

AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 8, AND TO *REPEAL* § 3341 OF ARTICLE 3, ALL OF CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING AND PANHANDLING AT SPECIFIED LOCATIONS IN GUAM; AND TO BE KNOWN AS THE "AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING ACT OF 2013".

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Article 8 is hereby *added* to Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam

3 Code Annotated, to read:

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"ARTICLE 8

AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING ACT OF 2013

3 § 3800. Legislative Findings and Intent. Recognizing the public safety hazards posed to both pedestrians and occupants and operators 4 5 of motor vehicles alike by aggressive forms of panhandling, I Liheslaturan 6 *Guåhan* by this Act intends to prohibit such panhandling in and along the 7 public roadways of Guam. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that this Act is a 8 reasonable time, place, and manner regulation designed to address a specific 9 problem, namely, that individuals seeking handouts from occupants of motor 10vehicles on public roadways and other places are increasing the likelihood of 11 accidents potentially injurious to both pedestrians and motor vehicle 12 occupants, as well as creating traffic congestion and other similar public 13 safety hazards. This Act properly balances constitutionally protected forms 14 of speech and other communicative acts of individuals and groups on the 15 one hand, and the legitimate content-neutral interests of the government of 16 Guam on the other hand, particularly in view of public safety concerns and 17 the availability of ample alternative methods of non-aggressive forms of 18 panhandling in other more suitable public fora. There are substantial 19 differences in nature between public streets, kept open to and pulsing with 20vehicular traffic, and other public fora, including, but not limited to, most 21 areas of sidewalks and public parks. This Act does not affect other forms of non-aggressive solicitation of funds, such as door-to-door, telephone, and 22 23 mail solicitations, and does not restrict other types of speech such as oral 24 advocacy, distribution of literature, petitioning, picketing, and other similar 25communicative acts that do not pose public safety hazards in the same 26manner as panhandling in the form of active solicitation of funds from motor 27 vehicle occupants by persons in and along public roadways.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that to the extent that panhandling 1 may in certain circumstances constitute a form of constitutionally protected 2 3 speech, this Act expressly prohibits only specific actions when they occur in the context of panhandling, and in no way the content of that speech. 4 5 § 3801. For purposes of this Article, the following words and phrases have been defined to mean: 6 7 after dark means any time from 6:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.; (a) 8 aggressive manner means any of the following: (b) 9 (1)approaching or speaking to a person, or following 10 a person before, during or after panhandling, if that conduct is 11 intended or is likely to cause a reasonable person to (A) fear 12 bodily harm to oneself or to another, or damage to or loss of 13 property, or (B) otherwise be intimidated into giving money or 14 other thing of value; 15 (2)intentionally touching or causing physical contact 16 with another person or an occupied vehicle without that 17 person's consent in the course of panhandling; 18 intentionally blocking or interfering with the safe (3)19 or free passage of a pedestrian or vehicle by any means, 20including unreasonably causing a pedestrian or vehicle operator 21 to take evasive action to avoid physical contact; 22 using violent or threatening gestures toward a (4)23 person solicited either before, during, or after panhandling; 24 (5)persisting in closely following or approaching a 25 person after the person solicited has been solicited and 26 informed the solicitor by words or conduct that such person 27 does not want to be solicited or does not want to give money or

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1 any other thing of value to the solicitor; or 2 (6)using profane, offensive or abusive language that 3 is inherently likely to provoke an immediate reaction, either 4 before or after solicitation. 5 (c)panhandling means using the spoken, written, or printed 6 word, or bodily gestures, signs or other means with the purpose of 7 obtaining an immediate exchange of money. 8 (d)*public* place means a place to which the public or a 9 substantial group of persons has access, and includes, but is not 10 limited to, any street, highway, government easement, sidewalk, 11 parking lot, plaza, transportation facility, school, place of amusement, 12 park, playground, and any doorway, entrance, hallway, lobby and 13 other portion of any business establishment, an apartment house or 14 hotel not constituting a room or apartment designed for actual 15 residence. 16 § 3802. **Aggressive Panhandling and Panhandling at Specified** Locations, Prohibited. 17 18 No person shall engage in panhandling in an aggressive (a) 19 manner in any public place. 20(b) Motor vehicles; medians. 21 (1)Motor Vehicles. 22 No person shall approach an operator or (A) 23 occupant of a motor vehicle, at any time of day or night. 24 for the purpose of panhandling, while such vehicle is in 25 traffic on a public roadway; 26 No person shall engage in panhandling in (\mathbf{B}) 27 the medians of public roadways.

