Committee Report Digest

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General Government Operations and Cultural Affairs convened a public hearing on Friday, May 31, 2013, at 1:00 p.m. in the Public Hearing Room of I Liheslatura. McCreadie - An act to amend §§ 3705 and 3707 of Article 7, Chapter 3, Title 16 GCA, relative to expanding the duties of the Guam Police Department Community Assisted Policing Effort (CAPE) volunteers to include enforcement of the Handbilling Act, and for other purposes.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F Cruz announced Bill No. 117-32 (COR) then called on Senator Barnes as its main sponsor to make a statement.

Senator Cruz noted that Chief Bordallo, Jr. was not present, but that he had submitted written testimony. Senator Cruz read the submitted testimony on behalf of Chief Bordallo:

"The Guam Police Department (GPD) is in support of Bill 117-32(COR) which authorizes the GPD's C.A.P.E. Volunteers to enforce hand billing law in addition to their other enforcement powers. We believe this is a good bill. We suggest, however, that the second paragraph of Subsection 3705(b), requiring the Chief of Police to certify that training took place, be removed. We believe this does not need to be in the law because if this bill is passed, GPD will train the C.A.P.E. Volunteers in hand billing citation policies. All new C.A.P.E. Volunteers will learn this as part of their initial training. Requiring by law a secondary certification, that will ultimately be a required training to be a C.A.P.E. Volunteer, makes this useless redundancy."

Senator Cruz noted that two members of the Guam Police Department were present in place of Chief Bordallo. Senator Cruz called on Officer Elizabeth Flickenger to testify.

Senator Rodriguez asked what the responsibilities are of the CAPE Volunteers.

Officer Elizabeth Flickenger stated that CAPE volunteers write citations for accessibility parking and littering and that they perform traffic direction duties and crowd control at events like 5k running events.

Senator Rodriguez asked if they enforce the law in relation to smoking within 20 feet of an entrance.

Officer Elizabeth Flickenger stated that they do not, but that they are motivated to do more.

Senator Pangelinan asked to differentiate between training for CAPE volunteers and police recruits

Officer Elizabeth Flickenger stated that CAPE volunteers get training that is similar to GPD officers, but the training emphasizes accessibility parking, littering, and crowd control.

Senator Cruz asserted for the record that he insisted that Sergeant Elizabeth Flickenger come forth to testify. Senator Cruz adjourned the public hearing and stated that the record will be open for ten days so





AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 3705 and 3707 OF ARTICLE 7, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16 GCA, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE DUTIES OF THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT COMMUNITY ASSISTED POLICING EFFORT (CAPE) VOLUNTEERS TO INCLUDE ENFORCEMENT OF THE HANDBILLING ACT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 3705 of Article 7, Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read:

"§3705. Penalty, Summons, and Citation, Prohibition. Prohibited Activity;

CAPE Volunteers; Penalty.

- (a) Prohibited Activity. No person may engage in any handbilling activity between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. within the marked restricted areas as described in Section 3704.
- (b) Summons or Citation. A pPeace officers, and others authorized by law to issue summons or citations pursuant to this Article, shall use the "Guam Uniform Complaint and Citation" form for citing any violation of this Article. Guam Police Department Community Assisted Policing Effort (CAPE) volunteers are hereby authorized to patrol the marked restricted areas in Tumon Bay, as described in Section 3704, for unlawful handbilling activity between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m., and are further authorized to issue citations for any violation of this Article.

Volunteers are required to obtain a certificate from the Chief of Police

1	demonstrating the completion of a required course of instruction and training that

4	(c) Penalty. Any person conducting handbilling in violation of any provision
