law. Believes that with passage of law, the Fire Prevention Bureau should be able to operate they way they are supposed to function—to ensure compliance and that would be through fines. Punishment as it is now does not necessarily fit the crime; states that loose wires to extinguishers not inspected regularly should not necessarily be cited as a criminal offense and imprisonment.

#### Discussion

**Chair Ada** asks CDAG Tydingco to clarify if, since January 2013, the position of the Court has been that if the AGO representative is not present at court at the time, then that was basis for the court to dismiss?

**CDAG Tydingco** responds Yes, the case was dismissed, but the Opinion orders the Bureau not to accept citations issued by the Fire Marshals. Since the Opinion was released, the order was that they (the Bureau) was not to receive any of the tickets or violations that Fire Prevention issued. Not a good thing clearly because then people will know that enforcement is not going on. Stresses importance of legislation, and highlighted the inconsistency that the Court rules say prosecutors should only show up if the other side shows up with a lawyer. In this sense, Traffic Court is kept more as a decriminalized friendly court, and less adversarial. Believes this is a good policy to consider.

**Senator Aguon** states that this is an issue affecting GPD as well, so looks forward to forthcoming legislation addressing this. Commends Chair for moving aggressively on this.

**Senator pangelinan** asks CDAG Tydingco to clarify why Court is not accepting citations. How would this legislation cure the acceptance of citations? What was the driving policy of the decision of the Court to no longer accept the citations?

**CDAG Tydingco** recollects what was said in the Opinion. (1) By law, fire code violations are Misdemeanor criminal violations that warrant the presence of the AGO, or AGO representative. for prosecution. (2) Furthermore, the Traffic Court is a venue for Civil Violations; current statute classifies fire code violation as a misdemeanor, a criminal violation. Therefore, Traffic Court would not be a proper venue, notwithstanding the fact that the Traffic Court has been the venue that has been used for adjudication of fire code violations for decades.

Under the current statute, the adjudication of criminal cases should be conducted in Superior Court and must be prosecuted by the AGO or a representative of the AGO. If a guilty verdict is rendered by the Court, the violator would be subject to a \$1,000 fine and up to one year imprisonment, and would have a criminal record for life. Realistically, the AGO has limited manpower resources; consequently, fire code violations would, in most cases not be filed by the AGO for prosecution.

The reclassification of a fire code violation from a "Misdemeanor" to a "Civil Violation", with an associated penalty schedule would be the more practical way to achieve enforcement of the Fire Code. CDAG Tydingco expressed support, and hopes that bill becomes law. Believes that with passage of Bill 40-32, the Fire Prevention Bureau should be able to operate they way they are supposed to function—to ensure compliance through the assessment of fines, if warranted. Punishment as it is now does not necessarily fit the crime; states that violations ranging from loose wires to fire extinguishers not being inspected regularly should not necessarily be cited as a criminal offense and imprisonment.

**CDAG Tydingco** said that a fire code violation is classified as a Misdemeanor crime. If there is no prosecutor to prosecute, the Court does not believe it should be prosecuting those cases.

**Senator pangelinan** clarifies that Court is not even accepting the citation. If the Court accepts the citation and the prosecutor is there, then it goes forward. But, currently, Court is not even accepting the citation.

**CDAG Tydingco** responds that is correct.

**Senator pangelinan** asks again how does this cure the acceptance of the citations?

**CDAG Tydingco** responds that by reclassifying fire code violations as civil violations, you don't need prosecutors for civil violations.

**Senator pangelinan** then clarifies so the citation, under current statute, goes directly to Superior Court?

**CDAG Tydingco** clarifies that under the current statute, GFD sends citations to AGO so that AGO can fill out criminal complaints or indictments.

**Senator pangelinan** wants the record to reflect that there is nothing wrong with the statute, the problem now is how it is being enforced, and the decision to be made now is are we going to change this policy?

