### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

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**Section 1.** Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority is seriously underfunded, resulting in consistent, chronic shortages in all operational areas that jeopardize the ability of the Guam Memorial Hospital to adequately fulfill its mission.

The full scope and negative impact of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority's outstanding debts, in excess of Twenty-three Million Dollars (\$23,000,000), came to light during the Joint Status Hearing conducted by the Committee on Health & Human Services and the Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land on April 18, 2012. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that in 2012, the federally approved discount provider for medical supplies intercepted approximately Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) (taken from Medicare reimbursements through the U.S. Treasury), for non-payment of GMHA's debt. In March 2013, GMHA, through the efforts of Governor Edward Calvo, paid Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) of its outstanding obligations using Compact-Impact funds, thus reducing its obligation to approximately Eighteen Million Dollars (\$18,000,000) as of March 31, 2013. The retirement of GMHA's debt is essential to its ability to focus on patient care and its preventive programs. The provision of medical care should be the core of the Hospital's mission, not the burden placed on operations by its debt. For the past seven months in Fiscal Year 2013, GMHA has accumulated approximately over half a million dollars in interest charges from vendors. This added burden further exacerbates GMHA's financial condition.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Public Law 30-200, as amended by Public Law 30-235, authorized the GMHA to enter into a line of credit, revolving fund, or direct loan not to exceed Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000). However, only Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000) has been borrowed to date. I

1 Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Governor Edward Calvo has committed to

2 pledge Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) annually from Compact Impact funds to

the Guam Memorial Authority specifically to use as a repayment source for this

4 purpose.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to allow the financing of GMHA's debt using *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* pledge of Compact Impact funds as the repayment source for the additional Thirteen Million Dollars (\$13,000,000) balance or any available balance of the Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000) borrowing authority, pursuant to Public Law 30-200, whichever is greater.

**Section 2.** A new Subsection (10), in conformance with Public Law 30-235, and a Subsection (11) are hereby *added* to § 80109(s) of Chapter 80, Division 4 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

"(10) This Guarantee is a general obligation of the government of Guam, subject to the full faith and credit of the government of Guam. The Guarantor consents to any and all extension of time and waiver or modification of obligations guaranteed hereunder.



# SENATOR DENNIS G. RODRIGUEZ, JR. COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 132-32 (COR)

I. OVERVIEW: The Committee on Health & Human Services, Health Insurance Reform, Economic Development and Senior Citizens conducted a public hearing on June 13, 2013. The hearing convened at 9:00AM in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of BILL 132-32(COR), An act to add a new Section 11 to Public Law 30-200 relative to expanding the borrowing ability of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority by including the authorization to also enter into revolving loan funds, and direct loan funds

### II. Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via hand-delivery/fax and/or email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on June 4, 2013 (5-day notice), and again on June 7, 2013 (48-hour notice).

The public hearing on agenda item Bill No. 132-32 (COR) was called to order at 9:06 a.m.

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION.

Chairman Rodriguez: I would like to thank the Governor for working with me in looking at several alternatives in helping the hospital with its debts. The Governor agreed to dedicate 2 million from Compact Impact Fund.

Lester Carlson: This was a collaborative effort between the Governor's office and Senator Rodriguez to try to find a funding mechanism to help the debt of the Guam Memorial Hospital. I believe this is the third attempt to fund the funding source and I believe third time is a charm. We were asked to assist the senator in being able to come up with a funding source that will take the existing 25 million that's contained in Public Law 30-200 of which only 2 million was secured. So, that left \$13 million to the legislature, which to this day hasn't found a lender.

First we have to consider the full faith and confidence of the government. There needed to be a funding source that has a lot of coverage and has not been over tapped. The lending institutions would say that that one would be something I feel comfortable in lending money again. What needed to get done was to take our thinking and throw it to see if it sticks to the wall. We made a couple



calls to banks and if this funding source was available with legislative authorization to support it. We responded to an RFP. Given the funding source, I was given strong indications from 2 institutions that will be responsive of this, should it be passed.

Sometimes there are exercises that sound good but we want to make sure that the institutions were comfortable in lending the money. With that, I'm here with a message to deliver that there will be a letter of support from the Governor's office that you will receive tomorrow. in the meantime, please accept the full support of the Guam Economic Development Authority on Bill 132.

