Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Chapter, the Department shall review and revise all existing Department rules and regulations for the management and control of school property in order to authorize the commercial leasing of advertising space at the Department of Education sports facilities, consistent with government of Guam standard property regulations. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Chapter, the Department of Education shall develop standard size and placement regulations for the leasing of commercial advertising space at the Department of Education sports facilities. Immediately upon completion, the proposed revisions shall be transmitted to the Board for approval. Within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Board shall adopt the revised rules and regulations with any amendments deemed necessary and appropriate."

Section 2. § 7106 of Chapter 7, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"§ 7106. Schedule of Commercial Advertising Fees. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Chapter, the Department of Education *shall* develop a schedule of fees for the commercial leasing of advertising space at Department of Education sports facilities. Immediately upon completion, the proposed schedule of fees *shall* be transmitted to the Board for approval. Within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Board *shall* approve the schedule of fees with any amendments deemed necessary and appropriate."

Section 3. § 7107 of Chapter 7, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

"§ 7107. Standard Lease Agreement for Commercial Advertising. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act, the Department of Education shall develop a standard lease agreement for commercial advertising at Department of Education sports facilities. Such standard lease agreement shall specify the Department's rules and regulations, schedule of fees and legal liabilities for private entities seeking to advertise at Department of Education sports facilities. Such standard lease agreement shall specifically prohibit any advertising which promotes substances which are controlled by law, or are illegal to distribute to minors, including, without limitation, alcohol; establishments selling primarily alcohol products, such as bars; tobacco products; firearms; obscenity; and as may be otherwise determined by the Board. Immediately upon completion, the proposed standard lease agreement shall be transmitted to the Board for approval. Within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Board shall adopt the standard lease agreement with any amendments deemed necessary and appropriate."

Section 4. § 7108 of Chapter 7, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

"§ 7108. Interscholastic Sports Fund. There is hereby created, separate and apart from all other funds of the government of Guam, a fund known as the Interscholastic Sports Fund (Fund) into which *shall* be deposited all fees collected from the commercial leasing of advertising space at Department of Education sports facilities, and other monies deemed appropriated by the Department of Education.

(a) **Same: Administration.** The Fund *shall* be administered by the Department of Education and *shall not* be commingled with the

General Fund or any other fund of the government of Guam. The Fund *shall* be maintained in a separate bank account and monies deposited therein *shall not* be subject to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* transfer authority. The Department of Education is authorized to accept for the Fund gifts, bequests, donations and other kinds of contributions for the purposes of the Fund.

- (b) Same: Expenditures. Expenditures from the Fund *shall* be made exclusively for the purpose of supplementing the costs associated with operating the Department of Education interscholastic sports programs. The Department of Education may transfer from the Interscholastic Sports Fund to the Department of Public Works such funds as are necessary to fund in whole or in part interscholastic bus transportation.
- Elementary schools of GDOE may participate in the solicitation of commercial advertising in their respective schools, as provided through the Interscholastic Sports Fund Act. However, because the interscholastic sports program exists in the middle and high school levels only, the elementary school that solicits and receives monies for commercial advertising *shall* deposit all funds into the Interscholastic Sports Fund. The Department of Education *shall* transfer forty percent (40%) of the total sum of any fees, monetary gifts, donations or contributions collected or derived from the commercial leasing of any part of the facilities for advertising, or other such purposes of an elementary school, into *I Salappe Facilidat* account of that respective elementary school. The remaining sixty percent (60%) will remain in

the Interscholastic Sports Fund to support interscholastic sports programs. Funds transferred to *I Salappe Facilidat* accounts of a respective elementary school pursuant to this Subsection *shall* be expended in accordance with the provisions of Title 17 GCA, §1704, as enacted through Public Law Number 23-67. The distribution of advertising funds for both middle schools and high schools will be as follows: sixty percent (60%) will remain in the Interscholastic Sports Fund and forty percent (40%) will be retained at the school for its respective sports programs.