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§ 3804. Enforcement; Penalty.

(a) Any person engaging in panhandling in violation of any
provision of this Article *shall* be subject to a fine of Two Hundred Dollars
(\$200.00) for the first offense and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for any
subsequent offense. Each and every such offense is a violation of the traffic
code and in turn constitutes a civil violation punishable under the terms of
Title 16 GCA, § 9108.

(b) The Guam Police Department has the authority to
enforce this Act and may, in connection therewith and pursuant to
§3401.1(h) of Article 4, Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, the
Chief of Police is authorized to enlist police reservists or CAPE volunteers
to assist the Guam Police Department in the enforcement of this Act, upon
the completion of training deemed necessary by the Chief of Police for the
enforcement of this Act."

Section 2. § 3341 of Chapter 3, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *repealed*.

Section 3. Effective Date. The provisions of this Act *shall* become
effective sixty (60) days after enactment into public law.

Section 4. Severability. The provisions of this Act are declared to be separate and severable. The invalidity of any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or portion of this statute, or the invalidity of the application

Committee Report Digest

I. <u>OVERVIEW</u>

The Committee on General Government Operations and Cultural Affairs convened a public hearing on Friday, May 31, 2013, at 1:00 p.m. in the Public Hearing Room *of I Liheslatura*. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration was Bill No. 75-32 (LS) - T.R. Muña Barnes / M.F.Q. San Nicolas / B.T. McCreadie - An act to a new Article 8 to Chapter 3 of Title 16 Guam Code Annotated, relative to prohibiting aggressive panhandling and panhandling at specified locations in Guam to be known as the "Aggressive Panhandling Act of 2013"

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators on May 24, 2013, and May 29, 2013 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

The public hearing was called to order at 1:05 p.m.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F Cruz announced Bill No. 75-32 (LS) then called on Senator Barnes as its main sponsor to make a statement.

Senator Barnes stated that public safety in relation to pedestrians and the operators of motor vehicles and their passengers was a chief consideration in the introduction of Bill No. 75-32 (LS). Senator Barnes said that an individual panhandling aggressively along roadsides is dangerous and that it may harm them or the occupants in a motor vehicle. fraud and duress. Senator Barnes stated that the intent of Bill No. 75-32 (LS) is to prevent aggressive panhandling to protect residents from aggressive solicitation.

Senator Cruz noted that nobody had come to testify, but asserted that the record will be open for ten days so that residents may submit their testimonies.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General Government Operations and Cultural Affairs notes that while no oral testimony was provided at the measure's public hearing, concerns were raised regarding the potential deletion of existing safety measures presently within the statute. As such, the Committee has made minor changes in consultation with the author and other stakeholders to ensure the greatest amount of safety possible. The substitute version attached hereto reflects these changes.

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. A New Article 8 is hereby added to Chapter 3 of Title 16
3	Guam Code Annotated to read:
4	"Article 8
5	Aggressive Panhandling Act of 2013.
6	§3800. Legislative Intent. Recognizing the public safety
7	hazards posed to both pedestrians and occupants and operators of motor
8	vehicles alike by aggressive forms of panhandling, I Liheslaturan Guåhan
9	by this Act intends to prohibit such panhandling in and along the public
10	roadways of Guam. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that this Act is a
11	reasonable time, place, and manner regulation designed to address a specific
12	problem, namely, that individuals seeking handouts from occupants of motor
13	vehicles on public roadways and other places are increasing the likelihood of
14	accidents potentially injurious to both pedestrians and motor vehicle