Chairman Rodriguez: Just to touch up on some of the comments, is that this is the third attempt to get funding for the hospital. I always say that this is a three legged approach to be taken. One, looking at the debt and looking at viable funding sources to subsidize the hospital. My concept also is putting in place measures to decrease the expenditures. One of them is an Urgent Care and funding it. Unlike in the pass in building the hospital and funding it, I believe that it has to be done simultaneously and we here at the legislature have to prepare and work hand in hand with the hospital.

Alan Ulrich: I want to thank GEDA for their support and we appreciate the collaboration between the Governor's office, GEDA and your office. Following up to what you said, we have many opportunities to improve at GMH and we appreciate your many endeavors for funding the hospital to contribute its mission. Relative to this bill, I want to thank you. I wasn't to clarify that the legislature approves funding. Through that legislation, we did obtain a loan through the back of Guam with the term date of 2018 with an interest rate. Currently Senator Rodriguez pointed out that we are receiving funding from the Healthy Futures Fund of about \$1 million to cover that debt. We currently have as of May 31, 3013 is \$10, 934,000 remaining. As we continue making funds from GovGuam the balance will be reduce. I want to clarify that the bill will create a mechanism to allow, based on the total loan, that we are able to fund that additional difference between the outstanding debt and the \$25 million. I did look at what the debt service would be and it is a 10 year commitment from Compact Impact funds of \$2 million per year. if we continue these funding sources, this will allow, with the \$25 million dent, would be fully amortized at over 10 years for paying about \$3 million. In general the \$3 million from two sources you are committing will fully amortize in loan if it's an attractive interest rate. We look forward in working with GEDA in finding the most appropriate financing in order to have a fully amortizing in 10 years.

In general the funding source through this bill is very positive. This will go towards paying down the liability we have on our vendors. Payment to vendors is something very important, we want to be able to pay them in a timely basis. Currently we are accruing about \$70,000 a month interest expenses for payments to vendors. We have received a letter from the department of treasury for the outstanding balance of about \$4.5 million. From the previous emails I've received it's about \$50,000 a month for the loan. With this type of financing, this would really go al long way. This is important for the hospital to get current with the vendors.

Vice Speaker Cruz: I support the idea of the hospital being given the assistance but i am concern about a couple of things. I'm glad we got the answer for the \$10,934,000 that was borrowed 2 years ago, I thought one of the things we want to pay is the outstanding tax liability. If I remember



correctly, we were supposed to pay rev & tax. If my memory serves me right in the attachment A to Bill 20, how much do you currently owe with Dept. of Rev &Tax?

Ulrich: I have outstanding as of May 31st is \$4,006,199. We also recorded that in our financial statement as of Sept 2012.

Vice Speaker: while I agree with the Chairman that an Urgent Care facility is necessary to address the excess amount of money that is owed because of the number of people coming to the emergency room that should be taken care of in a different fashion, i also concern of other tings problematic at the hospital. One how is your collection effort with Collections?

Ulrich: First of all, collections is an ongoing effort, since I started in December, I've been working with the staff to refine our processes, but better yet to define our processes to actually make them happen. I researched this week and I found on Section 80 of the code with credit collection policy at the hospital, which I wasn't aware existed. Many of the things that we are discussing now were actually emphasized in 1997. Certainly, we need to improve with our collection. through the end of May, we received 239,000 dollars from the Amnesty Loan Forgiveness program that goes through June 24 and making it appeal to the people because it is a 50% inducement to come and pay their balance. We talked about 20% discount for self insured or uninsured.

Vice Speakers: when you first came on, i provided a list of contractors that owed some money of the hospital totaling about half a million. How are we doing about the collections?

Ulrich: first, relative to conversations we had with Dept. Labor about HS workers, we've initiated process to really follow through with the clearances. Unfortunately, we don't have the ones for the H2 workers.

Vice Speaker: Why not? They've signed as obliged to pay the person they brought in to the hospital.

Ulrich: I don't know that for a fact.

Vice Speaker: How has the hospital recorded that construction company as being the obligor?

Ulrich: we don't record it as being the obligor. It would be the patient who is guarantor, much as if I go there they would know who my employer. We put that now in a separate class but the company itself is not the obligor of those debts, as I understand it.

Vice Speaker: when I initially asked for that listing before you came to the hospital. It was represented to me that those were signed by GMH employees that those were signed by companies as obligors of those people and not the patient themselves.

