

AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS (b) AND (c) OF § 85103 OF CHAPTER 85, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM COUNCIL ON THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsection (b) of § 85103 of Chapter 85, Title 5, Guam Code

Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

"(b) Composition. The governing board *shall* consist of thirteen

(13) members, twelve (12) of whom *shall* be appointed by *I Maga'lahi* (the Governor) with the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature).

The thirteenth (13th) member *shall* be appointed by *I Maga'lahi* from among

the members of the Mayors Council of Guam, and *shall not* be subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura*. *I Maga'lahi*, when making initial appointments, *shall* designate six (6) members to serve for two (2) year terms, and six (6) members to serve for four (4) year terms. Subsequent appointments *shall* be for terms of four (4) years, except that when a vacancy occurs, it *shall* be filled by appointment of *I Maga'lahi* with the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* for the remainder of the vacating member's term."

Section 2. Subsection (c) of § 85103 of Chapter 85, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

"(c) Qualifications. With the exception of the one (1) member who shall be appointed from among the members of the Mayors Council of Guam, members of the governing board shall be appointed from among male and female residents of Guam, selected at-large, who have recognized the professional interest and experience in or who are widely known for their interest in the arts and humanities. The governing board shall have at least two (2) members to represent the following areas: performing arts, visual arts, literature and folk arts."