**CDAG Tydingco** responds Yes.

**Senator pangelinan** asks then because the Fire Code, and adherence to it is for prevention of injury in public spaces, what happens if it is just a civil violation and it is easier to pay off the fine than it is to comply, what is the remedy after that? Further asks, what if the fine is just paid each year, but the effort to correct the violation is never made, and public safety is threatened, is at stake?

**Chief Wusstig** responds to Sen. pangelinan's last question, there is a progression of fees for recurring offenses.

**Senator pangelinan** clarifies that these are brand new fine amounts? What are the current fine amounts for a first offense?

**Chief Wusstig** responds \$75 is the current fine for Fire code violations.

**Senator pangelinan** asks when \$75 fine schedule was adopted?

Chief Wusstig responds 1997, and introduces Capt. Joey Manibusan, the lead Code official.

**CDAG Tydingco** adds that Sen. pangelinan raises a good point that might have been overlooked. If single or continuing violation resulted in an injury or death, it may be necessary to amend to turn into a criminal matter from a civil matter, when entering into the fourth violation. Suggests four or more violation within, say, five years of the first violation will move you from Traffic Court to Superior Court, and it will then be a misdemeanor—"scofflaws." Three to five years or whatever sounds appropriate for repeat offenders or scofflaws.

**Senator pangelinan** asks if there is a rationale for raising the fine?

Chief Wusstig responds that it was taken out of one of codes that has fines, but rationale seems obvious that if correction isn't made after first violation, the intention is that with the increase in fine, the second violation will likely be avoided.

**Senator pangelinan** asks who receives the fine? Explains that GFD has the ability to cite businesses and individuals in which the direct beneficiary of the proceeds of that citation goes to the citing entity, and in most instances, common practice is that citing entities should not be tempted to cite more tickets because they directly benefit. States that he is not making a statement about the integrity of the fire officials, but rather does not want to see citing entity as direct beneficiary of fines collected from citations issued. Asks that GFD and AGO think about

if whether fine should go directly to citing agency or General Fund, and then appropriation be made to agency from there.

**Chair Ada** asks where fines go to today? Existing law states that fees go to the FLAME Fund. Is there any other situation where GFD would collect penalties from a non-compliant citizen, other than through the courts? For example, would you be able to give a citation to a business and then he pays GFD?

**Chief Wusstig** responds that the Court has set up the system; there is accountability in the issuance of tickets—the Court receives it, they take out their administrative fees, the monies go to the FLAME Fund, which GFD is not able to access alone. Adds that the citizen is able to challenge in court, and thus the Court will be able to collect if needed.

**Senator McCreadie** asks what currently happens now with misdemeanor violations? If this bill becomes law, will it be retroactive to the Decision and Order (D&O) issued on January 10, 2013?

**CDAG Tydingco** responds that there is a statutory legislative principle that if legislature must make clear that it is retroactive. When this law goes into effect, it will only apply going forward. If citation was issued before law goes into effect, it will still be viewed as a criminal misdemeanor, but no one is adjudicating that, or it could be sent to AGO, and they have up to one year to exercise prosecutorial discretion to file a criminal case.

**Senator McCreadie** asks if there is a number of violators since the D & O was issued in January?

**Chief Wusstig** responds that GFD has stopped issuing citations since January 10. States that GFD still has inspections are still in effect, but no fines are collected or citations are issued. States that most important method of compliance is through education, outreach, through programs and through inspectors who go out and educate.

**CDAG Tydingco** adds that they've communicated with GFD and that if there is an egregious case AGO should be informed so that criminal charges can be filed. Recommends that bill be amended to include criminal penalty for repeat offender, fourth or more.

Chair Ada clarifies that after the third offense, within say a three year period, the violation should be deemed a misdemeanor?

**CDAG Tydingco** responds Yes, shall be punishable as a misdemeanor crime or petty misdemeanor—your decision what level of punishment should be. Petty misdemeanor – 0-60 days in jail, max fine \$500 or misdemeanor – 0-1 year jail, max \$1000 fine.

