AN ACT TO AMEND §§6602 AND 6603 AND TO ADD A NEW §6703 TO CHAPTER 6 OF 17GCA RELATIVE TO PROTECTION OF STUDENT INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 **Section 1.** Section 6602 of Article 6 of Chapter 6 of 17 GCA is *amended* to read:

(a) *Unless* a government entity or school receives prior written informed consent from a minor's or student's parent or legal guardian, and provides for a copy of the document to be administered to be available for viewing at convenient locations and time periods, the government entity or school *shall not* administer to a minor or student any <u>written</u> academic or nonacademic survey, assessment, analysis, or evaluation which reveals information concerning:

(4) illegal, anti-social, and self-incriminating behavior;

1 (f) This section shall not apply to a survey, assessment, analysis, or evaluation 2 administered for the purpose of gathering information relating to bullying, violations 3 of school conduct or the Criminal and Corrections Code, the immediate health or 4 safety of students or school staff, or conducted pursuant to federal law or regulation." 5 6 **Section 2.** Section 6603 of Article 6 of Chapter 6 of 17 GCA is *amended* to read: 7 8 "\$6603. Restrictions on Release of Identifying Information. 9 The A government entity or school shall not release names, dates of birth, addresses, 10 email addresses and or phone numbers of a minor student students without the consent 11 of the student's parent or legal guardian, except to allow emergency medical personnel 12 to contact the student's parent or guardian in cases of medical emergencies or by public 13 safety personnel to conduct criminal investigations. A government entity or school 14 shall not release the date of birth, address, email address or phone numbers of an adult 15 student without the consent of the student, except to allow emergency medical, school 16 and public safety personnel to contact the student in cases of emergencies." 17 18 **Section 3.** A new section 6703 is *added* to Article 7 of Chapter 6 of 17GCA to read: 19 20 "§6703. Exemption for IDEA surveys. 21 22 Any surveys that are conducted pursuant to the provisions of 20U.S.C. §1400 (Individual with Disabilities Education Act 'IDEA') or its successors are exempt from 23 the provisions of this Article."