Ulrich: I will follow up on that

Vice Speaker: it's been six months and we haven't done anything on that pointed out to you that there's a company that gotten international award for safety and had a debt of about \$60,000. i just Chairman, Committee on Health & Human Services, Health Insurance Reform, Economic Development, & Senior Citizens

also read that that the government awarded a contract to a company with an outstanding of \$40,000 in obligations. So, I'm really having problems..i mean they are not going to charge the legislature if I go to the hospital and charge me as Benjamin Cruz, right.

Ulrich: right

Vice Speaker: I'm trying to figure how it could've been these companies were listed as the obligors for these individuals.

Ulrich: let me clarify, I don't know what was represented to you and to the committee whether the companies were obligor. My communication with the collections is that the people were responsible not the companies. Now, I'd be happy to reach out to those companies and ask them about hose claims. If the companies are willing to step forward to be responsible for these individuals, I'd be happy to go after them because you're right that would be easier to collect. if they are going to assume those collections.

Vice Speaker: talking about easy collections, when we had hearing on Bill 20, some of us were flabbergast about having 4,000 government employees who have outstanding debt with the hospital, was that a correct representation?

Ulrich: I'm not familiar with that exact number.

Chairman Rodriguez: That is the other bill that authorized us to tap into the annual leave. but, yes, there is a 4,000 government employees who are either patients themselves or who are the obligors of people they brought in.

Vice Speaker Cruz: so there are 4000 govguam employees who have the outstanding debts, it doesn't seem very difficult to figure out where those people are and to collect. What are the efforts?

Ulrich: Mr. Verga, before he left off island, talked to me. I have a meeting with my staff to institute the payroll deduction that still follows from 1997 in order to facilitate this. I appreciate learning about these GovGuam employees. So, yes, we are going to follow up on that

Vice Speaker: How much do these employees owe?

Ulrich: i dont have that information.

Chairman Rodriguez: it was about 6 million. When we spoke directly from the people from the HR and Business office, that they do know who these people are and attempted to go out and collect. Just like any other patients, they say that I have this bill, but I'm not able to pay it right now. What this bill would have done was to allow them to tap into their annual leave and be under some sort of promissory note, which they are not in right now, and use that and if they default you'll have the ability to garner on that.

Ulrich: with or without their ability to contribute annual leave, we still need the payroll deductions.

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Vice Speaker: during the last hearing on the annual leave bill, I noted that there were dome vacancies on the collections agency and that Mr. Verga corrected them that those vacancies were actually funded. Are you fully staffed now in collections?

Ulrich, no we are not, Vice speaker. When I spoke to you briefly after the hearing and pointed out the positions and I did do investigation. The current status of that as of today is that I've worked with the 4 leaders in the business office and we've revised the description of these jobs (2 positions). We have 4 positions we are looking into filling in and we have the descriptions ready as well as interview questions which we are on the process of moving on with that.

Vice Speaker: these vacancies were vacant since the beginning of the Fiscal Year last October and they've been vacant since. it is imperative that if you are doing collections and not just borrow money that you are able to be fully staff at the collections office.

Ulrich: I don't disagree with you, that is very valid. As I shared with you and I heard when there were positions available and was unfunded, we talked about it but you pointed out three of those positions were funded. There has been a discussion on holding off those positions in a budget management stand point and non clinical people, recognizing that we need that personal touch in collections. The positions have not been updated since 2007, which really needs to be updated.

Vice Speaker Cruz: While I agree with you that non clinical positions should be frozen for a while, I really do think that these are critical positions so you can restore your fiscal help so you can restore the hospital.

Ulrich: I agree

Senator Tom Ada: I realize that you've only been in the position for the past 6 month. I, too, fully support the initiatives that Senator Rodriguez has put up to help the hospital to generate revenues. So, it seem like we've been addressing one side of the equation, which is the revenue side. I'm not convinced, at least in the many discussions on plans in plugging up some of the holes in losing money. I know some of the discussions were the automation system and how basically we've gotten the software but there has been some incompatibility about it. Would it be reasonable to include in this bill in addressing that within the next 90 days, the hospital shall submit to the legislature a short term plan. This issue of filling vacancies has been in the discussions, can you comment on that?