occupants, as well as creating traffic congestion and other similar public 1 safety hazards. This Act properly balances constitutionally protected forms 2 of speech and other communicative acts of individuals and groups on the 3 one hand, and the legitimate content-neutral interests of the Government of 4 5 Guam on the other hand, particularly in view of public safety concerns and the availability of ample alternative methods of non-aggressive forms of 6 panhandling in other more suitable public fora. 7 There are substantial differences in nature between public streets, kept open to and pulsing with 8 vehicular traffic, and other public fora including, but not limited to, most 9 areas of sidewalks and public parks. This Act does not affect other forms of 10 non-aggressive solicitation of funds such as door-to-door, telephone, and 11 mail solicitations, and does not restrict other types of speech such as oral 12 advocacy, distribution of literature, petitioning, picketing, and other similar 13 communicative acts that do not pose public safety hazards in the same 14 manner as panhandling in the form of active solicitation of funds from motor 15 vehicle occupants by persons in and along public roadways. 16

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that certain other types of face-to-17 face solicitation of funds, namely solicitation calling for an immediate 18 donation at specified places, pose a separate and distinct public safety hazard 19 likewise within the ambit of the legislative power to regulate. Recognizing 20 that in-person solicitation of funds, when combined with immediate 21 exchanges of money, creates a risk of fraud and duress, this Act makes it 22 unlawful for persons to panhandle with the purpose of obtaining an 23 immediate donation of money or other thing of value in locales that are 24 particularly threatening or intrusive such as within close proximity to a bank 25 or automated teller machine ("ATM") or other public places if the 26 27 solicitation is done in an aggressive manner. Additionally, to the extent that

panhandling may in certain circumstances constitute a form of
 constitutionally protected speech, this Act expressly prohibits only specific
 actions when they occur in the context of panhandling, and in no way the
 content of that speech.

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§3801. Definitions. For purposes of this Article, the following words and phrases have been defined to mean:

7 (a) "After dark" means any time from one-half hour after
8 sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.

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(b) *"Aggressive manner"* means any of the following:

(1) Approaching or speaking to a person, or following
a person before, during or after panhandling, if that conduct is
intended or is likely to cause a reasonable person to (i) fear
bodily harm to oneself or to another, damage to or loss of
property, or (ii) otherwise be intimidated into giving money or
other thing of value;

16 (2) Intentionally touching or causing physical contact
17 with another person or an occupied vehicle without that
18 person's consent in the course of panhandling;

19 (3) Intentionally blocking or interfering with the safe
20 or free passage of a pedestrian or vehicle by any means,
21 including unreasonably causing a pedestrian or vehicle operator
22 to take evasive action to avoid physical contact;

23 (4) Using violent or threatening gestures toward a
24 person solicited either before, during, or after panhandling;

(5) Persisting in closely following or approaching a person after the person solicited has been solicited and informed the solicitor by words or conduct that such person

does not want to be solicited or does not want to give money or 1 2 any other thing of value to the solicitor; or 3 (6)Using profane, offensive or abusive language that is inherently likely to provoke an immediate reaction, either 4 5 before or after solicitation. "Automated teller machine" shall mean any electronic 6 (c)7 information processing device that accepts or dispenses cash in connection with a credit, deposit, or convenience account. 8 "Automated teller machine facility" shall mean the area 9 (d)comprised of one or more automated teller machines, and any 10 adjacent space that is made available to banking customers after 11 regular banking hours. 12 "Bank" means any member bank of the Federal Reserve 13 (e) System, and any bank, banking association, trust company, savings 14 bank, or other banking institution organized or operated under the 15 laws of the United States, and any bank the deposits of which are 16 insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. 17 18 (f)"Credit union" means any federal credit union and any Guam-chartered credit union the accounts of which are insured by the 19 Administrator of the National Credit Union Administration. 20 "Check cashing business" means any person duly 21 (g) licensed as a check seller, bill payer, or prorater pursuant to Guam 22 23 law. 24 "Panhandling" means using the spoken, written, or (h) printed word, or bodily gestures, signs or other means with the 25 purpose of obtaining an immediate donation of money or other thing 26

of value.