**Senator Morrison** asks are most violators contractors?

**Chief Wusstig** responds No, most are parking violations (blocking of hydrants, fire lanes).

**Chair Ada** concludes hearing. The public hearing was adjourned at 6:06 pm.

#### III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation has substituted Bill 40-32 (COR) with the following significant changes:

• In Sections 2 (b) and 3 (b), each offense following the first offense of the same fire code is subject to increasing penalties, with the fourth offense of the same fire code within a 12-month period deemed punishable as a misdemeanor.

The Guam Fire Department supports Bill 40-32 as it addresses the importance in changing the language in the law from a **misdemeanor** to a **civil violation**, thus maintaining our ability to provide enforcement of the Fire Code as well as continue to provide assurance to the community that public safety is a high priority.

#### Comments:

1/ Currently, the Guam Fire Department (GFD) is assessing violators at a rate of \$70 per violation (in accordance with established fee schedules, 10 GCA, Ch. 72, \$72106 - FLAME Fund). Bill 40-32 (COR), proposes a \$100 charge for the first offense with subsequent increases for the second and third. According to data provided by the GFD, a total of 403 first-time violations are projected annually. As such, the Bureau anticipates increases in revenues to the FLAME Fund by approximately 43% or \$12,090 annually [403 violations x \$100 first offense = \$40,300 - \$28,210 (403 violations x \$70 first offense)]. It should be noted that GFD has not experienced any repeat violators since June 2012. Any repeat offender would be subjected to higher penalties at which time the Bureau anticipates revenue streams to increase correspondingly based on the number of offenses above the first and dependent upon the number of violations thereof.

Bill no. 41-32 intends to make it mandatory for the courts to impose sentences to include mandatory incarceration of those found guilty of family violence, to include first time offenders. Based the Department of Correction's FY2012 expenditures, the cost of incarcerating an inmate is approximately \$37,230 a year at an estimated average cost of \$102 per day. GPD statistics showed a total of 272 individuals were arrested for family violence in FY2012. Assuming a 50% guilty rate (136 individuals) for first time offenders, the potential fiscal impact would cost about \$204 per person or \$27,500 per year if the bill is passed. This cost will potentially increase if additional guilty verdicts are made and if individuals have more than one offense; it will increase costs and add burden to facilities and resources of other GovGuam departments/agencies. The proposed legislation my suggest options of monetary penalties rather than incarcerate to strenghten the opnalties

#### Comments on Legislative Bill No. 44-32 (COR)

The bill is seeking to transfer approximately 10 Million in air travel mileage which is separate and apart from those air travel miles identified by P.L. 31-117. Such air miles will be used to fund student travel involving academics, sports and cultural activities as approved by the Superintendent of Education. Because such air travel mileage is earned by the Government of Guam, specific airlines serving Guam may charge a transfer fee for transferring from Government of Guam to each student, resulting in significant fiscal impact to the annual appropriations of the Guam Department of Education. As an example, Delta Airlines charge a fee of \$0.01 per mile plus \$30.00 transaction fees. Using this as example, the potential fiscal impact could be as low as \$70,000, based on the following assumptions:

- Transfer fees used by Delta Airlines are \$0.01 per mile plus a \$30 transaction fees.
- In a given fiscal year, approximately 500 students will travel to the United States, all using the travel mileage available for GDOE that Delta has agreed to accommodate.
- Approximately 5,500,000 travel air miles will be consumed by these 500 students.
- Each student is a separate transaction fee.

For United Continental, the potential fiscal impact can be as high as \$82,500, which is based on a transfer cost \$15 per increments of 1,000 air miles for a total Mileage Plus transfer of 5,500,000.

Both airlines do have a limitation of 4 transfer events per account which means that the Department of Administration will need to negotiate with the airlines to allow unlimited transfers under the Government of Guam account.