Ulrich: your question opens up a very wide menu of responses. I'll try to be concise. I did receive a correspondence from one senator asking for specifically what you're requesting, which is reducing the deficit and a long term plan in taking a look at GMH and what happens about Medical City coming to Guam. I am working with this with the Board and Mr. Verga and figuring out what are we going to do and figuring out the short term fixes. We have provided a packet to Senator pangelinan to speaking with the appropriations committee regarding the fiscal year 2014 budget. We did work very hard at the executive level to have a balance budget. There are many components to what is needed to have a balance budget in GMH. We had just opened up an RFP that we released for TEFRA rebasing, which is a way of getting our Medicare reimbursement ancient old reimbursement to a current cost reimbursement. We'll have that information later this month. The purpose of that



RFP is to help GMH work with CMS and the legislature in Washington DC in order to affect more appropriate reimbursements. I had conversations with Mr. Gillan and Ms. Archangel relative to reimbursement from Medicaid and MIP is 55% below our cost on a per diem basis. We have to, remedy that. That is a part of our initiates relative to Fiscal Year 2014 budget.

The process of preparing RFP within certain department, believing that there are companies who can do it more efficiently what is happening right now. We are looking at a wide range of initiatives I reducing the cost of these revenues. I will be meeting Dr. Lizaman and Dr. Fegurgur this week relative to unitization of the operating room, which is an important source of revenue at the hospital. We are looking at how can we improve and increase our efficiencies to attract more revenue in the OR. It is not only about reimbursement but also how can we maximize an appropriately bill for the services we provided. It is a multifaceted issue we are dealing with.

I do want to comment on data processing initiatives. I shared back in May about problems we are having with our current members and sent us a letter that as of May 15, they were going to cut off services because we owe them about half a million dollars. This bill would allow us to pay that entity that we owe. They have softened their collection letter and we have negotiated that they will defer the lease payment for 6 months into 2014, which will give us some relief. Overall, we will have to decide on how to implement the software to take advantage of the business office side, clinical infrastructure, and financing. Mr. Verga, Dr. Lizama, and I have about 40 items that we are dealing with. We are going on a monthly cash flow deficit and having adequate revenues which lead to appropriate reimbursement that manages the operating systems that will enable to sustain GMH.

Senator Tom Ada: I am heartened by knowing that there are actual initiatives ongoing. My concern is that Mr. Ulrich might decide to leave tomorrow and if these programs might come into a stand still because these are your initiatives and it's not in a formal document that says this is our road map, at least for the short term.

Ulrich: I'm not planning on leaving tomorrow. I tell people that I am married to GMH, I am committed to GMH to make sure that it has its fiscal house in order and that we are operating in 2013 processes and operations and accountability. Once again, it's the executive team working with the Board of Trustees. We have created our plan but we haven't presented it to the Board. One thing I want to mention relative to collections, just as important to you as it is to us, I've talked about the last 3 months about RFO for a collections agency. It is much more complicated than I thought what the statute of limitations for pursuing collections is. This amnesty initiative was really meant to step forward to pay their obligations. It just makes it difficult for the people to be contacted. We have a \$133 million and 78,000 in counters and 35,000 guarantors, which is a significant amount for us in moving forward.

Senator San Nicolas: have all of these things been communicated to the Governor?

Ulrich: we did have a conversation,Mr. Verga, Dr. Lizama, Dr. Terlaje and Christine Tuquero had a meeting with the Governor last week. We want to make sure that we have timely communications with the Governor's office. I will be meeting with Ernie, his Chief Fiscal Officer with members of



BBMR and we are committed to increasing a higher level of communicating and where we are going forward.

Senator San Nicolas: The reason why I'm very curious about this is because everything I'm understanding is that we have a surplus but we don't have a deficit. In spite of that, we have a bill in front of us asking us to borrow money for our shortfalls and I'm trying to understand that if we have a surplus, why we are borrowing money. If we are having a deficit in the hospital then why are we telling our people that there are no deficit and then coming back asking to borrow \$13 million to pay vendors who are past due?

Ulrich: I cannot answer that because I'm not privileged to all the information in the GovGuam level. From s financial stand point, when we receive goods or supplies we have to set up a liability. Our financials that we present to you, where we have \$20 million of payables to vendors, that's on an accrual basis. From GMH standpoint for Fiscal 2013, we did not budget appropriation to pay for prior obligations. To the extent that the \$20 million has accumulated over years, we didn't say in our budget of \$93 million to pay off the vendors, therefore it was not appropriated. From our standpoint, we are running on a loss deficit. For a cash flow standpoint, we are also flowing in a deficit in our obligation. Once again, deficit can mean different things for people. For an accounting standpoint, we have an operating loss, outstanding liabilities. Under financing, this is helping us to pay a debt of liabilities. Once that's done, we can perhaps take X dollars of our \$142 million budget because it is covered by financing.