(d) Same: Annual Financial Report. Within sixty (60) days after the closing of each fiscal year, the administrator or authorized custodian of the Interscholastic Sports Fund *shall* transmit to the Board and the Superintendent of the Department of Education an annual report of the expenditures of the Fund, including, but *not* limited to, a balance sheet, a statement of receipts and expenses, and a general description of the income sources of the Fund and the expenses thereof."

Section 5. A new Chapter 50A is *added* to Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to authorizing the Department of Public Works to establish a commercial advertising space program on school buses, to read as follows:

21 "CHAPTER 50A

COMMERCIAL ADVERTISING SPACE PROGRAM

§ 50A101. Authorization.

- § 50A102. Program Rules and Regulations.
- § 50A103. Lease Agreement.
- § 50A104. Program Management.

§ 50A105. DPW Maintenance Fund.

§ 50A101. Authorization. The Department of Public Works (Department) is authorized to establish a commercial advertising space program (Program) utilizing space on the interior and exterior of the Department's school buses.

§ 50A102. Program Rules and Regulations. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act, the Department in consultation with GDOE shall develop rules and regulations pursuant to the AAL governing the standard size and placement for the leasing of commercial advertising space, a schedule of fees for the commercial leasing of advertising space, and any other rules and regulations necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the Program. Additionally, the rules and regulations developed, pursuant to this Chapter, shall address the following:

- (a) assurance that any Program lease agreement entered into by the Department *does not* negatively affect any warranties associated with government of Guam school buses;
- (b) a prohibition on political advertisements as part of the Program;
- (c) assurance that any advertisements which may become faded, dilapidated, or pose a danger to the public will be replaced or repaired by the lessee with no cost to the Department. The Department *shall* be responsible for developing criteria to determine whether an advertisement is faded, dilapidated, or poses a threat to the public; and (d) assurance that the Department will not be held responsible, financial or otherwise, for any damage or destruction that occurs to any advertisements or advertising space that has been leased as part of the Program.

The Department *shall* allow *no less than* twenty percent (20%) of the interior and the outside rear panel of each bus to be used at no fee to government of Guam agencies or non-profit groups charged with anti-drug, anti-alcohol, anti-bullying, anti-domestic violence, or other public service announcements which are applicable and appropriate for educational purposes.

§ 50A103. Lease Agreement. The Department *shall* develop a standard lease agreement. The lease agreement *shall* incorporate applicable rules and regulations, the schedule of fees, and make clear any legal liabilities for private entities seeking to advertise on its buses. The standard lease agreement *shall* specifically prohibit any advertising which promotes substances which are controlled by law, or are illegal to distribute to minors, including, without limitation, alcohol; establishments selling primarily alcohol products, such as bars; tobacco products; firearms; obscenity; and as may be otherwise determined by the Department of Public Works; and *shall* specifically prohibit advertising that is prohibited by GDOE Board Policy for the lease of advertising space at schools or other educational facilities, or prohibited by GDOE Board Policy, from being promoted during school hours or during extracurricular activities, including, but *not* limited to, foods of minimal nutritional value.

§ 50A104. Program Management. The Department *shall* issue a request for proposals for the management of the Program. The Fund established in §50A105 of this Chapter *shall* be the source for any program management fees.

§ 50A105. DPW Maintenance Fund. There is hereby created, separate and apart from all other funds of the government of Guam, a fund known as the DPW Bus Maintenance Fund (Fund) into which *shall* be deposited all fees collected from the commercial leasing of advertising space on school buses.

