

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §850 TO TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO DESIGNATE ROUTE 15 AS "AIR FORCE HIGHWAY" IN HONOR OF AND SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO THE MEN AND WOMEN OF GUAM WHO HAVE SERVED IN THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that many sons and daughters of Guam have honorably served our community and country through the United States Air Force, and have protected our island and national interests often at the cost of their lives. The proud men and women of Guam who have served the United States Air Force have represented our island's pivotal position in the Pacific, as manifested by Andersen Air Force Base, which has played a vital role in securing our region from the Second World War onwards and continues to serve the cause of liberty throughout the world. For these reasons, I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds it fitting that Route 15 be named and designated "Air Force Highway" to honor our many existing United States Air Force servicemen and women, our United States Air Force veterans, and the United States Air Force in general.

**Section 2.** A new §850 is hereby *added* to Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

# "§850. Designation of Route 15 as 'Air Force Highway.'

\* & \* ,

- (a) Route 15 is hereby designated as 'Air Force Highway.'
- (b) The Department of Public Works shall post, along Air Force Highway (currently Route 15), at appropriate intervals, signs that visibly identify the highway's official name. The Department of Public Works shall place said signs in prominent overhead locations at the intersection with 26-Macheche Road, *Dededo*; at the intersection with Route 10, *Mangilao*; and at reasonable intervals visibly designating Route 15 as 'Air Force Highway.' The Department shall further display signage along the roadside dedicating 'Air Force Highway' to our men and women serving in the United States Air Force, our United States Air Force veterans, and our men and women in the United States Air Force who have lost their lives while in service to their island and country. A dedication ceremony for the designation of Route 15 as 'Air Force Highway' shall be conducted *no later than* one hundred and twenty (120) days after the effective date of this Act."
