AN ACT TO AMEND §53101 AND §53108 OF 5GCA, RELATIVE TO ENCROACHMENT VIOLATIONS.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guähan finds that Public Law 10-40 was signed into law on March 22, 1969 by Governor Manuel F.L. Guerrero. Public Law 10-40 sets the daily fine for unlawful encroachment at Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per day and no subsequent law has amended the daily fine in the intervening forty-three (43) years since its enactment.

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that this fine does not serve the same 9 deterrent effect that it did in 1969 and that its effectiveness would be 10 greatly enhanced if the fine is updated appropriately to reflect current 11 conditions.

12 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to adjust the daily 13 fine for unlawful encroachment from Ten Dollars (\$10.00) to One Hundred

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Dollars (\$100.00) per day for the first (1st) offense, Five Hundred Dollars
 (\$500.00) for the second (2nd) offense, and One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)
 for the third (3rd) and subsequent offenses, by amending \$53108 of 5GCA.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends for the fines collected from encroachment violations to be deposited into the Territorial Highway Fund for use by the Director of the Department of Public Works to fund equipment and supplies, and to procure the services of licensed surveyors, required to effectively enforce Guam's highway care and maintenance laws.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further intends to expand the definition of
 Encroachment to include refuse, trash and vehicles.

Section 2. Definition of Encroachment. §53101 of 5GCA is hereby
 amended, to read:

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"53101. Definitions.

(d) *Encroachment* means any <u>refuse, trash, vehicles,</u> tower, pole,
poleline, pipe, pipeline, fence, billboard, stand or building, or any
structure or utility infrastructure *not* particularly mentioned, which is
placed in, under or over any portion of a highway."

19 Section 3. Removal by Department. §53108 of 5GCA is hereby

20 *amended*, to read:

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"§ 53108. Removal by Department.

The Department may remove any encroachment on the failure of the owner to comply with the notice provided for in this Chapter.

The owner shall be liable for all expenses of such removal and, in 1 addition thereto, the sum of shall pay a fine of One Hundred Ten 2 3 Dollars (\$100.00) for the first (1st) offense, Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the second (2nd) offense, and One Thousand Dollars 4 (\$1,000.00) for the third (3rd) and subsequent offenses for each day 5 such encroachment remains after the expiration of five (5) days from 6 the service of the notice. 7 All fines shall be deposited into the Territorial Highway Fund, 8 and any interest derived shall remain in the Fund. The Director is 9 authorized to use revenues collected from encroachment fines to 10 11 purchase equipment and supplies, and to procure the services of 12 licensed surveyors, required by the Department to effectively enforce the public's compliance with applicable highway care and 13 maintenance laws." 14 Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon 15 Section 4. 16 enactment.