1 Expenditures from the Fund *shall* be by written authorization of the Director of Public Works.

- (a) Same: Administration. The Fund *shall* be administered by the Department of Public Works and *shall not* be commingled with the General Fund or any other fund of the government of Guam. The Fund *shall* be maintained in a separate bank account and monies deposited therein *shall not* be subject to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* transfer authority. The Department of Public Works is authorized to accept for the Fund gifts, bequests, donations and other kinds of contributions for the purposes of the Fund.
- (b) **Same: Expenditures.** Expenditures from the Fund *shall* be made exclusively for the purpose of supplementing the costs associated with maintaining the Department of Public Works' school buses and for program management fees.
- (c) Same: Annual Financial Report. Within sixty (60) days after the closing of each fiscal year, the administrator or authorized custodian of the DPW Bus Maintenance Fund *shall* transmit to the Director of the Department of Public Works an annual report of the expenditures of the Fund, including, but *not* limited to, a balance sheet, a statement of receipts and expenses, and a general description of the income sources of the Fund and the expenses thereof. Copies of the report *shall* be transmitted to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*."
- **Section 6. Effective Date.** The provisions of this Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.
- **Section 7. Severability.** If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity *does not* affect other provisions or applications of the Act that can be given effect without the

§ 50A101. Authorization. The Department of Public Works (Department) is authorized to establish a commercial advertising space program (Program) utilizing space on the interior and exterior of the Department's school buses.

§ 50A102. Program Rules and Regulations. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act, the Department in consultation with GDOE shall develop rules and regulations pursuant to the AAL governing the standard size and placement for the leasing of commercial advertising space, a schedule of fees for the commercial leasing of advertising space, and any other rules and regulations necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the Program. Additionally, the rules and regulations developed, pursuant to this Chapter, shall address the following:

- (a) assurance that any Program lease agreement entered into by the Department *does not* negatively affect any warranties associated with government of Guam school buses;
- (b) a prohibition on political advertisements as part of the Program;
- (c) assurance that any advertisements which may become faded, dilapidated, or pose a danger to the public will be replaced or repaired by the lessee with no cost to the Department. The Department *shall* be responsible for developing criteria to determine whether an advertisement is faded, dilapidated, or poses a threat to the public; and (d) assurance that the Department will not be held responsible, financial or otherwise, for any damage or destruction that occurs to any advertisements or advertising space that has been leased as part of the Program.

The Department *shall* allow *no less than* twenty percent (20%) of the interior and the outside rear panel of each bus to be used at no fee to government of Guam agencies or non-profit groups charged with anti-drug, anti-alcohol, anti-bullying, anti-domestic violence, or other public service announcements which are applicable and appropriate for educational purposes.

§ 50A103. Lease Agreement. The Department *shall* develop a standard lease agreement. The lease agreement *shall* incorporate applicable rules and regulations, the schedule of fees, and make clear any legal liabilities for private entities seeking to advertise on its buses. The standard lease agreement *shall* specifically prohibit any advertising which promotes substances which are controlled by law, or are illegal to distribute to minors, including, without limitation, alcohol; establishments selling primarily alcohol products, such as bars; tobacco products; firearms; obscenity; and as may be otherwise determined by the Department of Public Works; and *shall* specifically prohibit advertising that is prohibited by GDOE Board Policy for the lease of advertising space at schools or other educational facilities, or prohibited by GDOE Board Policy, from being promoted during school hours or during extracurricular activities, including, but *not* limited to, foods of minimal nutritional value.

§ 50A104. Program Management. The Department *shall* issue a request for proposals for the management of the Program. The Fund established in §50A105 of this Chapter *shall* be the source for any program management fees.

§ 50A105. DPW Maintenance Fund. There is hereby created, separate and apart from all other funds of the government of Guam, a fund known as the DPW Bus Maintenance Fund (Fund) into which *shall* be deposited all fees collected from the commercial leasing of advertising space on school buses.

Expenditures from the Fund *shall* be by written authorization of the Director of Public Works.

- (a) Same: Administration. The Fund *shall* be administered by the Department of Public Works and *shall not* be commingled with the General Fund or any other fund of the government of Guam. The Fund *shall* be maintained in a separate bank account and monies deposited therein *shall not* be subject to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* transfer authority. The Department of Public Works is authorized to accept for the Fund gifts, bequests, donations and other kinds of contributions for the purposes of the Fund.
- (b) **Same: Expenditures.** Expenditures from the Fund *shall* be made exclusively for the purpose of supplementing the costs associated with maintaining the Department of Public Works' school buses and for program management fees.
- (c) Same: Annual Financial Report. Within sixty (60) days after the closing of each fiscal year, the administrator or authorized custodian of the DPW Bus Maintenance Fund *shall* transmit to the Director of the Department of Public Works an annual report of the expenditures of the Fund, including, but *not* limited to, a balance sheet, a statement of receipts and expenses, and a general description of the income sources of the Fund and the expenses thereof. Copies of the report *shall* be transmitted to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*."
- Section 6. Effective Date. The provisions of this Act shall be effective upon enactment.
- **Section 7. Severability.** If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity *does not* affect other provisions or applications of the Act that can be given effect without the