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1(i) "Public place" means a place to which the public or a2substantial group of persons has access, and includes, but is not3limited to, any street, highway, sidewalk, parking lot, plaza,4transportation facility, school, place of amusement, park, playground,5and any doorway, entrance, hallway, lobby and other portion of any6business establishment, an apartment house or hotel not constituting a7room or apartment designed for actual residence.

8 (j) "Savings and loan association" means any federal 9 savings and loan association and any "insured institution" as defined 10 in Section 401 of the National Housing Act, as amended, and any 11 federal credit union as defined in Section 2 of the Federal Credit 12 Union Act.

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§3802. Aggressive Panhandling and Panhandling at Specified Locations, Prohibited.

(a) No person shall engage in panhandling in an aggressive manner in any public place.

(b) Banks and ATMs.

18 (1)No person shall panhandle within fifteen (15) feet of any entrance or exit of any bank, savings and loan 19 association, or credit union, during its business hours, or within 20 fifteen (15) feet of any automated teller machine during the 21 22 time it is available for customers' use. Provided, however, that when an automated teller machine is located within an 23 automated teller machine facility, such distance shall be 24 25 measured from the entrance or exit of the automated teller machine facility. Provided further that no person shall engage 26 27 in panhandling within an automated teller machine facility

where a reasonable person would or should know that he or she 1 2 does not have the permission to do so from the owner or other person lawfully in possession of such facility. Nothing in this 3 paragraph shall be construed to prohibit the lawful vending of 4 5 goods and services within such areas. 6 Exemptions. Section 3802(b)(1) shall not apply to (2)7 any unenclosed automated teller machine located within any 8 building, structure or space whose primary purpose or function is unrelated to banking activities, including but not limited to 9 10 supermarkets, airports and school buildings, provided that such automated teller machine shall be available for use only during 11 the regular hours of operation of the building, structure or space 12 13 in which such machine is located. 14 (c)Motor vehicles; Parking lots. 15 (1)Motor Vehicles. 16 No person shall approach an operator or (i) occupant of a motor vehicle, at any time of day or night, 17 for the purpose of panhandling, while such vehicle is in 18 traffic on a public roadway; 19 20 (ii) No person shall engage in panhandling in the medians of public roadways. 21 22 (2)Parking lots. No person shall engage in panhandling in any public parking lot or structure any time after 23 24 dark. 25 Exemptions. Section 3802(c)(2) shall not apply to (3)any of the following: 26 27 Solicitations related to business that is being (i)

1	conducted on the subject premises by the owner or lawful
2	tenants;
3	(ii) Solicitations related to the lawful towing of

5	(iii) Solicitations related to emergency repairs
6	requested by the operator or other occupant of a vehicle.
7	(d) Restaurants. Any person who panhandles in any outdoor
8	or indoor dining area of a restaurant or other establishment serving

13	food establishment; the agent of the owner, manager or

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9	by this Act intends to prohibit such panhandling in and along the public
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15	occupants, as well as creating traffic congestion and other similar public

safety hazards. This Act properly balances constitutionally protected forms 1 2 of speech and other communicative acts of individuals and groups on the one hand, and the legitimate content-neutral interests of the Government of 3 4 Guam on the other hand, particularly in view of public safety concerns and 5 the availability of ample alternative methods of non-aggressive forms of panhandling in other more suitable public fora. 6 There are substantial 7 differences in nature between public streets, kept open to and pulsing with 8 vehicular traffic, and other public fora including, but not limited to, most 9 areas of sidewalks and public parks. This Act does not affect other forms of 10 non-aggressive solicitation of funds such as door-to-door, telephone, and mail solicitations, and does not restrict other types of speech such as oral 11 advocacy, distribution of literature, petitioning, picketing, and other similar 12 communicative acts that do not pose public safety hazards in the same 13 manner as panhandling in the form of active solicitation of funds from motor 14 vehicle occupants by persons in and along public roadways. 15

