





AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE OFFICE OF VETERANS AFFAIRS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE GUAM VETERANS REGISTRY, AS MANDATED IN PUBLIC LAW 32-101.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.
- 3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that Public Law 32-101 recognizes the Office
- 4 of Veterans Affairs as the official local agency for establishing and maintaining the
- 5 Guam Veterans Registry (Registry), which shall be updated no less than
- 6 semiannually. The information obtained from the Registry will help to strengthen
- our application as we work to secure future funding from the federal government

for our island's veterans. Additionally, the Registry would be used to provide current information on health care, on home-based care, and the very best programs, benefits and services possible.

Our veterans are approaching us with more specific needs than in the past: increasing personnel, and ensuring access to resources by building on existing programs; and establishing and maintaining a Guam Veterans Registry is the right thing to do to provide the highest level of care. Additionally, in order to continue providing claim forms preparation as a free service to our local veterans through the Veterans Affairs Office, representatives are required to be an accredited claims agent. Accreditation means the authority granted by the VA to representatives, agents, and attorneys to assist claimants in the preparation, presentation, and prosecution of claims for VA benefits [38 C.F.R. § 14.627(a)]. Without accreditation, an individual may not independently assist claimants in the preparation, presentation, and prosecution of claims for VA benefits. *I Liheslatura* clearly understands this and has appropriated Six Hundred Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$619,000) within the FY 2014 Budget to the Office of Veterans Affairs, which is a significant increase from the FY 2013 Budget of Three Hundred Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$322,000).

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that based on I Maga'lahen Guåhan's transmittal letter to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan on December 16, 2013, regarding the need for sufficient appropriations to comply with Public Law 32-101, I Maga'lahen Guåhan requested I Liheslatura to follow-up by providing the Office of Veterans Affairs with the means necessary to carry out the obligations imposed upon it by this new law.

Section 2. Implementation of the Guam Veterans Registry.

The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from revenue in excess of the Fiscal Year 2015 projections of the General Fund to the Office of

1	Veterans Affairs for the implementation of the Guam Veterans Registry, as
2	mandated in Public Law 32-101; and shall include, but not be limited to, the
3	following:
4	(1) To hire two (2) additional personnel under the following
5	position title and salaries in accordance with Department of Administration:
6	(A) Clerk I;
7	(B) Clerk Typist I; and
8	(2) To purchase materials, supplies and office equipment to
9	implement and sustain the Guam Veterans Registry; and
10	(3) Implementation within ninety (90) days of enactment.
11	Said funds shall not be subject to any transfer authority of I Maga'lahen
12	Guåhan. Said funds shall continue to be available until fully expended for the
13	purpose stated herein.
14	Section 3. Reporting Requirement.
15	The Administrator of the Office of Veterans Affairs shall submit a report to I
16	Maga'lahen Guåhan and I Liheslaturan Guåhan, no later than one hundred eighty
17	(180) days after the date of enactment of this Act, detailing the implementation of
18	the Guam Veterans Registry and all the transactions pertaining to the funds
19	appropriated herein.
20	Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
21	Section 5. Severability. If any provisions of this Act or the application
22	thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not
23	affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect
24	without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
25	Act are severable.