The Committee on Education, Public Library and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on November 25, 2013 at 2:00 pm in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 204-32 (COR) - An act to amend §§7105-7108 of 17 GCA, relative to the authorization of commercial advertising leases; to authorize the Department of Public Works to establish a commercial advertising space program on school buses; and, to establish the DPW Bus Maintenance Fund.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators on November 18, 2013, (5-Day Notice) and November 22 and 23 2013 (48-Hour Notice) via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the committee report.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

- Senator Limtiaco explained that the purpose of Bill 204 is to amend the existing law that authorizes commercial advertising on school buses by diverting the funds collected to the school bus maintenance fund. The Senator pointed out that the establishment of the fund would dedicate monies to be used for the maintenance of the school bus fleet. The Senator stated that ten states have laws allowing commercial advertising on school buses and eight more states are proposing such legislation. The Senator further stated that the bill would regulate the type of advertising on the school buses.
- **Director Dominguez** testified in support of Bill 204. His written testimony is appended to the committee report.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. noted that Director Dominguez stated in his testimony that the State of Colorado in 1996 was the first in the nation to adopt commercial advertising for school buses. Speaker pointed out that in 1995, Guam enacted the law to allow commercial advertising for school buses and the monies will go to the Department of Education, the law was authored by former Senator Carlotta Leon Guerrero.
- Director Dominguez replied that we (Guam) were pioneers in this area.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. expressed disappointment that the Department of Education did not implement the program. However, the Speaker stated it is a good thing that the bill will help with the maintenance of school buses.
- Senator Limtiaco pointed out the good work of former Senator Leon Guerrero and it is unfortunate that the rules and regulations were not promulgated to take full advantage. The Senator stated that there has been so much discussion about the maintenance of school buses the past year that it made sense for the Department of Public Works to receive the monies from the commercial advertising.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. asked about a private company handling the management of the program.
- **Director Dominguez** replied he does not foresee the employees of DPW soliciting for commercial advertising. He stated that a marketing company is more

suited to handle this. He stated that a request for proposal would be issued seeking the best revenue for DPW. He envisioned that a marketing company can lease the space on the bus and the marketing company subleasing the space.

- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. asked Director Dominguez if he had any objection of the Department determining in the rules and regulations the fees.
- Director Dominguez stated no.
- Senator Limtiaco stated the bill is designed to engage the private sector and we (DPW) should let those who know how to sell advertising handle it. The Senator stated that DPW is not in the business in commercial advertising and maybe that is why DOE was not able to implement it. The Senator stated to make this work you need a staff that is involved in the business of commercial advertising. The Senator pointed out that other states have used third party for commercial advertising. Director Dominguez asked if there restriction on advertising inside of school buses.
- Senator Limtiaco stated that the intent is to take advantage of the school bus per say. The Senator stated that there may be concerns of advertising inside of school buses, but the promulgation of rules and regulations that send positive messages can be used such as anti bullying, anti drug initiatives and MADD.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated that she would like to see non profit organizations advertise within the interior of the school buses. The Speaker noted that the Guam Legislature will review the rules and regulations.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. adjourned the public hearing of Bill No. 204-32 (COR)

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Chapter, the Department shall review and revise all existing Department rules and regulations for the management and control of school property in order to authorize the commercial leasing of advertising space at Department and Tiyan sports facilities [and on Department of Public Works' school buses], consistent with government of Guam standard property regulations. Within ninety (90) days of enactment of this Chapter, the Department of Education[, in conjunction with the Bus Operations Division of the Department of Public Works,] shall develop standard size and placement regulations for the leasing of commercial advertising space at Department and Tiyan sports facilities [and on Department of Public Works' school buses]. Immediately upon completion, the proposed revisions shall be transmitted to the Board for approval. Within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Board shall adopt the revised rules and regulations with any amendments deemed necessary and appropriate."