Senator San Nicolas: well that is from the current payables but because we are bleeding \$2 million a year, we are going to be accruing new payables and the cash flow that pays those vendors. So, that is the second concern that I have. We get that money to pay the vendors but we are not cash flow positive. With new supplies and materials, we are eventually going to run that deficit again with those hazards to the vendors in making up for the shortfalls.

Ulrich: that has been raised in previous hearings relative to liability.

Senator San Nicolas: the reason why I'm asking this question is if the deficit is gone and we have a surplus of \$5 million in the government, why are we going to borrow \$13 million and putting us on the hook in the next ten years if the money is already there today. The reason why this is my concern because in 2015, our debt is going to go up to \$15 million. We have an \$8million balloon payment to the hospital that is due in 2015, 1.2million debt service for the completion of Ukudu expansion and no we're going to tag another 2 million on 2015 debt service amount. If the money is there today, why we are asking future generations to borrow money.

Ulrich: that is a question I cannot answer because I only have a limited knowledge. I only know GMH. I do want to come back to your fellow Senator's collection. We do have a monthly deficit. Coming back to our previous comment, treating with Medicare, Medicaid and MIP and the insurance and we are managing our expenses and revenues on a monthly basis. I cant comment about encumbrances for future generations. Our goal is to eliminate that monthly deficit. We have a twofold part which is taking care of the vendors and they are allowed to charge us for not paying. This bill will help us get pass that.



San Nicolas: I understand and it goes back when I mentioned in the previous hearing an ask for documents; ill ask again today, this is a component piece that is going to be fixing a big picture financial problem. In order for me to be comfortable with component pieces, I need to understand the big picture. In all of these request I made to GMH, I'm going to ask 1) in the current situation, at what point are you going to reach maximum efficiencies in generating revenue initiatives and current cost saving initiatives in order to have a picture of what the true shortfall is going to be. To borrow this without understanding that, it means we borrow because we didn't get it quite right the first time. 2) After the current environment, how are we going to manage the emerging new hospital? What is going to be the worst case/best case scenario? What is going to be the mitigation plans GMH is going to come up with? How much money are we going to need to pump in to the hospital? All of us here want the hospital to continue but we all want to understand what it requires. For us to borrow and not fully understand if I can get those two things it is very important.

Ulrich: I appreciate it. I will certainly work on your request with Mr. Verga. The hospital board is also trying to see the short term and long term goal. Yes we will get that to you but I cannot commit to a time.

Chairman Rodriguez: Just to clarify, this borrowing authority is not to borrow for operations, but it is to borrow for debt we already have. A debt that keeps on growing and without addressing it, we are digging ourselves deeper into the hole. So, that's something that must be realized. The amount of \$18+ million we owe, that's a fact. Those are vendors that provided services and we didn't pay them. So, that's what this bill does.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent: I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2

- that the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority is seriously underfunded, resulting in 3
- consistent, chronic shortages in all operational areas that jeopardize the ability of 4
- Guam Memorial Hospital to adequately fulfill its mission. 5

The full scope and negative impact of the Guam Memorial Hospital 6

Authority's outstanding debts, in excess of \$23,000,000 dollars, came to light 7

during the Joint Status Hearing conducted by the Committee on Health & Human

Services and the Committee on Finance, on April 18, 2012. I Liheslaturan 9

Guåhan further finds that in 2012, the federally approved discount provider for

medical supplies intercepted approximately \$500,000.00 (taken from Medicare

reimbursements through the U.S. Treasury), for non-payment of GMHA's debt. In 12

March 2013, GMHA, through the efforts of Governor Eddie Calvo paid 13

\$5,000,000 of its outstanding obligations using Compact-Impact funds, thus 14

- reducing its obligation to approximately \$18,000,000 as of March 31, 2013. The
- 2 retirement of GMHA's debt is essential to its ability to focus on patient care and its
- 3 preventive programs. The provision of medical care should be the core of the
- 4 hospital's mission, not the burden placed on operations by its debt. For the past
- seven (7) months in FY 2013, GMHA has accumulated approximately over half a
- 6 million dollars in interest charges from vendors. This added burden further
- 7 exacerbates GMHA's financial condition.
- 8 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Public Law 30-200, as amended by
- 9 Public Law 30-235 authorized the GMHA to enter into a line of credit, revolving