16 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that certain other types of face-to-17 face solicitation of funds, namely solicitation calling for an immediate donation at specified places, pose a separate and distinct public safety hazard 18 19 likewise within the ambit of the legislative power to regulate. Recognizing that in-person solicitation of funds, when combined with immediate 20 exchanges of money, creates a risk of fraud and duress, this Act makes it 21 unlawful for persons to panhandle with the purpose of obtaining an 22 immediate donation of money or other thing of value in locales that are 23 particularly threatening or intrusive such as within close proximity to a bank 24 or automated teller machine ("ATM") or other public places if the 25 solicitation is done in an aggressive manner. Additionally, to the extent that 26 panhandling may in certain circumstances constitute a form 27 of

1 constitutionally protected speech, this Act expressly prohibits only specific 2 actions when they occur in the context of panhandling, and in no way the content of that speech. 3 4 **§3801. Definitions**. For purposes of this Article, the following words and phrases have been defined to mean: 5 "After dark" means any time from one-half hour after 6 (a) sunset to one-half hour before sunrise. 7 "Aggressive manner" means any of the following: 8 (b) 9 Approaching or speaking to a person, or following (1)a person before, during or after panhandling, if that conduct is 10 intended or is likely to cause a reasonable person to (i) fear 11 12 bodily harm to oneself or to another, damage to or loss of property, or (ii) otherwise be intimidated into giving money or 13 other thing of value; 14 15 (2)Intentionally touching or causing physical contact 16 with another person or an occupied vehicle without that person's consent in the course of panhandling; 17 Intentionally blocking or interfering with the safe (3)18 or free passage of a pedestrian or vehicle by any means, 19 including unreasonably causing a pedestrian or vehicle operator 20 21 to take evasive action to avoid physical contact; (4)22 Using violent or threatening gestures toward a 23 person solicited either before, during, or after panhandling; (5)Persisting in closely following or approaching a 24 person after the person solicited has been solicited and 25 informed the solicitor by words or conduct that such person 26 does not want to be solicited or does not want to give money or 27

1 any other thing of value to the solicitor; or 2 (6)Using profane, offensive or abusive language that is inherently likely to provoke an immediate reaction, either 3 4 before or after solicitation. "Automated teller machine" shall mean any electronic (c) 5 6 information processing device that accepts or dispenses cash in 7 connection with a credit, deposit, or convenience account. "Automated teller machine facility" shall mean the area (d) 8 9 comprised of one or more automated teller machines, and any adjacent space that is made available to banking customers after 10 regular banking hours. 11 "Bank" means any member bank of the Federal Reserve 12 (e) System, and any bank, banking association, trust company, savings 13 bank, or other banking institution organized or operated under the 14 15 laws of the United States, and any bank the deposits of which are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. 16 "Credit union" means any federal credit union and any (f) 17 Guam-chartered credit union the accounts of which are insured by the 18 19 Administrator of the National Credit Union Administration. business establishment, an apartment house or hotel not constituting a
room or apartment designed for actual residence.

8 (j) "Savings and loan association" means any federal 9 savings and loan association and any "insured institution" as defined 10 in Section 401 of the National Housing Act, as amended, and any 11 federal credit union as defined in Section 2 of the Federal Credit 12 Union Act.

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§3802. Aggressive Panhandling and Panhandling at Specified Locations, Prohibited.

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(b) Banks and ATMs.

(1)No person shall panhandle within fifteen (15) feet 18 of any entrance or exit of any bank, savings and loan 19 association, or credit union, during its business hours, or within 20 fifteen (15) feet of any automated teller machine during the 21 time it is available for customers' use. Provided, however, that 22 when an automated teller machine is located within an 23 automated teller machine facility, such distance shall be 24 measured from the entrance or exit of the automated teller 25 machine facility. Provided further that no person shall engage 26 in panhandling within an automated teller machine facility 27

1 where a reasonable person would or should know that he or she 2 does not have the permission to do so from the owner or other person lawfully in possession of such facility. Section 3802(b)(1) shall not apply to 7 any unenclosed automated teller machine located within any 8 building, structure or space whose primary purpose or function is unrelated to banking activities, including but not limited to 9 10 supermarkets, airports and school buildings, provided that such automated teller machine shall be available for use only during 11 the regular hours of operation of the building, structure or space 12 in which such machine is located. 13 Motor vehicles; Parking lots.