(a) Same: Administration. The Fund shall be administered by the Department of Education and shall not be commingled with the General Fund or any other fund of the government of Guam. The Fund shall be maintained in a separate bank account and monies deposited therein shall not be subject to I Maga'lahen Guahan's transfer authority. - (c) Same: Distribution of the Interscholastic Sports Fund. Elementary schools may participate in the solicitation of commercial advertising in their respective schools as provided through the Interscholastic Sports Fund Act. However, because the interscholastic sports program exists in the middle and high school levels only, the elementary school that solicits and receives monies for commercial advertising shall deposit all funds into the Interscholastic Sports Fund. The Department of Education shall transfer forty percent (40%) of the total sum of any fees, monetary gifts, donations or contributions collected or derived from the commercial leasing of any part of the facilities for advertising, or other such purposes of an elementary school, into 'I Salappe Facilidat' account of that respective elementary school. Buenas yan Hafa Adai Speaker Won Pat!

The Department of Public Works is in support of Bill No. 204-32, which seeks to assist the Department of Public Works (DPW) with the maintenance of its school buses by allowing DPW to place commercial advertising on its school buses with the fees generated going to a dedicated bus maintenance fund to supplement the maintenance of the buses in addition to manage the advertising program.

The DPW currently has 138 buses in its fleet, 10 of which are new 84 passenger models. The rest of the fleet is 9 to 23 years old. On average, there are 110 roadworthy school buses on a school day. The Transportation Maintenance Division of DPW is working very hard to increase that average, with parts that have to be procured from sources off island and with the recruitment of mechanics that will replace those that have left DPW through attrition. With funding from the Department of Interior's Office of Insular Affairs, the DPW will have 12 or more new 60 passenger buses ready for next school year. The DPW intends to keep as many of the older buses operational as back up to ensure as many buses are available to run its 179 routes. This requires a fiscal year budget of approximately \$2.5 Million.

As a perspective on school bus advertising, in my research on the subject, I found that the first state to embrace school bus advertising was Colorado in 1997. According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, 10 states currently allow advertising on the exterior of school buses: Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, New Jersey, Nevada, Texas and Utah. New Mexico, Rhode Island and Tennessee allow ads on the interior as well as exterior of school buses. Florida, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin allow ads on the interiors only of school buses. All these states have allowed advertising on school buses as a way to raise revenue without having to raise taxes. All states restrict advertising to child friendly ads – no alcohol, tobacco, gaming or distasteful subjects. Advertisers include restaurants, credit unions, dentists, insurance agents, auto dealers and hardware stores. Several photos of school bus advertising is attached for your perusal.

The detractors of school bus advertising cite the ads on the sides of buses distract drivers and increase the likelihood of an accident. However, I have not been able to find research or statistics that show that this is the case. Others cite that the ads "junk up the buses." I leave it to you to see the attached photographs and decide if this is the case.

If Bill 204-32 becomes law, the DPW intends to issue an RFP so that a marketing firm manages the entire program of soliciting ads and installing them on the sides of the buses. The DPW simply takes its negotiated share of the advertising fees. Stateside, this share is reported to be as high as 63%.

Thank you once again for the opportunity to testify positively on Bill 204-32. The DPW appreciates any financial help it can get with supporting the repair and maintenance of its school buses to provide safe and reliable transportation for the students of Guam.

