A.A. Yamashita, Ph.D. G AN ACT TO SUPPORT GUAM'S MUSICIANS AND ENTERTAINERS BY AMENDING §3414 OF ARTICLE CHAPTER 3, TITLE 11, ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PERMITTING ON-SALE LICENSEES TO SELL AND SERVE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DURING EXTENDED HOURS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. 2

3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that since the establishment of P.L. 30-154 on July 8, 2010 reducing the hours of sale of alcoholic beverages, local 4 musicians and entertainers have experienced a decline in hiring 5 6 opportunities due to a lack of venues necessitating their services. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the local entertainment industry is a unique 7 and significant component of Guam's economy that depends on the 8 support of other local businesses. I Liheslaturan Guåhan concurrently 9 recognizes that in order to maintain public health and safety, it is necessary 10 jament j that the hours during which on-sale licensees may sell and serve alcoholic

- 1 beverages be appropriately limited. Accordingly, in order to foster and
- 2 support local musicians and entertainers on Guam without repealing the
- 3 limitations of P.L. 30-154, I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that it is beneficial to
- 4 extend the hours during which on-sale licensees may sell and serve
- 5 alcoholic beverages for limited hours with the requirement that live
- 6 entertainment be provided.
- Furthermore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan that the
- 8 Department of Revenue and Taxation promulgate the necessary rules,
- 9 regulations, and applicable fees necessary to implement, monitor, and
- 10 control, under a special license classification, the sale of alcoholic beverages
- during extended hours authorized by this Act.
- Section 2. Extended Hours of Sale Authorized. §3414 of Article 4,
- 13 Chapter 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended, to read:
- "§3414. Hours of Sale. On Sale Premises.
- (a) An on-sale licensee shall not sell or serve any person any alcoholic
- beverages between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m., provided, however,
- 17 that all alcoholic beverages must be consumed within fifteen (15) minutes
- of the time permitted for the sale thereof and premise(s) shall be closed no
- 19 later than 3:00 a.m. thereafter except as otherwise specifically provided
- 20 herein.
- 21 (b) An on-sale licensee may sell or serve any person any alcoholic
- 22 beverages between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. provided that the
- 23 <u>licensee offers live entertainment within its establishment where the</u>

- 1 entertainment takes place in the presence of an audience. For purposes of
- 2 this section, "live entertainment" shall be limited to one (1) or more of the
- 3 following activities: (i) performance of live music; (ii) any playing of
- 4 recorded music when the person playing the music selects the music to be
- 5 played and mixes the recorded music; (iii) performance of a play; (iv)
- 6 performance of dance; or (v) exhibition of a film. All on-sale licensees
- 7 selling and serving during the extended hours as permitted herein shall
- 8 employ door supervisors during said hours to verify identification and
- 9 ages of all entrants into the licensee's establishment.
- (c) All alcoholic beverages must be consumed within fifteen (15)
- 11 minutes of the time permitted for the sale thereof and premises shall be
- 12 closed no later than 4:30 a.m. for on-sale licensees selling and serving
- during extended hours as permitted herein.
- 14 (d) A licensee may begin selling or serving alcoholic beverages at 8:00
- 15 a.m., Monday through Sunday, inclusive."

16 Section 3. Promulgation of Rules and Regulations.

- 17 The Department of Revenue and Taxation (Department) shall,
- 18 pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Act, promulgate the rules,
- 19 regulations, and applicable fees necessary to implement, monitor, and
- 20 control the sale of alcoholic beverages, under a special license classification,
- 21 during extended hours pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of this Act.
- 22 The Department shall ensure that no less than fifty percent (50%) of
- 23 revenues generated from licenses issued pursuant to this Act shall be

- 1 designated for programs that support alcohol education, as well the
- 2 partnerships that may be established between business establishments and
- 3 transportation service providers. The rules, regulations, and applicable
- 4 fees required herein shall be promulgated no later than six (6) months
- 5 following the enactment of this Act.

6 Section 4. Effective Date.

- 7 The provisions of this Act shall become effective immediately, except
- 8 that Section 2 shall not become effective until the rules, regulations, and
- 9 applicable fees have been duly promulgated in accordance with the
- 10 Administrative Adjudication Act as required herein.