Comments:

If The establishment of the 'DPW Bus Maintenance Fund' is for the purpose of supplementing costs associated with maintaining the Department of Public Works' (DPW) school buses and for the management fees of the commercial advertising space program, through lease agreements. The language in § 50A105 reflects that this Fund is to be administered by DPW; and in §50A104 that DPW shall issue request for proposals for the management of the program. Details are not included with regard to 'management of the program' and 'administration of the Fund' pending development by DPW per §50A102 and §50A103. Expenditures from the Fund shall be by written authorization of the DPW Director. Based on bus ads in 200 markets, the cost ranges from \$150 to \$4,500 per ad per 4 week period for bus exterior ads; and \$20 to \$125 per ad per 4 week period for bus interior ads. And assuming that ads for 1 school bus are approved, 1 for exterior and 8 for interior at minimum rates of \$150 and \$20, respectively over a 4 week period, then a total of \$150 for exterior and \$160 for interior would be realized, or a total of \$310 for a 4 week period for one bus, or \$3,720 annually. And if this is applied to 55 school buses out of the current 110 roadworthy school buses, then a total of \$204,600 would be realized in revenue under the Fund.

It is noted that the bill amends \$\$7105 thru 7108 relative to Interscholastic Sports Fund to reflect the non-inclusion of fees for commercial leasing of advertising space at Department of Public Works' (DPW) school buses. To date, no advertising has been made on school buses, and as such, the bill will not negatively impact on current collections under the Interscholastic Sports Fund.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. §7105 of I7 GCA is amended to read:

"§ 7105. Authorization of Commercial Advertising Leases. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Chapter, the Department shall review and revise all existing Department rules and regulations for the management and control of school property in order to authorize the commercial leasing of advertising space at Department and Tiyan sports facilities [and on Department of Public Works' school buses], consistent with government of Guam standard property regulations. Within ninety (90) days of enactment of this Chapter, the Department of Education[, in conjunction with the Bus Operations Division of the Department of Public Works,] shall develop standard size and placement regulations for the leasing of commercial advertising space at Department and Tiyan sports facilities [and on Department of Public Works' school buses]. Immediately upon completion, the proposed revisions shall be transmitted to the Board for approval. Within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Board shall adopt the revised rules and regulations with any amendments deemed necessary and appropriate."

Section 2. §7106 of 17 GCA is amended to read:

"§ 7106. Schedule of Commercial Advertising Fecs. Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Chapter, the Department of Education shall develop a schedule of fees for the

- commercial leasing of advertising space at Department of Education and Tiyan sports facilities [and
- 2 Department of Public Works' school buses]. Immediately upon completion, the proposed schedule of

(b) Same: Expenditures. Expenditures from the Fund shall be made exclusively for the purpose of supplementing the costs associated with operating the Department of Education interscholastic sports programs. The Department of Education may transfer from the Interscholastic Sports Fund to the Department of Public Works such funds as are necessary to fund in whole or in part interscholastic bus transportation.

- (c) Same: Distribution of the Interscholastic Sports Fund. Elementary schools may participate in the solicitation of commercial advertising in their respective schools as provided through the Interscholastic Sports Fund Act. However, because the interscholastic sports program exists in the middle and high school levels only, the elementary school that solicits and receives monies for commercial advertising shall deposit all funds into the Interscholastic Sports Fund. The Department of Education shall transfer forty percent (40%) of the total sum of any fees, monetary gifts, donations or contributions collected or derived from the commercial leasing of any part of the facilities for advertising, or other such purposes of an elementary school, into 'I Salappe Facilidat' account of that respective elementary school. The remaining sixty percent (60%) will remain in the Interscholastic Sports Fund to support interscholastic sports programs. Funds transferred to 'I Salappe Facilidat' accounts of a respective elementary school pursuant to this Subsection shall be expended in accordance with the provisions of 17 GCA §1704, as enacted through Public Law Number 23-67. The distribution of advertising funds for both middle and high schools will be as follows: sixty percent (60%) will remain in the Interscholastic Sports Fund and forty percent (40%) will be retained at the school for its respective sports programs. Any advertising funds collected for the Tiyan Facility or the Staff Development Center (behind George Washington High School in Mangilao) will be distributed as follows: sixty percent (60%) to the Interscholastic Sports Fund and forty percent (40%) for maintenance of those facilities.
